I. Permanent Housing Need for Fiscal Year 2011

Families

In Fiscal Year 2011, DHS expects approximately 49,000 duplicated applications for family shelter services. Approximately 32% of duplicated families applying will have a stay in temporary housing as eligible shelter entrants.

In Fiscal Year 2011, DHS expects to relocate at least 9,000 families into permanent housing. Advantage New York, the revised rental assistance program which will be effective August 2010, places a greater emphasis on employment and better prepares participants for independent living, will be the primary source of permanent housing placements.

Single Adults

In Fiscal Year 2011, DHS expects to place at least 8,000 single adults into permanent housing. Approximately 70% of those individuals will be placed in private housing or will be re-housed with family. DHS plans to relocate 1,600 (20% approximately) single adults into permanent supportive housing in Fiscal Year 2011. Additional placements will include those using the Advantage subsidy program.

II. Transitional Housing for Fiscal Year 2011

Families

DHS is projected to have a maximum of 10,500 units for families in transitional housing in Fiscal Year 2011. DHS estimates that 10,000 units will be needed during the peak month of Fiscal Year 2011.

Single Adults

DHS is projected to have a total of 8,350 units available for single adults in the peak month of Fiscal Year 2011. DHS estimates that 8,000 beds will be needed during the same month.
