DEPARTMENT OF DOCKS.

At a meeting of the Board of Docks, held July 14, 1887.

Present—Commissioners Stark, Matthews, and Marshall.

The minutes of the meeting held July 7 and 13, 1887, were read and approved.

A communication from William Rainer, late Foreman of Floating Property, presenting claim for salary due, was,

On motion, referred to Executive Session.

A communication from A. C. Chapin, Attorney Screw Dock Company, respecting the sale of bulkhead and wharf at Pier 39, East river, was,

On motion, referred to Executive Session.

The following communications were received, read, and,

On motion, ordered to be placed on file, action being taken where necessary, as stated, to wit:

From Comptroller of the City:

1st. Requesting the Board to assign, as a Store Yard for the purpose of storing various articles pertaining to the Bureau of Encumbrances, a certain portion of premises between Sixteenth and Seventeenth streets, East river. Referred to the Engineer-in-Chief to examine and report.

2d. In reference to and approving the terms of the proposal made by C. P. Huntington, and the opinion of the Counsel to the Corporation, respecting the proposition for the rebuilding of Pier, new 37, North river. Referred to Commissioner Marshall.

3d. Approving sureties of John Gillies for building bulkhead at Seventy-sixth street, East river. From the Scientific Publishing Company—Requesting advertisements for the "Engineering and Mining Journal."

From Alfred J. Murray, surety of John W. Flaherty—Consenting to the extension of time to complete Contract No. 242, for repairing, etc., Pier at Thirty-seventh street, East river, to July 20, 1887. Secretary directed to file with contract.

From Counsel to the Corporation:

1st. Approving form of contract for dredging at Piers 12, 13 and 14, East river.

2d. Approving form of contract for building approach to Pier A, North river.

3d. Approving form of contract for dredging at Pier, new 59, North river.

4th. Requesting information respecting lease of James L. Miller for bulkhead at Forty-third street, East river.

The action of the Secretary in furnishing the desired information, was approved.

5th. In relation to the substitution of sureties by the Metropolitan Ferry Co., assignees of the East River Ferry Co. Referred to Commissioner Marshall.

From F. P. Eastman—Requesting possession of bulkhead foot of East Seventieth street, East river. Referred to the Treasurer.

From Greenpoint Ferry Company—Requesting delay respecting the removal of advertising signs at ferry premises, foot of Twenty-third street, East river. Referred to Commissioner Marshall, with power.

From Joseph May—Requesting permission to keep a small float at north side of Pier foot of Thirty-fourth street, North river. The action of the President in directing the Dock Master to examine and report, was approved.

From Department of Street Cleaning—Reporting that repairs are required to bulkhead at Seventeenth street, East river. The action of the President in directing the Engineer-in-Chief to examine and report, was approved.

From Maine Steamship Company—Requesting permission to cut two drops in the easterly side of Pier 38, East river. The action of the President in directing the Engineer-in-Chief to examine and report, was approved.

From Steckler & Steckler, Attorneys—Requesting permission to copy lease of Pier at Third street, East river, to Ridgewood Ice Company. The action of the Secretary in granting said request, was approved.

From D. C. Newell—Stating that sickness will prevent him from calling on the Commissioners.

From Knickerbocker Ice Company:

1st. Agreeing to dredge in front of bulkhead between Nineteenth and Twenty-first streets at end of the season. The action of the President in requesting them to state definitely when they will do the said dredging, was approved.

2d. Requesting that the time to dredge between Nineteenth and Twenty-first streets, be postponed to the end of October next.

On motion, the Secretary was directed to advise that said dredging must be completed by October 1, 1887.

3d. Requesting the Department to revoke permit given to Henry Fischer, to maintain derrick on bulkhead, foot of Sixty-second street, East river. Referred to the Dock Master to examine and report.

From Joseph V. Brown, Lessee—Requesting the Department to dredge at Pier foot of Twenty-fifth street, East river. Referred to the Engineer-in-Chief to examine and report.

From Rice & Bijur, attorneys, East River Ferry Company—Enclosing draft of bond proposed as a substitution of the sureties on East River Ferry leases. Referred to Commissioner Marshall.

