Public Hearing by the Committee on State Legislation Affecting the City of New York.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Committee on State Legislation Affecting the City of New York of the Board of Aldermen will hold a public hearing in the Aldermanic Chamber, City Hall, Borough of Manhattan, on MONDAY, MARCH 18, 1918, at 10.30 a. m., on the following matter:

Senate Bill Int. No. 268, P. R. 278, by Senator Ottinger, and Assembly Bill Int. 335, P. R. 346, by Mr. Adler, providing for the creation of a terminal improvement commission for the City of New York, to consist of the Mayor, Comptroller, two members of the Public Service Commission, First District, and three other members appointed by the Governor, who shall designate one of the appointed members to act as Chairman. The Commission is given the power to transfer and dispose of the City's waterfront properties, and to enter into agreements with the New York Central Railroad and other transportation corporations for the improvement of freight and terminal facilities, with particular reference to the Riverside Drive, West Side Improvement.

Bellevue and Allied Hospitals.

A meeting of the Board of Trustees of Bellevue and Allied Hospitals was held on Tuesday, Jan. 29, 1918, at 3.30 p. m.

Present—Dr. Brannan, the President, in the chair; Messrs. O'Keefe, Sachs, Stern, Farley and Wright, Trustees. Excused—Mr. Paulding, Trustee, and Mr. Coler, Commissioner of the Department of Public Charities.

Dr. O'Hanlon, the General Medical Superintendent, reported as follows:

Owing to the severe weather of the last few days great difficulty was experienced in transferring patients from the admitting office to the various wards of the new building, as well as in the transporting of food from the kitchen.

Considerable difficulty was experienced during the past few days in transferring patients to the hospitals of the Department of Public Charities, the boat having failed to make the usual trips. Because we received no advance information, patients were made ready, taken to the transfer room, and on one occasion, to the dock at 26th st. before it was known the boat would not make the trip. This involved a good deal of additional work on the part of Nurses and employees, as well as hardship on the patients.

On separate motion, duly seconded and carried in each instance, action was taken upon the report of the General Medical Superintendent as follows:

The section of the report relating to the delay in the transfer of patients to the hospitals of the Department of Public Charities is to be transmitted to Commissioner Coler with a request to cooperate to avoid such delays in the future, and the General Medical Superintendent was instructed to take up such matters directly with the Commissioner or his Secretary.

COMMITTEE REPORTS.

Mr. Stern, on behalf of the Conference Committee of the Medical Board of Gouverneur Hospital, recommended the appointment of Dr. Julius S. Heller as Assistant Physician to Out Patients, Pediatrics, which appointment was approved.

On the recommendation of the Conference Committee it was moved, seconded and carried to approve the request of the Medical Board to have one salary taken from the Tuberculosis Clinic, one from the Surgical Clinic and one from the Medical Clinic, and that two salaries be transferred to the Nose and Throat Clinic and one to the Pre-Natal Clinic. The Medical Board was requested to designate in its minutes which salaries should be discontinued in the Tuberculosis, Surgical and Medical Clinics and to whom they should be assigned in the Nose and Throat and Pre-Natal Clinics. The Medical Board was also asked to make a special report of the qualifications of the persons to receive the salaries, in this instance in the Nose and Throat Clinic and in the Pre-Natal Clinic.

The Medical Board was asked to present hereafter a report through its minutes regarding non-attendance in the Out Patient Department as well as in the ward service.

The Conference Committee further reported that it is not altogether satisfied with the supervision exercised by the Medical Board over the Out Patient Department and recommended that the Medical Board inquire into the situation and present a report with a view to improving the service and asked for their recommendations regarding the suggestion that a staff of Adjunct Assistant Visiting Physicians and Surgeons be appointed to Gouverneur Hospital.

The Chairman of the Building Committee referred to the ground floor of Gouverneur Hospital, formerly used for the Out Patient Department and suggested that consideration be given to what disposition should be made of this space. After discussion, it was moved, second and carried to defer action and in the meantime request the Medical Board to present their recommendations regarding the use to be made of this space.

The Chairman of the Building Committee reported that he had made inquiries with a view to obtaining a new docking place for the boat "Huddleston" and requested the Secretary under date of Jan. 22 to send a letter to the Mayor bringing this subject to his attention. On motion, duly seconded and carried, the report was approved, the matter, however, to be continued with the committee.

Mr. Sachs, on behalf of the Finance Committee, and Mr. Farley, on behalf of the Building Committee, referred to the desirability of presenting as soon as possible a formal request to the Board of Estimate for an issue of corporate stock for further construction work in the department. After consideration and discussion, it was moved, seconded and carried to apply for an issue of corporate stock in the sum of \$1,000,000 for the construction of the exterior of pavilions F and G, the funds for the interior construction to be applied for at a future date, and to defer action for the time being on further requirements for funds for

additional construction in the hospitals of the department.

Reference was made to the departmental estimate for 1918, in which funds to the amount of \$1,300 were allowed for the purchase of an automobile for the use of the officials of the department. After consideration, it was moved, seconded and carried to request the Board of Aldermen to grant permission to purchase this automobile in the open market, without public letting.

