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BOARD OF STREET OPENING AND IMPROVEMENT.

The Board of Street Opening and Improvement met at the Mayor's office on Friday, July 5, 1895, at 11 o'clock A. M., pursuant to notice.

The roll was called, and the following members were present and answered to their names:

The Mayor, the Comptroller, the Commissioner of Public Works, the President of the Board of Aldermen, and the Commissioner of Street Improvements of the Twenty-third and Twenty-fourth Wards—5.

Absent—The President of the Department of Public Parks—1.

The minutes of the meeting of June 21, 1895, were read and approved.

The Secretary reported that the proposed action of the Board in the matter of the change of grade of West Fifty-fourth street had been published in the CITY RECORD for ten days.

The Commissioner of Public Works then offered the following preamble and resolutions:

Whereas, The proposed action of this Board in relation to the change of grade of West Fifty-fourth street has been duly published in the CITY RECORD for ten days;

Resolved, That the Board of Street Opening and Improvement, deeming it for the public interest so to do, does hereby alter and change the grade of West Fifty-fourth street, between Tenth avenue and the bulkhead-line of the Hudson river, as shown on a map or plan submitted to this Board by the Commissioner of Public Works, more particularly described as follows: Beginning at a point in the centre line of Fifty-fourth street, distant three hundred and fifty feet easterly from the easterly line of Eleventh avenue, elevation twenty-seven feet eight inches above city base; thence westerly, distance three hundred and fifty feet, to the easterly line of Eleventh avenue, elevation twenty-four feet six inches; thence westerly one hundred feet to the westerly line, elevation twenty-four feet six inches; thence westerly distance eight hundred feet to the easterly line of Twelfth avenue, elevation six feet; thence one hundred feet to the westerly line, elevation six feet; thence westerly, distance one hundred and fifty feet to the bulkhead-line Hudson river, elevation five feet. All elevations above city base, or datum line.

Resolved, That this Board does now proceed to certify three similar maps showing the change of grade of West Fifty-fourth street, between Tenth avenue and the bulkhead-line of the Hudson river as aforesaid, and the Secretary of this Board is hereby directed to file one of said maps, so certified, in the office of the Commissioner of Public Works, one in the office of the Register of the City and County of New York, and one in the office of the Board of Street Opening and Improvement.

Which were adopted by the following vote: Affirmative—The Mayor, the Comptroller, the Commissioner of Public Works, the President of the Board of Aldermen and the Commissioner of Street Improvements of the Twenty-third and Twenty-fourth Wards—5.

The following report, relating to the assessment for the opening of Longwood avenue, from Southern Boulevard to Tiffany street, was presented and read:

NEW YORK, June 21, 1895. In the matter of opening Longwood avenue. Present—Commissioners Gage, Boyd and Dyas. Appearances—Mr. John P. Dunn for the City; Mr. Thomas S. Bassford, for property owners.

Board of Street Opening and Improvement: GENTLEMEN—

The undersigned, on behalf of the Committee appointed by the Board of Street Opening and Improvement to confer with the Counsel to the Corporation and the Commissioners of Estimate and Assessment, in the matter of opening Longwood avenue, beg to report that they have had a conference with the Counsel to the Corporation and with the Commissioners of Estimate and Assessment, for opening Longwood avenue, and they recommend that a petition of the property-owners for relief in the matter of assessment for Longwood avenue be referred to the said Commissioners of Estimate and Assessment, with power to grant the relief sought for, as far as said Commissioners deem the same just and equitable.

LOUIS F. HAFFEN, Commissioner of Street Improvements, Twenty-third and Twenty-fourth Wards. WILLIAM BROOKFIELD, Commissioner of Public Works.

The Commissioner of Street Improvements of the Twenty-third and Twenty-fourth Wards then offered the following resolution:

Resolved, That the petition of property-owners for relief, in the matter of assessment for Longwood avenue, from the Southern Boulevard to Tiffany street, be referred to the Commissioners of Estimate and Assessment appointed by the Supreme Court in proceedings for the opening of said Longwood avenue, from Southern Boulevard to Tiffany street, with power to grant the relief sought for, as far as the said Commissioners may deem the same just and equitable.

