Minutes of Special Meeting of the Aqueduct Commissioners, held at their Office, No. 209 Stewart Building, on Friday, January 13, 1893, at 11 o'clock A.M.

Present—The Comptroller, and Commissioners Duane, Tucker and Scott.

The Committee of Finance and Audit reported their examination and audit of Voucher No. 8456, being final estimate for work done on East Branch Reservoir Dam, amounting to \$40,030.87, and of Vouchers Nos. 8468 to 8473, inclusive, being estimates for work done by contractors, amounting to \$30,631.99; also of bills contained in Vouchers Nos. 8457 to 8466, inclusive, and 8474 to 8482, inclusive, amounting to \$1,374.55.

On motion of Commissioner Tucker, the same were approved and ordered certified to the Comptroller for payment.

The Construction or Executive Committee recommended the adoption of the following preamble and resolutions:

GENTLEMEN—In accordance with the verbal authorization given me at your last meeting, I met at Brewster, Mr. Wilcox, of the firm of Coldwell-Wilcox Company, and after a thorough examination of the tunnel-gate, I gave him orders to proceed with the work for the improvement of certain working parts of the same.

The work is to be done partly in the shop and partly on the ground. It is almost impost to give an exact estimate of the cost of the said work, but I believe that it will be below \$500.

CHAPTER 65, LAWS OF 1889

CHAPTER 65, LAWS OF 1889.

AN ACT authorizing the investment of trust funds in stocks or bonds of any of the cities of this State. Approved by the Governor, March 14, 1889. Passed, three-fifths being present.

The people of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:
Section 1. It shall be lawful for executors, administrators, guardians and trustees and others holding trust funds for investment to invest the funds so held by them in trust in bonds or stocks of any of the cities of this State, issued pursuant to the authority of any law of this State.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