From James E. Ward & Co.—Requesting permission to cover a portion of bulkhead between Piers 16 and 17, East river, with three-inch spruce plank. The action of Commissioner Marshall in directing the Engineer-in-Chief to examine and report, was approved.

From Schmidt & Schwanenflugel—Requesting permission to drive piles on the upper side of bulkhead-platform southerly of Fifty-seventh street, East river. The action of Commissioner Marshall in issuing a permit, the work to be done under the direction and supervision of the Engineer-in-Chief, was approved.

From The Evening Post Job Printing Office—Offering to print and bind Annual Report at the same rate as last year. Referred to Secretary.

From R. H. Wolff & Co.—Renewal of application for permission to build bulkhead between One Hundred and Seventeenth and One Hundred and Eighteenth streets, Harlem river. Referred to the Engineer-in-Chief to examine and report.

From A. Van Santvoord—Requesting berth for steamboat "C. Vibbard" at the southerly side of Pier foot of West Twenty-seventh street, North river. Permission granted, to be and remain thereat during the will of the Board, provided they pay as compensation for the use thereof the sum of \$3 per day for each and every day, commencing Sunday, July 17th instant.

From Maine Steamship Co.—Requesting permission to drive piles at Pier 38, East river. Permission granted, work to be done under the direction and supervision of the Engineer-in-Chief.

From Engineer-in-Chief:

1st. Reporting assignment of employees to special duty.

2d. Reporting the amount of work done during the week ending July 9, 1887.

3d. Reporting that he had suspended laborers, acting watchmen John C. Farlow, Daniel Nolan, Thomas Cody, Frank Whelan and John Murphy, who were found asleep while on duty, and recommending that they be not again assigned to duty as acting watchmen. The action of the Engineer-in-Chief was approved and recommendation adopted.

4th. Reporting repairs required to Pier at Seventy-ninth street, North river. The action of the President in directing the Engineer-in-Chief to repair as recommended in his report, at a cost of about \$10, was approved.

5th. Reporting death of John C. Donohue, late clerk to General Repairs Force. The Secretary directed to drop his name from the roll of employees.

6th. Reporting damage to Pile Driver No. 2 by barge "Chicago" in tow of tug-boat "Blue Stone." The Engineer-in-Chief directed to repair said damage, and report the cost for collection from the tug "Blue Stone."

7th. Report on Secretary's Order No. 6736, in reference to the request of Canda & Kane, for Department to name a nominal sum as compensation for the use of about twenty-four feet of the bulkhead between Fifty-first and Fifty-second streets, North river, and recommending that their request be denied, at least for the present.

On motion, the report was received and recommendation adopted.

8th. Report on Secretary's Order No. 6744, respecting the cutting of deck of approach to Pier, new 46, North river, by the Consolidated Gas Co. The President authorized to notify the said company to show cause on Tuesday, July 19, instant, at 1 o'clock P. M., why penalty should not be imposed for violation of law.

9th. Report on Secretary's Order No. 6754, in reference to the application of the Exchange Bath Company for permission to place a ten-inch cast-iron pipe under Pier, old 1, North river, for the purpose of obtaining a supply of salt water. The action of the President in issuing a permit, providing that consent is first obtained to place it under said pier, said pipe to remain during the will of the Board, and to be laid under the direction and supervision of the Engineer-in-Chief of this Department, was approved.

10th. Report on Secretary's Order No. 6700, in reference to the protest of the Department of Street Cleaning against the location of public bath adjoining north side of Pier 60, foot of Rivington street, East river.

11th. Report on Secretary's Order No. 6626, respecting the availability of bulkhead foot of Seventy-first street, East river, as a site for a dumping-board.

12th. Report on Secretary's Order No. 6419, dredging required in front of bulkhead between Piers, old 57 and 58, North river. The Engineer-in-Chief directed to make requisition for dredging to the extent of about 1,500 cubic yards, as recommended in his report.

13th. Report on Secretary's Order No. 6741, repairs required to Pier at North Brother Island, and stating that before said work can be done a large amount of sand stored on the approach must be removed. The Engineer-in-Chief directed to repair, as recommended in his report, at a cost of about \$300. The President authorized to request the Board of Health to remove sand, and furnish the employees of this Department with transportation during said repairs.