Which was adopted by the following vote: Affirmative—The Mayor, the Comptroller, the Commissioner of Public Works, the President of the Board of Aldermen and the Commissioner of Street Improvements of the Twenty-third and Twenty-fourth Wards—5.

The following petition, asking for the opening of Kingsbridge avenue, Terrace View avenue, Jansen street and Jacobus street, was presented, and, on motion, was referred to the Commissioner of Public Works for his report thereon:

To the Board of Street Opening and Improvement:

The petition of Alexander T. Van Nest respectfully shows that he owns land fronting on Kingsbridge avenue, Terrace View avenue, Jansen street and Jacobus street, and he prays your Honorable Board to order proceedings to be taken at an early day to open said streets.

The following protest against the extension of Webster avenue was presented, and, on motion, was referred to the Commissioner of Street Improvements of the Twenty-third and Twenty-fourth Wards for his report thereon:

The Woodlawn Cemetery respectfully represents:

That the Commissioner for the Twenty-third and Twenty-fourth Wards has filed with the Board of Street Opening and Improvement a map or maps containing a proposed extension of Webster avenue, from Gun Hill road at Williamsbridge to Woodlawn station, on the west side of the line of the Harlem Railroad.

The distance from the Gun Hill road at Williamsbridge to Grand avenue at Woodlawn is about 6,460 feet, nine-tenths of which, or 5,859 feet, is through the Woodlawn Cemetery. There is no available land between the right of way of the Harlem Railroad and the property of the Cemetery, so that the entire width of Webster avenue (80 feet) will, after the south boundary of the Cemetery property is reached, be taken from the Cemetery land, except that part of the avenue which will be laid out over the Croton pipe line. It is impossible to construct an avenue of the proposed width without cutting away the entire embankment in the cemetery which looks down upon the railroad, and which has been constructed at great expense, and without taking away a part of the cemetery drive, which is laid out at the top of the embankment. This destruction of property and appropriation of valuable land will be a cause of great expense to the City, especially as no part of the cost can be assessed either upon the Cemetery or upon the Harlem Railroad Company. Furthermore, the singular spectacle will be presented of an avenue one and one-quarter miles long, more than one mile of which will have no abutting owners who can make the least use of it as a thoroughfare.

If the present plan is carried out the entire line of the extension will closely skirt a track used by two large railroad companies, and the passage of more than one hundred trains every day at high speed will create a most dangerous condition of things for the public.

The impossibility of an avenue situated as this will be being used safely by persons riding or driving is quite evident.

It is respectfully urged that if Webster avenue be carried across to the east side of the railroad at Williamsbridge, above grade, and be continued thence at a safe distance from the railroad up to and beyond Woodlawn Station, it would pass through property all of which could be assessed, and it would constitute a real improvement by opening up and thereby benefiting an entirely new section. The Woodlawn Cemetery therefore protests against the construction of Webster avenue through its property and against the filing and confirmation of said map.

First—Because the construction of said avenue is entirely unnecessary.

Second—Because none of the expense can be assessed upon adjoining owner, but must be borne by the City.

Third—Because it will result in a wanton destruction of property without any possible benefit to anybody.

Fourth—Because the avenue, when built, will be dangerous to both pedestrians and persons driving and riding horses.

Fifth—Because a road on the east side of the railroad will accommodate more people and accommodate them better, and because the expense of construction can be assessed upon the people benefited.

DEAR SIR—I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 25th ultimo, transmitting to me for report the accompanying petition for the closing of the Alley in the block bounded by Broome, Grand, Sullivan and Thompson streets.

I have the honor to report that, upon examination, it is found that the Alley is private property, and partly covered with houses at the Sullivan and Thompson street ends.

