EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 31

AUGUST 29, 1996

DEPUTY MAYORS

By the power vested in me as Mayor of the City of New York, it hereby is ordered

Section 1 There shall be four Deputy Mayors One shall be designated the Deputy Mayor for Operations, one shall be designated the Deputy Mayor for Education and Human Services, one shall be designated the Deputy Mayor for Economic Development and Planning, and one shall be designated the Deputy Mayor for Community Development and Business Services

§ 2 The Deputy Mayor for Operations shall.

a Supervise and coordinate the operations of all administrations,
 departments, agencies, boards, offices, committees, and

except with respect to matters pertaining to their departmental

budgets, the Police Department, the File Department, the
Department of Investigation, the Law Department, the
Administration for Children's Services, the Office of Management
and Budget, the Criminal Justice Coordinator, the Office of
Emergency Management and the Office of Communications shall
report directly to the Mayor.

Advise and assist the Mayor regarding all policies, planning and programs designed to implement and enhance the fiscal operations and financial and business management practices of the City Supervise and coordinate the operations of the Mayor's Office of Operations, the Office of City Legislative Affairs, the Office of State Legislative Affairs, and the Mayor's Office in Washington, D C

Serve as the Mayor's representative, either directly or through the
Offices of City and State Legislative Affairs, on, and maintain
liaison with, regional bodies and intergovernmental agencies
operating within the New York metropolitan region
Maintain liaison, either directly or through the Mayor's Office in
Washington, D.C., with the United States Conference of Mayors,
the National League of Cities, the New York Conference of

Mayors and other similar bodies.

m Represent the Mayor, when so directed by the Mayor, on any board, committee, commission or corporation of which the Mayor is a member.

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- n Perform any function, power or duty of the Mayor in relation to the execution or authorization of contracts, franchises, revocable consents, and other agreements
- Perform any function, power or duty of the Mayor, including authorizations and approvals to be made or given by the Mayor
 pursuant to sections 384, 1602 and 1802 of the Charter, in relation to the authorization or execution of deeds and satisfactions, leases, easements, mortgages, and any other grants or estates or interests in real property.
- Perform any function, power or duty which the Mayor has and is authorized to delegate pursuant to New York City Charter sections

217, 219, 329 and 1301(2)(b), and pursuant to Administrative Code section 5-304

Approve and sign applications to secure grant funds, submitted pursuant to provisions of the New York State Environmental Conservation Law or the rules or regulations of the State Department of Environmental Conservation, and to sign any other documents as may be necessary to secure such funds

Perform such other duties as the Mayor may direct

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§ 3 The Deputy Mayor for Operations hereby is delegated the authority to perform all functions, powers or duties of the Mayor which the Mayor is authorized to delegate, in the event that the Mayor is unable to perform such functions, powers or duties for a reason specified in subdivision a of section 10 of the New York City Charter. In the event that both the Mayor and the Deputy Mayor for Operations are unable to perform such functions, powers or duties for a reason specified in subdivision a of section 10 of the Charter, such authority is delegated to the Deputy Mayor for Economic Development and Planning

§ 4 The Deputy Mayor for Education and Human Services shall
 a Advise and assist the Mayor regarding all policies, planning and
 programs regarding education and human services.

§ 5	The Deputy Mayor for Community Development and Business

Services shall

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Supervise and coordinate the operations of the Departments of Business Services, Consumer Affairs, Employment, and Parks and Recreation, the Commission on Human Rights, and the Commission on the Status of Women.

