

As we move into the month of June, it's time to review our May afteraction-report! There were several volunteer opportunities, preparedness events and planned deployments, totaling a reported 604.65 hours: 40 hours and 564.75 hours respectively.

The most attended planned deployment this month was the Five Boro Bike Tour (206.55 hours), and the Japan Parade is the second most attended planned deployment this month (98.25 hours).


As of today, May's total reported volunteer hours tally up to 807.35 hours. Thank you to everyone who has served this month. Let's continue with the great work in June!




THINGS TO KNOW