14th. Report on Secretary's Order No. 6753, in reference to the application of S. A. Frost requesting the Department to dredge the half slip on the easterly side of Pier 20, East river. The Secretary directed to notify C. H. Mallory & Co. to dredge forthwith, under the direction and supervision of the Engineer-in-Chief of this Department.

15th. Report on Secretary's Order No. 6702, respecting the work being done by John Gillies, contractor, in building Pier foot of West Thirty-fourth street, North river.

16th. Report on Secretary's Order No. 6556, dredging required in half slip northerly of Pier 25, East river. The Engineer-in-Chief directed to dredge, as recommended in his report, at a cost of about \$900. The President authorized to request the Department of Public Works to repair said sewer and extend same to the outer end of pier.

17th. Reporting repairs required to Pier at Third street, East river. The Secretary directed to notify E. A. Cruikshank, agent of alleged owner of east half, and The South Brooklyn Ferry Company, lessees of west half, to repair under the direction and supervision of the Engineer-in-Chief of this Department.

18th. Reporting that the Pier at One Hundred and Thirtieth street, North river, requires levelling off. The Engineer-in-Chief directed to do said work as recommended in his report, at a cost of about \$40. The Dock Master directed to have the obstructions encumbering said bulkhead removed at once.

19th. Recommending that the Dock Master be directed to remove obstructions on the bulkhead north of Pier at One Hundred and Thirty-first street, North river. The Secretary was directed to notify the Dock Master to remove said obstructions as recommended by the Engineer-in-Chief.

20th. Recommending the refastening of fender-pile at Pier at Thirty-eighth street, East river. The action of the President in directing the Engineer-in-Chief to repair, was approved.

21st. Report on Secretary's Order No. 6237, submitting information requested by the Counsel to the Corporation in relation to the water-front, between One Hundred and Twenty-second and One Hundred and Twenty-third streets, Harlem river. The President authorized to send copies of said reports to the Counsel to the Corporation and request him to take the necessary steps to place the Department in possession of all the water-front from One Hundred and Twentieth to One Hundred and Twenty-fourth street, Harlem river.

22d. Report on Secretary's Order No. 6742, in reference to the action of John Nesbit & Son in erecting a fence at Pier foot of Thirty-seventh street, East river. The Secretary directed to notify John Nesbit & Son to remove fence on south side of pier, also projection of shed beyond pier line on south side, and shed on bulkhead on the north side.

23d. Report on Secretary's Order No. 6692, condition of Pier at One Hundred and Thirty-eighth street, North river. The Engineer-in-Chief directed to repair as recommended in his report, at a cost of about \$125.

24th. Reporting non-commencement of dredging north of Fifty-fourth street, East river. Notify Randolph Guggenheimer to commence to dredge within ten days in accordance with his agreement.

25th. Report on Secretary's Order No. 6170, that he had superintended building crib-bulkhead between Ninety-sixth and Ninety-seventh streets, North river.

26th. Report on Secretary's Order No. 6314, that he had superintended the removal of dumping-board on the north side of bulkhead at Fifty-fourth street, East river.

27th. Report on Secretary's Order No. 6498, that he had superintended the carrying of sewer outlet north of bulkhead at Sixty-fourth street, East river.

28th. Report on Secretary's Order No. 6611, that he had taken immediate action to prevent damage to dumping-board foot of Sixty-fourth street, East river.

29th. Report on Secretary's Order No. 6681, that he had repaired deck of Pier 48, East river.

30th. Report on Secretary's Order No. 6690, that he had repaired deck of Pier foot of Forty-sixth street, North river.

31st. Report on Secretary's Order No. 6704, that he had replaced cluster of piles, Pier 59, East river.

32d. Report on Secretary's Order No. 6707, that he had repaired backing-log on inner end of Pier, new 59, North river.

33d. Report on Secretary's Order No. 6723, that he had repaired deck of Pier foot of Twenty-eighth street, East river.

34th. Report on Secretary's Order No. 6729, that he had superintended refastening fender piles on the outer southerly corner of Pier, new 44, North river.

35th. Report on Secretary's Order No. 6746, that he had replaced fence across outer end of Pier 37, East river.

