INTRODUCTION TO DVRT

The Domestic Violence Response Team (“DVRT”) creates a model of inter-agency cooperation and communication to coordinate the delivery of efficient and effective services to high-risk domestic violence victims.

THE DVRT MODEL

Originally launched in 2002, DVRT monitors the provision of services to high-risk domestic violence cases selected from New York City communities. These cases are discussed among the DVRT Team – which includes representatives from City agencies and community based organizations.

Through discussions with the DVRT Team, DVRT seeks to develop recommendations to enhance the delivery of domestic violence services citywide. In this way, all domestic violence victims in our City will benefit from this inter-agency team.

STATEN ISLAND DVRT GENERAL INFORMATION

In January 2011, Mayor Michael R. Bloomberg announced the creation of the Domestic Violence Response Team in Staten Island.

STATEN ISLAND DVRT CASES

Each month, high-risk domestic violence cases will be selected from within the three precincts on Staten Island – the 120th, 122nd and 123rd. The DVRT program will receive case referrals from the NYPD, City agencies and community based organizations.

STATEN ISLAND DVRT TEAM

The service and safety needs of the DVRT client are discussed at regular meetings of the DVRT Team. An Action Plan is created at every meeting which outlines the services that each agency commits to providing. DVRT then assists in coordinating and implementing the Action Plan and the delivery of services to the DVRT client.
