

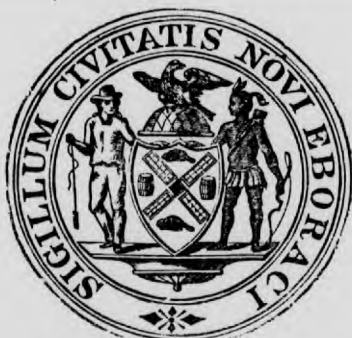

After hearing T. H. Baldwin, Esq., attorney, on behalf of Charles G. Corley and John I. Brooks, the matter was laid over.

Decision.

Commissioner Kelly presented the following decision, viz.:

In the matter of Mary G. Pinkney (No. 1296), assessment for One Hundred and Eighth street regulating, grading, etc., from Fifth avenue to East river; confirmed February 3, 1876.

The evidence in this case shows that an ordinance was passed by the Common Council, on September 17, 1872, directing the grading of One Hundred and Eighth street, from Fifth avenue to East river.

Under this authority, the Department of Public Works made a contract in 1873 to improve the street, in which the block between First avenue and the river was omitted, for the reason, as is stated, that the valuations of the lots near the river were not sufficient to bear their proportion of the cost of the work. The property owners claim that this was an injustice to them, because, had the street been improved to the river, the filling could have been obtained there at very low prices. The price of filling, eighty-nine cents a cubic yard, although fixed at a public letting, is, in our opinion, too high, and not warranted by any state of facts existing at the time, had the street been completed to the river, as originally contemplated. Besides, this failure to complete the street rendered the improvement of much less value to the property owners than it would have been had the street been finished to the river, and this question is one which we are bound to consider.

It is in evidence that, in 1875, a contract was made at public letting to regulate and grade the adjoining street, One Hundred and Seventh street, from Fifth avenue to East river, in which the price of filling was fixed at thirty cents a cubic yard. The evidence also shows that this was a good price, because the same contractor who graded One Hundred and Eighth street gave a bonus of \$4,000 for an assignment of the contract.

For these reasons we are led to the conclusion that eighty-nine cents a cubic yard was excessive, and that in fixing the price at sixty cents, justice will be done to both the city and the property owners.

The evidence also shows that more than 20,000 cubic yards of filling was allowed to the contractor for sinkage, on account, it is claimed, of the marshy soil in the street. This allowance was questioned by the petitioner, and justly so, as it seems to us. It is pretty clearly shown that on the block between First and Second avenues, there was an excess of 4,406 cubic yards of filling allowed. The testimony also throws considerable doubt upon the allowance for sinkage on the other blocks. It is admitted that the street was excavated nearly half a century ago for a canal running nearly to the Fifth avenue. The sides of the canal were well defined, the embankment being above the adjacent ground, and consisting of sand and gravel and small stones, a lock had been built at Third avenue, and remained in position, the top being about the surface of the street. Considering all these facts and the practical impossibility of any material sinkage in the bed of the canal, we are led to believe that there was an excessive allowance for sinkage on the blocks between the Second and Fifth avenues, and that at least ten thousand cubic yards of filling should be deducted for this reason.

On this basis the fair value of the work is fixed at \$74,144.33, while the amount assessed on the property benefited, after deducting the amount charged to the city, is \$80,939.71. The assessment on the property of the petitioner should therefore be reduced eight per cent.

The Chairman put the question whether the decision as presented shall stand as the decision of the Commissioners.

Which was decided in the affirmative, a majority of all the Commissioners voting in favor thereof, viz.:

Affirmative—Commissioners Lord and Kelly—2.

(In explanation of his vote, Commissioner Lord said: "This case has occupied the attention of the Commission for a considerable period, and has received most careful consideration, for the reason that the petitioner attacked a contract let at public letting. The Counsel for the City objects that the prices established by such a contract cannot be questioned, and both in this case and in others which have been before the Commission, has most strenuously opposed any variation in such prices.

In the Matter of Potter, Eighth avenue regulating, grading, etc., the Commission held that they had power to review an assessment although let at a public letting, and were bound in determining where relief should be awarded, to consider the fair value of the work. This decision has been subsequently followed, and I think that no reason exists for reconsidering that ruling.

I concur in the result reached by Commissioner Kelly, and think that in the whole case presented the assessment should be modified in accordance with his views.

The effect of this decision on the reduction of interest on the assessment, is a question which we cannot consider. It is an express provision of the act, which cannot influence our decision, and we have no discretion in reference to it.")

Motions.

On motion of Commissioner Lord, the seventh rule, relating to meetings of the Commission, was suspended, and, on his motion, it was Resolved, That when the Commission adjourns, it do so to meet on Friday, January 18, 1884, at 2 o'clock P. M.

On motion of Commissioner Kelly, the Commission then adjourned.

Resolved, For the proper supervision of the waterfront of the city, the care of the wharf property located thereon placed in the charge of this Department, the rendering of necessary facilities for the prompt berthing of vessels thereat, and the collection of the wharfage accruing therefrom, that the waterfront of the City of New York be and hereby is arranged and divided into nine districts, and that for each of the said districts there shall be appointed, designated, or assigned, from time to time, at the pleasure of the Board, a suitable and competent person to be known and entitled as "Dock Master," who shall perform such duties and render such services in relation to the supervision, regulation, and occupation of the wharf property and waterfront in their respective districts, as the laws of the United States and of the State of New York, the ordinances of the City of New York, and the by-laws of this Board, and its rules, or orders, shall or may require, prescribe, or direct.

The several districts so made and created, and the Dock Masters assigned thereto, are as follows, to wit: District No. 1.—Embracing all that portion of the East river, extending from Castle Garden, on the Battery, to and including Pier 21, East river.

TO THE PUBLIC.

AT 9.30 P. M. ON THURSDAY THE 15TH instant, the aqueduct had to be shut off to repair a large leak that could not be repaired in the usual manner from the exterior. This leak had suddenly developed in the section south of Yonkers, where smaller fissures had previously occurred.

The examination showed fissures aggregating 2,000 feet in length. The repairs were finished and water was again turned on by 4 P. M., on Saturday, the 17th instant. While the flow through the aqueduct was interrupted the supply in the Central Park reservoir was drawn down five feet.

This loss of supply in the city reservoirs, occurring now, as winter is approaching, makes it necessary to take extra precautions against waste of water. Being aware of the temptation to leave faucets open in cold weather to prevent freezing in the pipes, I specially protest against that practice, and appeal to all citizens to abstain from wasteful use of water in any manner whatever. The present condition of the supply and the possibility of a recurrence of similar leaks in the aqueduct make it my duty to give this public notice that I shall hereinafter resort to the peremptory measure of shutting off the water in all places where persistent waste is discovered.

Such rents shall be collected from the owners or occupants of all such buildings, respectively, which shall be situated upon lots adjoining any street or avenue in said city in which the distributing water-pipes are or may be laid, and from which they may be supplied with water, said rents shall become a charge and lien upon such houses and lots, respectively, as provided by law.
