Re: Agency-based Voter Registration Under LL29 of 2000, Mayoral Directive One of 2014, LL61 of 2014 and LL63 of 2014

### July 1 through December 31, 2018 Report

Local Law 29 of 2000 requires that specified agencies offer voter registration in their encounters with the public. Mayoral Directive One of 2014 strengthened the requirements of LL29, putting a structure in place to monitor agency efforts to increase voter registration. Local Laws 61 and 63 of 2014 increased the number of agencies required to offer voter registration.

The Board of Elections reported that it processed 4,157 voter registration applications originating at City agencies (called Code 9 applications) between July 1 and December 31, 2018. This does not include applications from DSS/HRA, where voter registration applications are offered, collected and sent to the Board of Elections under the requirements of the National Voter Registration Act (NVRA) and are not denoted as Code 9. DSS/HRA reported sending 9,198 applications to the Board of Elections during the reporting period, yielding a combined total of 13,355 City agency submissions to the Board of Elections. The total for the comparable period in 2017 was 10,596, with the increase in 2018 likely attributable to high interest in the November congressional mid-term election and state-wide elections for governor and attorney general.

Some highlights of agency activities during the reporting period include:

- 1. On September 25, 2018, the Campaign Finance Board coordinated citywide efforts in support of the annual National Voter Registration Day, including special outreach activities by City agencies:
  - the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene offered voter registration at 6 locations:
  - the Department of Homeless Services (DHS) hosted registration drives at four shelters;
  - The Department of Parks and Recreation offered registration at 36 recreation centers with banners, signs and a voting booth and ballot for kids;

- The Department of Probation offered registration citywide at all HUB locations;
- The Department of Transportation partnered with Hot97 and WBLS for registration outreach at Brooklyn College.
- 2. Leading up to the primary and general elections, DHS distributed flyers at all shelters including election dates, poll site hours and information on locating the assigned poll sites.
- 3. The Department of Correction conducted voter education classes to inform detainees of their rights as it pertained to voting in NYS, provided all interested detainees with applications, hand delivered absentee ballots to all detainees that requested them and sent completed applications and absentee ballots to the Board of Elections.
- 4. The Administration for Children's Services (ACS) engages its juvenile detention, limited secure detention, non-secure detention and Close to Home sites to assist adjudicated offenders after release with receiving Voting Restoration Pardons and registration information. ACS is also educating the foster care provider community and the aging-out population on voting rights and offering voter registration; developing partnerships with Pace University and New York Presbyterian Hospital to provide students and employees opportunities to participate in voter registration activities.
- 5. During the periods leading up to elections, the Department of Citywide Administrative Services runs an informational page with links to candidate information on its intranet.
- 6. The Department of Parks and Recreation has integrated voter registration in its employee recruitment outreach, onboarding and Employee Resources section of the agency intranet.
- 7. The Taxi and Limousine Commission targets employees at its Human Resources and External Affairs offices, as well as licensees at its Licensing and Safety+ Emissions Divisions.

- ACS currently makes forms available at all ACS office and client locations.
- Voter registration forms are also distributed to new clients when they are filling out paperwork for ACS services and in all borough office reception areas.
- Forms are also available to clients directly during follow-up appointments.
- All new hires and interns receive voter registration forms at orientation.

#### Describe any special registration activities, if any.

- ACS conducts voter registrations drives in collaboration with the Campaign Finance Board (CFB) throughout the year.
- ACS actively host annual Voter Registration Day activities and drives in all 5 boroughs.
- ACS advertises important voter registration dates on both its internal and external websites.
- ACS distributes voter registration forms to all Interns assigned to our College/Graduate Intern, Ladder for Leaders and SYEP Programs.
- ACS also distributes voter registration forms in the new employee orientation packet.
- ACS makes forms available to all employees on a regular and continuous basis at all ACS offices.

### Describe challenges, both resolved and unresolved.

- Since CFB online training cannot be tracked it is difficult to account and verify which employees have completed the training.
- Due to the fact, clients have the option to return the forms distributed by ACS to ACS staff or the Board of Elections via the USPS method, ACS is unable to accurately track forms.
- Families are distrustful of ACS and appear to believe that we have another motive other than to ensure that they are registered to vote.
- Many clients and visitors lack interest in Voter Registration information.
- Although ACS targets youthful populations with the support of CFB, engaging this population in voting and educating the youth about their voting powers and rights has been difficult.
- Reengaging the older adult population to vote has also been challenging.

#### Describe new compliance initiatives

- In keeping with Governor Cuomo's executive order to restore the right to vote, immediately following the release of persons who are on parole after incarceration for a felony, ACS has engaged its juvenile detention, limited secure detention, nonsecure detention and Close To Home sites to assist adjudicated offenders (AOs) with receiving Voting Restoration Pardons and voter registration education information.
- ACS is exploring partnerships with Pace University, New York Presbyterian Hospital
  and other non-City entities to provide their students and employees the opportunity
  to participate in ACS voter registration activities.
- In collaboration with the CFB educating ACS' Foster Care Aging Out youth population on voting rights and offering the opportunity to register to vote.
- Also, in collaboration with CFB, ACS is engaging its Foster Care Provider community to assist in engaging the youth Foster Care at an around eligible voting age.
- ACS is broadcasting CFB provided campaign candidate videos in select ACS reception areas.