COMMUNICATIONS.

A letter, dated Jan. 22, was presented from Jennings & John, contractor for the layout of the grounds at Harlem Hospital, requesting a further extension of thirty days' time on account of weather conditions. Mr. Joseph H. Freedlander, the architect, under date of Jan. 23, recommended that this request be granted. On the recommendation of the Building Committee this request was approved.

Thomas J. Radley Company, contractors for the installation of a salt water line at the Neponsit Beach Hospital for Children, under date of Jan. 18, applied for final payment on their contract, which request was approved by the Supervising Engineer under date of Jan. 23. On the recommendation of the Building Committee it was moved, seconded and carried to authorize this payment.

M. Osserman, contractor for the repairs to the boat "Huddleston," under date of Jan. 28, requested a further extension of thirty days' time on account of weather conditions and asked for further payment on his contract. The Supervising Engineer approved the request for additional time. On the recommendation of the Building Committee, it was moved, seconded and carried to grant this extension; in so far as authorizing further payment, it was moved, seconded and carried to inform the contractor that the department is guided entirely by the terms of the contract.

The minutes of the Executive Committee of the Medical Board of Bellevue Hospital for Jan. 9 were presented. On motion, duly seconded and carried, the following nominations were approved and appointments made accordingly: First Division—Frederick Montgomery as Anesthetist (Instructor in Anesthesia). Second Division—S. E. Abrahams, Edward Lubin and Coleman Siff as substitutes on the house staff, Urological Service, until their graduation in February, and then to service on the interne staff until July 1, 1918. Thompson and D. D. Fletcher as substitutes on the house staff, Surgical Division, from Jan. 1, 1918. Emanuel Stern, as Resident Urologist, from Jan. 1, 1918.

The following men were appointed to the house staff on the Fourth Division, as a result of a competitive examination: Columbus O'Malley, 2 years, Surgical, from Jan. 1, 1918; Arnold Koffler, 2 years, Medical, from Jan. 1, 1918; Lillian Sarason, 2 years, Surgical, from July 1, 1918; Emanuel Appelbaum, 2 years, Medical, from July 1, 1918; A. Goldstein, 18 months, Medical, from Jan. 1, 1918; Maryland Burns, 18 months, Medical, from July 1, 1918; Nils Rossin, 1 year, Medical, from Jan. 1, 1918; S. B. Abrams, 1 year, Medical, from July 1, 1918.

The withdrawal of Dr. A. Robertello from his appointment as Interne on the First Division (Tuberculosis Service) beginning Jan. 1, 1918, was accepted. The resignation of Dr. M. L. Fuchs, Interne on the Third Division, was also accepted with regret. The promotion of Dr. Frank N. Dealy from the position of Assistant Surgeon to Out Patients, Urological Service, Second Division, to that of Surgeon to Out Patients, and Adjunct Assistant Visiting Surgeon, Fourth Division, was approved. The report from the Committee appointed to inquire into delays on medical and surgical supplies was considered in connection with letters relating thereto from the Purchasing Agent and Supervising Engineer of the department. Action thereon was deferred pending further inquiry into this report by Mr. Wright, who is requested to present his recommendations to the Board.

The minutes of the Medical Board of Harlem Hospital for Jan. 15 were presented.

The following transfers and assignments of services were approved: Herbert E. Stein to the Gynecological Service; H. B. Eisberg, to the Surgical Service; J. Resnick, Interne, to the Surgical Division, from Feb. 1; J. Kurzrock, Interne, to the Medical Division, from Feb. 1; M. Parton, Interne, to the Medical Division, from Feb. 1.

The recommendation that the services of Dr. Richard G. Wiener, former Visiting Physician, be accepted, was approved. The request of Dr. Charles L. Dana, Chairman of the Public Health Committee of the New York Academy of Medicine, regarding an intensive study of the confinement cases at Harlem Hospital was approved. The report regarding the notice posted in the various operating rooms calling attention to the need of economy in the use of surgical dressings and supplies was referred to the General Medical Superintendent for proper attention.

The minutes of the Medical Board of Fordham Hospital for Jan. 1 were presented. On motion, duly seconded and carried, the recommendation that Dr. Victor William Anderson be appointed Assistant Surgeon to Out Patients and the re-appointments for the year 1918 were referred to the Conference Committee.

A letter, dated Jan. 25, 1918, was presented from the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, transmitting a resolution and a copy of a report from the Comptroller regarding unencumbered corporate stock authorizations. On motion, duly seconded and carried, these resolutions were placed on file.

A communication, dated January 17, 1918, was presented from the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, transmitting a resolution adopted on Jan. 15, transferring funds from Code 3039, City Fund, for Salary and Wage Accruals, to Code 2026, Bellevue Hospital.

Resolutions adopted by the Board of Aldermen on January 22, authorizing: (a) Purchase of food supplies in the open market without public letting; (b) Granting permission to defray minor incidental expenses and drawing on the Comptroller for such expenditures in sums not exceeding \$300 up to the amount allowed in the Budget for 1918; were presented and ordered placed on file.

