




Commissioner Iscol stopped by to see our dedicated CERT members.

Queens Division 1 Monthly Team Meeting





Snow Measuring Results - Storm of February 13, 2024





We would like to thank all of you for all of your hard work during this week's Winter Storm. You have shown again that NYCEM CERT is always willing to help our city, and we at NYC Emergency Management (NYCEM) are grateful for the time and effort that our volunteers expend on behalf of New York City. 17 Snow Measuring submissions were recorded, with a bulk of them being recorded from 10-11am. Manhattan Division 2 & 4 submitted the most responses with 29.41% and 23.53% of the data belonging to those two divisions respectively. Ice/Sleet accounted for 17.65% of the total data, while Snow made up for the rest of the data set as indicated in the pie chart. Your work measuring snow is an important tool both for the National Weather Service(NWS) and NYCEM because it dramatically increases the locations and frequency of snowfall measurement throughout the five boroughs.

THINGS TO KNOW

How To Request NYC CERT

- Event organizer submits an official request using the <u>NYC CERT External Request Form</u>.
- NYC CERT Leadership should not submit form on behalf of the event organizer.
- For events lead by a NYC CERT Division,



volunteer leadership (Ready New York Liaison, if a preparedness event) should submit this <u>Event</u> Request form

NYC CERT program staff will review all requests. If approved, program staff will add the volunteer opportunity to the NYC CERT Event Calendar with a registration link. If more details are required for approval, program staff will use the contact information provided in the request form to connect with the organizer.


