## FIRE SAFETY EVENTS

## Highlights in 2019

- School based events (Grades Pre K-5) represented 31% of total Fire Safety events conducted throughout 2019. Over 290,000 citywide youth participated in fire safety workshops. This a 16% increase from CY18 of youth engaged in fire safety presentations.
- In working with the NYC Department of Education, FDNY disseminated information to citywide administrators and educators regarding fire safety curriculum and coordinating presentations for classrooms and parent association meetings.
- On April 24, 2019 FDNY partnered with the Department of Youth and Community Development to coordinate the 2nd Annual open house events throughout 50 firehouses citywide. Over 2,500 (K-5) students visited firehouses and received fire safety education curriculum. Students represented the DYCD Beacon/Afterschool programs.
- FDNY in partnership with Administration of Children Services and American Red Cross announced partnership to trained approximately 2300 frontline child welfare staff throughout the year, where workers learned how to examine homes for potential fire hazards and refer families for smoke alarm installations.
- 4<sup>th</sup> Annual Open Houses were held On October 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> throughout National Fire Prevention Week. Over 14,000 New Yorkers visited firehouses throughout New York City, and over 11,000 smoke alarms were distributed at events.
