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

UNFINISHED BUSINESS RESUMED.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS RESUMED. Alderman Morris called up G. O. 88, being a resolution, as follows : Resolved, That the Commissioner of Public Works be and he is hereby authorized to hire of rent, for the term of one year from the first day of May, 1879, suitable rooms, to be used as office work-rooms, and for the storage of implements and tools by the officers and employees engaged of the maintenance and construction of boulevards, roads, and avenues and other improvements in the upper part of the city, the same to be located conveniently to the works now in progress, at a rents not exceeding three hundred and twenty-five dollars (\$325), the same to be paid out of the appropriat tion for "Boulevards, Roads, and Avenues, Maintenance of." The President put the question whether the Board would agree with said resolution. Which was decided in the affirmative by the following vote, viz. : Affirmative—The President, Aldermen Burns, Carroll, Cavanagh, Finck, Foster, G. Hall R. Hall, Hyatt, Jacobus, Keenan, Kenney, Kiernan, Morris, Perley, Roberts, Slevin, Stewart, an Strack—19.
