

No. 1137. AN ORDINANCE to regulate the exection of awnings in the Borough of Brooklyn. Be it Ordained by the Municipal Assembly of 'The City of New York, as tollows a Awnings of tin or other light motal, or canvas, or of wood, when within the discretion of the

commissioner of highways, may be erected across the addewalks of any of the streats of the Borough of Brooklyn, provided any and every such awning shall not be higher than the second story of the building, the first floor being the ground floor ; and every awning or water-shed of any kind covering one-half or more than one-half, or less than the full width of the sidewalk, shall have connected therewith a guiter and leader of material and size ufficient for conducting water from the same to the outer line of the curbstone, under a penalty of five dollars for each day ach awning at watershed shall remain without such appurtenance. 