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- Supervise and coordinate the operations of the Community
 Assistance Unit, the Mayor's Voluntary Action Center, the
 Commission for the United Nations and Consular Corps, the
 Commission for International Business, and the Offices of Protocol,
 Veteran Affairs, and Immigrant Affairs
- Maintain liaison with and review the activities of the Brooklyn Navy Yard Development Corp , the Board of Elections, the Campaign Finance Board, and with the United States Census Bureau and other federal and state agencies regarding the Census
 Perform any function, power or duty of the Mayor in relation to the submission of information to the State Comptroller, in accordance with section 980-g of the General Municipal Law, including but not
 - limited to the power to sign and submit the statement required pursuant to paragraph four of subdivision (b) of such section Perform any function, power or duty of the Mayor, including
 - authorizations and approvals to be made or given by the Mayor pursuant to sections 384, 1602 and 1802 of the Charter, in relation to the authorization or execution of deeds and satisfactions, leases,

easements, mortgages and any other grants or estates or interests in real property and licenses, permits or other agreements, affecting the use of real property by the Brooklyn Navy Yard Development Corporation.

f. Represent the Mayor, when so directed by the Mayor, on any board, committee, commission or corporation of which the Mayor is a member.

§ 6 The Deputy Mayor for Economic Development and Planning shall

programs designed to foster the economic growth of the City,
including those relating to commercial and industrial development,
energy, foreign trade and investment, government regulation, film.
theater and broadcasting, entertainment and sports facility
development, and air, land and sea freight

Supervise and coordinate the operations of the Departments of
 Cultural Affairs, Housing Preservation and Development, and City
 Planning, the Office of Film, Theater, and Broadcasting, and the
 Office of Environmental Coordination

c Maintain liaison with and review the activities of the City Planning Commission, the Rent Guidelines Board, the Art Commission, the

Landmarks Preservation Commission, the United Nations Development Corp., the New York City Sports Commission and New York City Sports Development Corp., the Board of Standards and Appeals, and the New York City Loft Board.

d. Serve as Chairperson of the Commercial Incentive Boundary Area
 Commission and the Industrial and Commercial Incentive Board.

- e Direct and supervise the activities of the Economic Development Corporation as provided in the Amended and Restated Contract between the City and the Economic Development Corporation, and take such actions thereunder as are reserved to the Deputy Mayor.
- f Direct and coordinate the activities of all administrations, departments, agencies, boards, offices, committees and commissions with respect to energy policies, planning and programs
- g. Maintain liaison with the New York State Department of Economic Development, the City Empowerment Zone, the New York State Urban Development Corporation, the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey, the Power Authority of the State of New York, the New York State Public Service Commission, the New York Convention and Visitors Bureau, and other governmental agencies and offices with respect to matters of City economic development, energy policies and programs

Perform any function, power or duty of the Mayor, including authorizations and approvals to be made or given by the Mayor pursuant to sections 384, 1602 and 1802 of the Charter, in relation to the authorization or execution of deeds and satisfactions, leases, easements, mortgages and any other grants of estates or interests in real property and licenses, permits or other agreements affecting the use of real property by or involving the Department of Housing Preservation and Development Agency, or the Economic Development Corporation, including any such authorization or approval in relation to real property under the jurisdiction of the Department of Citywide Administrative Services made for the purpose of a project of the Economic Development Corporation Perform any function, power or duty of the Mayor in relation to any contracts with or involving the New York City Industrial Development Agency

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j. Represent the Mayor, when so directed by the Mayor, on any board, committee, commission or corporation of which the Mayor is a member.

k Perform such other duties as the Mayor may direct

§ 7 Executive Order No 2, dated January 1, 1994, sections 2 and 3 of Executive Order No 9, dated June 17, 1994, Executive Order No 12, dated August 10,

1994, Executive Order No. 16, dated December 27, 1994, Executive Order No. 17, dated January 3, 1995, and Executive Order No. 21, dated March 24, 1995, hereby are REPEALED

§ 8 This Order shall take effect immediately upon the resignation of the City's present First Deputy Mayor. Any authorizations or approvals given to the Deputy Mayor for Community Development and Business Services under section 5(d), and the Deputy Mayor for Economic Development and Planning under section 6(h) on or after May 1, 1996 are hereby ratified.