36th. Report on Secretary's Order No. 6747, that he had repaired deck of Pier 37, East river.

37th. Report on Secretary's Order No. 6749, that he had replaced cluster of piles at Pier 59, East river.

38th. Report on Secretary's Order Nos. 6693 and 6401, that he had repaired pier and bulkhead at West Eleventh street, North river.

39th. Report on Secretary's Order No. 6546, that he had superintended repairing Piers, new 20 and 21, North river.

40th. Report on Secretary's Order 6748, that he had superintended repairing Pier, old 23, North river.

41st. Report on Secretary's Order No. 6745, that he had repaired Pier 19, East river.

From Edward Abeel, Dock Master—Reporting that he had served notice on C. H. Mallory & Co. and the Union Ferry Company to remove signs from the upper side of Pier 21 and the lower side of Pier 22, East river.

From John Callan, Dock Master—Reporting that repairs are required to Pier at One Hundred and Seventeenth street, Harlem river. The action of the President, in directing the Engineer-in-Chief to examine and report, was approved.

From Eugene McCarthy, Dock Master—Reporting damage to cluster of piles at Pier 59, East river, by tug-boat "F. A. Low," while towing barge "S. D. Silliman" in the slip foot of Delancey street, East river. The action of the President, in directing the Engineer-in-Chief to examine and report cost of repairs, and notifying owners of tug-boat and barge that they must pay for damage done, was approved.

From Charles H. Thompson, Dock Master—Reporting service of notices to remove advertising signs.

From John Simpson, Dock Master—Reporting that there is a hole on the north and south side Pier, old 34, North river. The action of the President, in directing the Engineer-in-Chief to repair north side, and notifying the West Shore Railroad Company to repair the south side, under the direction and supervision of the Engineer-in-Chief of this Department, was approved.

From Joseph B. Erwin, Dock Master—Reporting that he had served notice on Walsh & O'Neil respecting the dumping of marble dust into the slip at Pier foot of Forty-sixth street, North river. Commissioner Matthews also reported that he had received the following estimates for furnishing the Department with 500 piles and about 357,255 feet sawed yellow pine :

At a special meeting of the Board of Docks, held July 14, 1887.

Present—Commissioners Stark, Matthews, and Marshall.

The Board went into Executive Session.

The minutes of the Executive Session, held July 11, 1887, were read and approved.

The application of William H. Webb requesting permission to repair and extend the Pier at Sixth street, East river, was,

On motion, ordered to be placed on file, and the following preamble and resolution were adopted :
Whereas, Application has been made by William H. Webb for permission to make certain repairs to the Pier foot of Sixth street, East river ;

Resolved, That permission be and hereby is granted to the said William H. Webb to make such necessary repairs within the existing lines, as may be required to put the Pier in good and serviceable condition ; all the work hereby authorized to be done under the direction and supervision of the Engineer-in-Chief of this Department, it being expressly understood that the permission hereby granted is not to be construed as in any way or manner acknowledging that the said William H. Webb has any right, title, or interest in or to the said premises, or as in any manner impairing or prejudicing the right, title, or interest of the City to the said property.

A communication from the Engineer-in-Chief, respecting the application of the Police Department for alterations in and completion of, the westerly room on the northerly side, lower story, of Pier "A," North river, as per plan submitted, was,

On motion, ordered to be placed on file, and the following resolution was adopted :

Resolved, That the Engineer-in-Chief be and hereby is directed to make the alterations and completion requested by the Police Department, at a cost not to exceed \$200.

A communication from Hon. Alfred C. Chapin, attorney Screw Dock Company, respecting the sale of Pier 39, East river, and bulkhead adjoining, was,

On motion, ordered to be placed on file, and the following preambles and resolution were adopted :

Whereas, A resolution was passed by this Board on the 26th March, 1887, authorizing the purchase of certain bulkhead and wharf property on South street, between Market and Pike streets, amounting to three hundred and four and three-tenths feet, including also Pier 39, East river, belonging to the Screw Dock Company, for the sum of \$650 per lineal foot of said bulkhead property, or a total of \$196,950 ; and

Whereas, An agreement was entered into with said Screw Dock Company in conformity with the terms of said resolution above recited, which agreement was extended from time to time, but now expires on the 18th July, current ;