The Board of Street Opening and Improvement has no jurisdiction in the matter, therefore it is respectfully recommended that the attention of the Board of Health and the Police Department be called to that locality in order that the nuisance complained of in the accompanying petition may be abated.

Mr. Mann appeared, and argued at length in support of the petition, and advocated at the same time, in connection therewith, the extension of Centre street, in lieu of Elm street.

On the other hand, Mr. George W. Hubbell, on behalf of the New York Life and Trust Company, Mr. Leo Slessinger, a large property-owner, Mr. Fordham Morris, Mr. Ferdinand Mela, Mr. Luke F. Cozzens and others earnestly protested against any change or alteration of the plan as now adopted.

After a thorough discussion of the subject, the Board finally, on motion, decided to take no further action in the matter.

On motion, the Board then adjourned.

Office of Attorney for Collection of Arrears of Personal Taxes.

Report of the Bureau of Attorney for the Collection of Arrears of Personal Taxes, for the Quarter ending March 31, 1895, Pursuant to Section 216, Laws of 1882.

There have been begun since the 1st day of January, 1895, 355 special proceedings and three actions for the purpose of enforcing the payment of personal taxes in arrears.

Of this number 138 cases have been dismissed, 13 have terminated in an order of commitment and still unpaid; in 15 cases claims have been filed, 59 are still pending; one delinquent has been examined and found insolvent; in one case the tax has been remitted by the Comptroller, and in one case the tax had already been remitted by the Commissioners of Taxes and Assessments, and the remainder, 127, have paid. In the actions all are pending.

During this quarter the Bureau has collected the sum of \$32,723.71, as against \$17,800.49 for the same period of last year, showing an increase of collections to the amount of \$14,923.22.

OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY TO THE DEPARTMENT OF STREET IMPROVEMENTS OF THE TWENTY-THIRD AND TWENTY-FOURTH WARDS, NEW YORK, June 11, 1895. *Hon. FRANCIS M. SCOTT, Counsel to the Corporation :*

DEAR SIR—I beg leave to submit the following brief report of the work of the Attorney to the Department of Street Improvements for the Twenty-third and Twenty-fourth Wards of the City of New York for the quarter ending March 31, 1895.

The nature of the duties of the Attorney and the requirements of his professional connection with the Department demand frequent consultations with the Commissioner of Street Improvements and with his deputy, secretary and engineers in relation to questions of detail arising almost daily in the conduct of the business of the Department.

In all matters wherein a question of importance arises, or where the legal points involved require examination, a request for an opinion is submitted by the Commissioner, and after due examination an opinion upon the question involved is rendered in writing by the Attorney to this Department and made a part of the records in your office.

During the month of March, 1895, written opinions have been given by the Attorney in five matters upon which a request for an opinion was made by the Commissioner and consultations and interviews were had with the Commissioner of Street Improvements and with his assistants almost daily during the whole quarter.

Drafts of twenty-two specifications and contracts for proposed improvements were examined, revised and corrected.

Numerous returns have been made to the Attorney by the Police Department of cases of violation of Corporation Ordinances and some examination has been made into the circumstances of such violations.

Inasmuch, however, as the breaches of the ordinances have not been flagrant and the cause of complaint has been promptly removed upon request, no actions for penalties were commenced.

AN ORDINANCE amending the ordinance relating to cabs and coaches in the City of New York.

The Mayor, Aldermen and Commonalty do ordain as follows :

Section 1. Stand No. 20 is hereby amended by striking out the words "at the Grand Central Depot," the words "on the full front of said depot outside the curb-stone on Forty-second street," so that said ordinance when so amended shall read as follows :

Stand No. 20. At all railroad depots, five minutes prior to the arrival of all passenger trains, licensed owners and drivers may solicit passengers without their vehicle. Except at the Grand Central Depot such hackmen shall not stand on the sidewalk more than three feet within the curb.

Sec. 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent or conflicting with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Sec. 3. This ordinance shall take effect immediately.