A motion to adjourn the meeting was moved, seconded and carried.

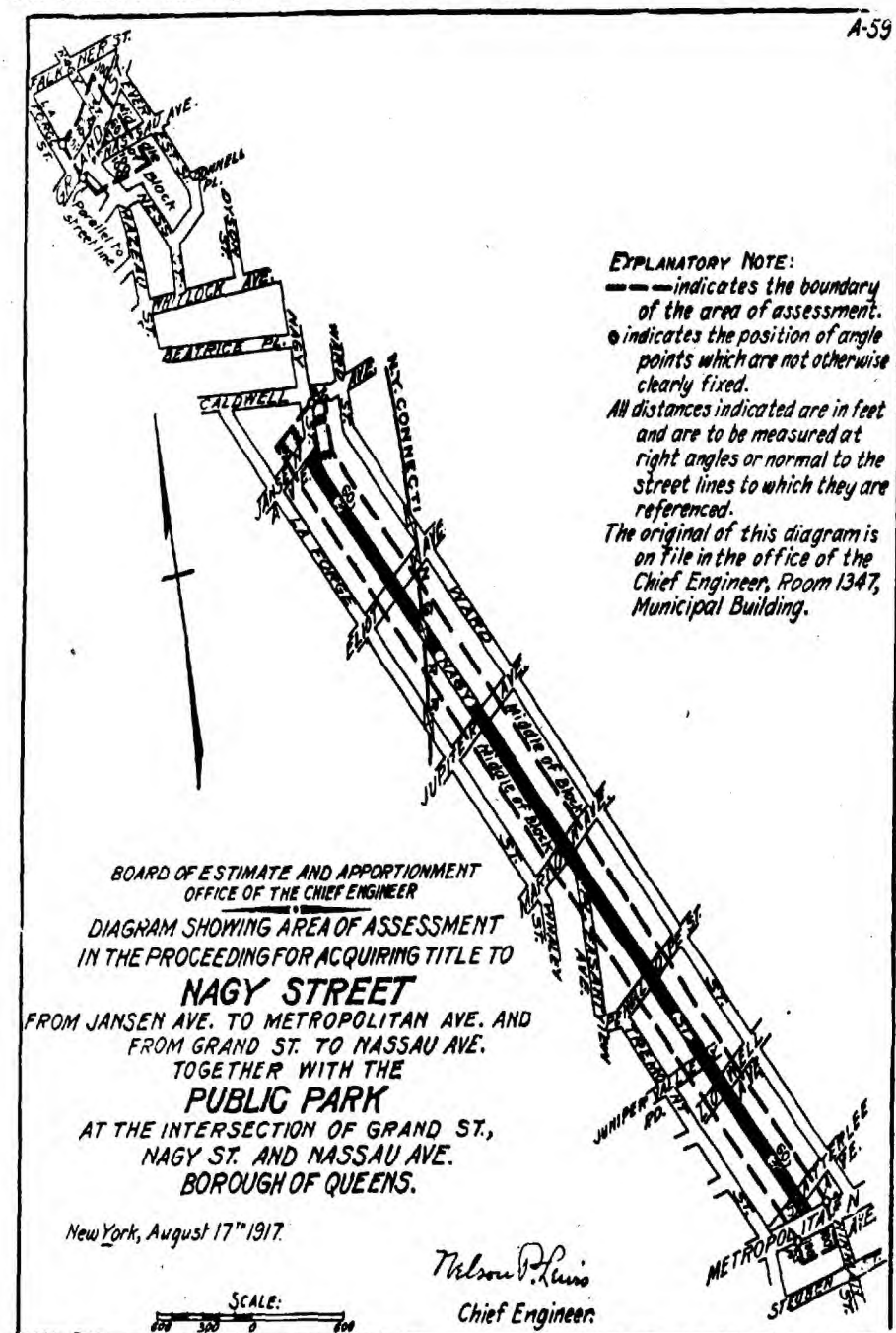

THE BUILDINGS AND APPURTENANCES

thereto will be sold to the highest bidder, who must pay cash or certified check, drawn to the order of the Comptroller of The City of New York, and must also give a certified check or cash in half the amount of the purchase price as security for the faithful performance of the terms and conditions of the sale. Where the amount of the purchase price does not equal or exceed the sum of \$50, the sum of \$50 will be the amount of the security to be deposited. Each bid shall contain the name and place of residence of the person making the same, and the names of all persons interested with him therein, and, if no other person be so interested, it shall distinctly state that fact; also that it is made without any connection with any other person making a bid for the same purpose, and is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud, and that no member of the Board of Aldermen, head of a department, chief of a bureau, deputy thereof, or clerk therein, or other officer or employee of The City of New York is, shall be, or become interested, directly or indirectly, as contracting party, partner, stockholder, surety or otherwise in or in the performance of the contract, or in the supplies, work or business to which it relates, or in any portion of the profits thereof.