### Describe challenges, both resolved and unresolved.

The CCRB faces a myriad of challenges with respect to the voter registration initiative. Firstly, many of the CCRB's visitors schedule interviews about their complaints during regular business hours. These visitors are usually in a rush and do not have the time to fill out a voter registration form. Secondly, these visitors are often upset, both before and after their interview, at their interaction with a member of the Police Department. Thus, it can be difficult for staff to pivot to a discussion about voter registration.

The CCRB has taken steps to better serve the voter registration initiative. Firstly, numerous staff members have been trained in the past calendar year on how to distribute voter registration literature. Additionally, numerous CCRB staff have signed up to be poll workers and have spread similar opportunities amongst their respective communities. Secondly, the CCRB has hosted BOE staff to further discuss the voter registration initiative. We will be collaborating with the BOE to have more

of our staff trained with respect to voter registration. Thirdly, voter registration forms are being distributed in all mandated languages as opposed to only 3. Finally, the CCRB has begun offering voter registration at City Hall "In Your Borough" whenever we have a presence there.

### Describe how your agency distributes applications.

DHS offers voter registration forms for interested applicants and clients to obtain at each of the 5 intake centers located throughout the City. Forms are kept at central desks in the waiting areas of each site, near flyers and signage pertaining to voting. Applicants can obtain a Code 9 voter registration form from the intake area. In addition, each intake center keeps a box in which applicants can place a completed voter registration card for mailing to the Board of Elections.

### Describe any special registration activities, if any.

As part of National Voter Registration Day on September 25, 2018, DHS hosted voter registration drives at four shelters, completing registrations for 74 DHS shelter residents in total. Leading up to the election days for the New York State Primary and National Elections in September and November of 2018, DHS distributed voting flyers provided by the Mayor's Office to all shelters in its system. The flyers included the date of the elections, poll site hours, and information on how a client can locate their polling station.

#### Describe challenges, both resolved and unresolved.

The general challenge for DHS in distributing voter registration forms at intake lies in the emergency nature of contact with the public at DHS intake centers. Families and individuals arrive at intake centers for assistance in a crisis, with their belongings, to await immediate temporary placement in a shelter (pending approval of their application). Application documents are completed electronically by staff, making it impossible for DHS to physically attach a voter registration form to an application document provided to the client. DHS's solution has been to provide access to voter registration forms at intake by placing them in waiting areas for applicants and clients to pick up if they are interested in registering to vote.

### Describe how your agency distributes applications.

At recreation centers, Parks distributes voter registration forms with membership applications. At nature centers and permit offices, voter registration forms are made available to patrons who visit. Nature centers do not have a front desk or application process, and are open selectively; the permit process is primarily utilized online, however some patrons still visit the permit offices in person.

Note: Parks does not collect and send voter registration forms at this time.

#### Describe any special registration activities, if any.

Parks has integrated voter registration into our employee outreach. A voter registration appeal has been added to our new employee orientation, given to full time, seasonal and POP Worker staff when they begin working for us. Also, a new link has been added to the Employee Resources section of the Parks intranet, the primary resource by which Parks employees receive information on employee policies and benefits. Parks has over 10,000 employees during peak season.

Parks enthusiastically participated in National Voter Registration Day in all 36 of our recreation centers. Our staff conducted voter registration drives both inside and outside the centers, made creative banners and signs, created a voting booth and ballot for kids and even dressed in costume. (See enclosed photos.)

#### Describe challenges, both resolved and unresolved.

Employees report little interest from the public with regard to voter registration. This issue is

exacerbated by the fact that in our recreation centers, which constitute the bulk of Parks' efforts, many customers are repeat attendees.

Providing voter registration information remains challenging for our staff due to the fact that some of our patrons are not United States citizens. Ongoing staff trainings have proven difficult, given the shortage of employees able to train on this topic. Parks is looking into alternative methods, such as utilizing the online training option to ensure all new front-line staff are getting trained in a timely manner.

### Describe how your agency distributes applications.

The TLC currently maintains a staff of approximately 600 employees, many of whom interface daily with TLC licensees. The agency also provides TLC employees with helpful resources from organizations and other city agencies.

We are targeting these two groups by distributing forms in four separate ways to various TLC divisions and departments:

- **Human Resources** (located in Lower Manhattan) includes registration forms in hiring packets for new employees.
- **Policy/External Affairs** (located in Lower Manhattan) distributes voter registration forms at outreach events and presentations to licensees and driver industry stakeholders across all 5 boroughs.
- **Licensing Division** (located in Long Island City, Queens) has forms available for visitors to take at its licensing transaction counters. Also, information on how to contact the Board of Elections is included on some TLC-issued forms for licensees.
- **Safety + Emissions Division** (located in Woodside, Queens and Staten Island) has forms available for distribution at its counter operations that licensees must visit on a regular basis (ranging from three times a year to once every two years) for inspections on their vehicle.

By using these targeted strategies, TLC helps all TLC licensees, and incoming employees to receive voter registration information.

DOT Customer Service/Language Access (CSLA) in partnership with the Campaign Finance Board cohosted a "National Voter Registration Day" event. Planning and coordinating for the event was a challenge since Customer Service/Language Access (CSLA) called upon partners from various DOT units to make it happen: Street Ambassadors; Social Media; Public Spaces and CS/LA and coordinated planning with CFB and volunteers. The inter and intra agency planning and coordination resulted in a very successful event. Staff and volunteers from DOT, CFB, NYC Votes, Radio Station, and CUNY were highly visible on the Brooklyn College campus lending a hand to provide information and assist students and other members of the community in voter registration.
