IN THE MATTER OF an application submitted by the Administration of Children's Services and the Department of Citywide Administrative Services pursuant to Section 197-c of the New York City Charter for acquisition of property located at 33 Somers Street (Block 1538, Lot 46) for continued use as a child care center, Community District 16, Borough of Brooklyn.

This application for acquisition of property was filed on March 21, 2011 by the Administration of Children's Services (ACS) and the Department of Citywide Administrative Services (DCAS) to facilitate the continued operation of a child care center at 33 Somers Street, in Brooklyn Community District 16.

BACKGROUND

The Administration of Children's Services (ACS) and the Department of Citywide Administrative Services (DCAS) seek to continue use of approximately 28,860 square feet of privately-owned property at 33 Somers Street (Block 1538, Lot 46) for continued use as a child care center. The space is currently occupied by the Shirley Chisholm Day Care Center.

The subject site is a two-story building, with a roof-top play area, located on Somers Street between Thomas S. Boyland Street (aka Hopkinson Avenue) and Rockaway Avenue. The property is located in an R6/C2-3 zoning district which permits the use as-of-right. The child care center occupies the entire building. The building has approximately 28,860 square feet of floor area and a roof-top play area. The center currently has a staff of 40 and is open from 8:00 am to 6:00 pm Monday through Friday serving 143 infant through pre-K children from the neighborhood. A day care center has operated at this location since 1973. On July 7, 1993 (Cal. No. 34), the City Planning Commission approved an application (C 920242 PQK) to acquire the property for up to 20 years. On September 8, 1993, the City Council adopted a resolution

approving the application with the modification that improvements be made to the building. In 2005 and 2006, the building received a major upgrade, including new bathrooms, resurfacing of the roof-top play area and upgrade of the building systems.

The areas to the north, west and east are generally medium density residential in character with apartment buildings and one- and two-family townhouses in an R6 district, with a C2-3 overlay along Somers and Fulton streets. Along Fulton Street to the south are three to four-story mixed-use buildings with ground floor retail. Across the street from the site, between Somers and Fulton Streets, is the Phoenix Community Garden. To the south, between Herkimer Street and Atlantic Avenue, are row houses in an R5 district. One block to the west, west of Saratoga Avenue, is the area of the Bedford-Stuyvesant South rezoning, which was completed in 2007 (C 07447 ZMK). The area is well served by transit, with the C train's Rockaway Avenue Station one block to the south, the B25 bus along Fulton Street and the B60 and B7 buses on Rockaway Avenue and Thomas S. Boyland Street, respectively.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

This application (C 110259 PQK) was reviewed pursuant to the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA), and the SEQRA regulations set forth in Volume 6 of the New York Code of Rules and Regulations, Section 617.00 et seq. and the City Environmental Quality Review (CEQR) Rules of Procedure of 1991 and Executive Order No. 91 of 1977. The lead agency is the Administration of Children's Services. This application was determined to be a Type II action which requires no further environmental review.

UNIFORM LAND USE REVIEW

This application (C 110259 PQK) was certified as complete by the Department of City Planning on August 22, 2011, and was duly referred to Community Board 16 and the Borough President, in accordance with Title 62 of the Rules of the City of New York, Section 2-02 (b).

Community Board Public Hearing

Community Board 16 held a public hearing on this application on September 27, 2011, and on that date, by a vote of 26 to 0 with no abstentions, adopted a resolution recommending approval of the application.

Borough President Recommendation

This application (C 110259 PQK) was considered by the Brooklyn Borough President, who issued a recommendation approving this application on October 25, 2011.

City Planning Commission Public Hearing

On November 2, 2011 (Calendar No. 2), the City Planning Commission scheduled November 16, 2011, for a public hearing on this application (C 110259 PQK). The hearing was duly held on November 16, 2011 (Calendar No. 16). There was one speaker in favor and none opposed. A representative from the Agency for Children Services (ACS) appeared in favor of the proposal.

There were no other speakers and the hearing was closed.

CONSIDERATION

The Commission believes that the acquisition of property located at 33 Somers Street (Block 1538, Lot 46) (C 110259 PQK) by the Administration of Children's Services is appropriate.

The City Planning Commission notes that the site has operated as a day care center since 1973, serving 143 infant through pre-K children from the Ocean Hill and Brownsville neighborhoods of Community District 16. The Commission believes that the facility is well located to serve the needs of the Ocean Hill and Brownsville communities and notes that the facility is well served by public transportation.

The Commission is pleased to note that, in 2005 and 2006, the building received a major upgrade, including new bathrooms, resurfacing of the roof-top play area and upgrade of the building systems and believes that these improvements have created an improved environment for the education of the youngest residents of the neighborhood.

The Commission believes that the acquisition of this property will allow the existing day care facility to continue to provide much needed educational, recreational, social and nutritional programs for the children in this community.

RESOLUTION

RESOLVED, that this application submitted by the Administration of Children's Services and

the Department of Citywide Administrative Services, pursuant to Sections 197-c of the New York City Charter, for the acquisition of property located at 33 Somers Street (Block 1538, Lot 46), for continued use as a child care center, is approved.

The above resolution (C 110259 PQK), duly adopted by the City Planning Commission on December 12, 2011 (Calendar No. 3), is filed with the Office of the Speaker, City Council, and the Borough President in accordance with the requirements of Section 197-d of the New York City Charter.
