At a regular meeting of the Board of Docks held Friday, May to, tout, at 2 o'clock P.M. Present—The full Board.

The minutes of the meeting held May 3, 1901, were approved.

The communication from the Engineer-on-Chief submitting plans for the improvement of the water front between Ninety-fourth and Ninety-eighth streets, North river, was again tabled for one mouth.

The following communications were also again tabled:

From the Pacific Mail Steamship Company—Agreeing to assign or surrender to the Gromwell Steamship Company the lease of Pler, new 34, North river, with adjoining bulkcheads.

From the President—Recommending that the Pier foot of Porty-fourth street, North river, be extended to the new pierhead-line.

The application of the Department of Street Cleaning for damping facilities in the vicinity of Fourteenth street, East river, was, on motion of the President, referred to the Treasurer.

The communication from the Department of Street Cleaning stating that it has no available fineds for the removal of the deeping-board from the Pier foot of East Thirty-eighth street to the motth side of the Pier foot of East Twenty-ninth street, and respecting that this Department erect a double dumping-board on the southerly side of the latter pier, was also referred to the Treasurer.