Resolved, That the resolution made on the 26th March, 1887, which provides for the purchase of the above-mentioned property, and in accordance with which the agreement was made, be amended so as to read that the price of said bulkhead property, amounting to 304 ³/₁₀ lineal feet, and of Pier 39, East river, amounting to 710 ¹/₁₀ lineal feet of wharfage room, in all 1,014 ⁴/₁₀ lineal feet of wharfage room, be \$194.17 ¹/₂ (one hundred and ninety-four dollars and seventeen and one-third cents) per lineal foot for said bulkhead and Pier 39, East river, and that an agreement be made in conformity with the terms and conditions aforesaid, and be extended to and include October 15, 1887.

The following preambles and resolutions were, on motion, adopted :

Whereas, A resolution was adopted by the Board on the 24th of June, 1886, subsequently amended by a resolution adopted February 9, 1887, leasing to C. P. Huntington the stone bulkhead extending from the middle of the slip, between Piers, new 37 and 38, North river, with permission to shed the same ; and

Whereas, Said lease was granted for a term of years co-existent with the lease to C. P. Huntington of Pier, new 37, North river, with a covenant of renewal for a further term of years co-existent with the right of extension of the present lease of Pier, new 37, North river, at an annual rent of three thousand and five hundred dollars payable quarterly in advance ; now, be it

Resolved, That said resolution of the 24th of June, 1886, with amendment of February 9, 1887, be still further amended by the inserting after the words "to give to said lessee a covenant of renewal for a further term of years coterminous with his right of extension of his present lease of said pier," the words "at an advanced rent of three thousand and eight hundred dollars per annum payable quarterly in advance, in accordance with chapter 15, section 716 of the Consolidation Act of 1882 ;" so that the amended resolution will read as follows :

Whereas, By a resolution of the said Board of Docks, adopted on the 24th day of June, 1886, it was

Resolved, That by virtue of the power vested in said Board by subdivision 6, of section 6, of chapter 574 of the Laws of 1871, and by section 716 of chapter 410 of the Laws of 1882, commonly called "The New York City Consolidation Act," as amended by chapter 517 of the Laws of 1884, the southerly half of the stone bulkhead, between Piers, new 37 and new 38, North river, and the northerly half of stone bulkhead, between Piers, new 36 and new 37, North river, be and are hereby appropriated to the sole use of the special kind of commerce carried on by steam transportation ; and it was further

Resolved, That C. P. Huntington should be informed that this Department would grant to him a lease of the said premises for a term of years coterminous with his present lease of said Pier, new 37, North river, at an annual rent of three thousand five hundred dollars, payable quarterly in advance, and would agree in said lease, to give said lessee a covenant of renewal for a further term of years coterminous with his right of extension of his present lease of said pier, at an advanced rent of three thousand and eight hundred dollars per annum, payable quarterly in advance, in accordance with chapter 15, section 716 of the Consolidation Act of 1882, provided that said C. P. Huntington should, within five days after receipt thereof, file in the office of said Board a written acceptance of the terms of said resolution, and agree to execute a lease of said bulkhead with permission to shed the same fifty-feet easterly from the front of the bulkheads, and from the middle of the bulkhead, between Piers, new 36 and new 37, North river, to the middle of the bulkhead, between Piers, new 37 and new 38, North river, containing the usual covenants and in conformity with the terms set forth in said resolution ; and it was further

Notice is therefore given to all householders that, in all further applications for reduction of water rents, no allowance will be made on account of waste of water occurring through leaks, from defective service pipes or plumbing, or wasteful use of water by tenants or occupants of buildings, though such leakage or waste may have occurred without the knowledge or consent of the owners of the buildings.

House-owners are further notified that whenever their premises become vacant, and are likely to remain vacant, they must notify this Department in writing, and that unless this requirement is complied with no deductions in extra water rents will be allowed for any portion of one year.

Labor and necessary materials for doing all specified trimming and patching about wall, and for covering the top of the catch-basin as specified.

