Hon. EDWARD COOPER, Mayor:

SIR—The Board of Assessors respectfully submit the accompanying schedules "A," "B," and "C," being a detailed report of their action on the various assessment lists received in this office from the Department of Public Works during the year ending December 31, 1879.

A summary of these schedules is presented in the following statement, from which it will be seen that the number of lists at present in this office is 59, showing an aggregate of \$2,621,023.43. Of this sum the 5 assessment lists for Boulevard sewers alone amount to \$1,456,560.88, which were made up, apportioned, and advertised for objections November 17, 1879; but in consequence of the excessive cost of the work and the numerous and grave objections urged against these particular assessments, the Board has been obliged to defer final action thereon until a full and satisfactory hearing could be afforded to the owners of property on the line of the improvement. Since these lists were advertised and notices served upon the parties interested, no less than 184 protests and remonstrances have been received and placed on file in this office, involving the large number of 1,600 separate pieces of property.
