**CITYWIDE IN THE MATTER OF** an application by the Department of City Planning pursuant to Section 200 of the New York City Charter for an amendment of the Zoning Resolution of the City of New York, pertaining to exempting floor space occupied by additional safety measures that are required by the 2014 New York City Building Code from counting towards zoning floor area.

#### ARTICLE I GENERAL PROVISIONS

#### Chapter 2 Construction of Language and Definitions

#### 12-10 **DEFINITIONS**

Words in the text or tables of this Resolution which are #italicized# shall be interpreted in accordance with the provisions set forth in this Section.

\* \* \*

#### Floor area

"Floor area" is the sum of the gross areas of the several floors of a #building# or #buildings#, measured from the exterior faces of exterior walls or from the center lines of walls separating two #buildings#. In particular, #floor area# includes:

- 443. #basement# space, except as specifically excluded in this definition:
  - elevator shafts or stairwells at each floor; , except as specifically excluded in this definition;

However, the #floor area# of a #building# shall not include:

(11) floor space within stairwells

- at each floor of #buildings# containing #residences# #developed# or #enlarged# after April 16, 2008, that are greater than 125 feet in height, provided that:
- (1) such stairwells are located on a #story# containing
- (2) such stairwells are used as a required means of egress from such #residences#;
  - $\frac{\text{(iii)}}{\text{(3)}}$ such stairwells have a minimum width of 44 inches;
  - such floor space excluded from #floor area# shall be (iv) (4) limited to a maximum of eight inches of stair and landing width measured along the length of the stairwell enclosure at each floor; and
  - where such stairwells serve non-#residential uses# on (v) (5) any floor, or are located within multi-level #dwelling units#, the entire floor space within such stairwells on such floors shall count as #floor area#;
- at each floor of #buildings# #developed# or #enlarged# after (date of amendment), that are 420 feet or greater in height, provided
  - such stairwells serve a space that is any occupancy group other than Group R-2, as classified in the New York City Building Code, that is located at or above a height of 420 feet; and
  - such floor space excluded from #floor area# shall be limited to:
  - the 25 percent of stair and landing width required by the New York City Building Code which is provided in addition to the stair and landing widths required by such Code for means of egress; or
  - the one stairwell required by the New York City Building Code which is provided in addition to the stairwells required by such Code for means of egress. For the purposes of this paragraph (11)(ii)(2)(bb), such additional stairwell shall include the stair and landings as well as any walls enclosing such stair and landings:
    - (12)exterior wall thickness, up to eight inches:

As is required by Local Law 34 of 2011, the Department of Consumer Affairs (DCA) conducted a review of pedicab registration plates. Based on its review, the number of issued plates is fewer than 840, so DCA is requesting applications for pedicab registration plates to fill vacancies up to the legal limit of 850.


Applications for a pedicab registration plate will be accepted beginning February 18, 2015 and must be received by DCA no later than March 18, 2015 at 5:00 P.M.

DCA will accept only one application for a registration plate from each applicant. Current licensees who already have been assigned the legal limit of 30 registration plates are ineligible to apply. Upon the close of the application period, DCA will assign each accepted application a priority number based on a computer-generated random number selection program. If the number of accepted applications exceeds the number of available registration plates, DCA will make offers to issue registration plates to applicants in the order of the priority numbers randomly assigned. Once DCA makes an offer to issue a plate, the applicant has 45 calendar days from the date of the offer to demonstrate that the pedicab complies with all registration requirements, including passing Departmental inspection. If the applicant fails to comply fully, the offer of the plate will be void, the applicant will be removed from the pool, and DCA will offer the registration plate to the applicant with the next priority number remaining on the list, if any.

Note: While an applicant for a pedicab registration plate need not have a pedicab business license to apply for that plate, he/she must secure a pedicab business license before the Department can issue a registration plate.