N. B.—As the above-mentioned quantities, though stated with as much accuracy as is possible in advance, are approximate only, bidders are required to submit their estimates upon the following express conditions, which shall apply to and become part of every estimate received:

(1.) Bidders must satisfy themselves by personal examination of the premises on which the work is to be done, and by such other means as they may prefer, as to the accuracy of the foregoing Engineer's estimate, and shall not at any time after the submission of an estimate, dispute or complain of the above statement of quantities, nor assert that there was any misunderstanding in regard to the nature or amount of the work to be done.

(2.) Bidders will be required to complete the entire work contracted for to the satisfaction of the Department of Docks, and in substantial accordance with the specifications of the contract. Bidders are required to state in their estimates their names and places of residence; and the names of all persons interested with them therein, and if no other person be so interested, the estimate shall distinctly state the fact; also that the estimate is made without any connection with any other person making an estimate for the same work, and that it is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud; and also that no member of the Common Council, head of a department, chief of a bureau, deputy thereof or clerk therein, or other officer of the Corporation, is directly or indirectly interested therein, or in the supplies or work to which it relates, or in any portion of the profits thereof; which estimate must be verified by the oath, in writing, of the party making the estimate, that the several matters stated therein are in all respects true. Where more than one person is interested, it is requisite that the verification be made and subscribed to by all the parties interested.

Each estimate shall be accompanied by the consent, in writing, of two householders or freeholders of the City of New York, with their respective places of business or residence, to the effect that if the contract be awarded to the person or persons making the estimate, they will, on its being so awarded, become bound as his or their sureties for its faithful performance, and that if said person or persons shall omit or refuse to execute the contract, they will pay to the Corporation of the City of New York any difference between the sum to which said person or persons would be entitled on its completion and that which said Corporation may be obliged to pay to the person to whom the contract may be awarded at any subsequent letting; the amount, in each case, to be calculated upon the estimated amount of the work to be done in each class by which the bids are tested. The consent above mentioned shall be accompanied by the oath or affirmation, in writing, of each of the persons signing the same, that he is a householder or freeholder in the City of New York and is worth the amount of the security required for the completion of the contract, over and above all his debts of every nature, and over and above his liabilities as bail, surety and otherwise; and that he has offered himself as surety in good faith and with the intention to execute the bond required by law. The adequacy and sufficiency of the security offered will be subject to approval by the Comptroller of the City of New York, after the award is made and prior to the signing of the contract.

No estimate will be received or considered unless accompanied by either a certified check upon one of the State or National Banks of the City of New York, drawn to the order of the Comptroller, or money to the amount of five per centum of the amount of security required for the faithful performance of the contract. Such check or money must not be inclosed in the sealed envelope containing the estimate, but must be handed to the officer or clerk of the Department who has charge of the Estimate-box, and no estimate can be deposited in said box until such check or money has been examined by said officer or clerk and found to be correct. All such deposits, except that of the successful bidder, will be returned to the persons making the same, within three days after the contract is awarded. If the successful bidder shall refuse or neglect, within five days after notice that the contract has been awarded to him, to execute the same, the amount of the deposit made by him shall be forfeited and retained by the City of New York, as liquidated damages for such neglect or refusal; but if he shall execute the contract within the time aforesaid, the amount of his deposit will be returned to him.

Bidders are informed that no deviation from the specifications will be allowed unless under the written instructions of the Engineer-in-Chief.

No estimate will be accepted from, or contract awarded to, any person who is in arrears to the Corporation, upon debt or contract, or who is a defaulter, as surety or otherwise, upon any obligation to the Corporation.

The right to decline all the estimates is reserved, if deemed for the interest of the Corporation of the City of New York.

Bidders are requested, in making their bids or estimates, to use the blank prepared for that purpose by the Department, a copy of which, together with the form of agreement, including specifications, and showing the manner of payment for the work, can be obtained upon application therefor at the office of the Department.

SIR—There were 1,276 deaths reported to have occurred in this city during the week ending Saturday, July 9, 1887, which is an increase of 252, as compared with the number reported the preceding week, and 165 more than were reported during the corresponding week of the year 1886. The actual mortality for the week ending July 2, 1887, was 1,212, which is 396.0 more than the average for the corresponding week for the past five years, and represents an annual death-rate of 42.53 per 1,000 persons living, the population estimated at 1,482,041.
