Under the provisions of law one-half of the amount of damages awarded in these proceedings, and also of the expenses incurred, is made a charge upon the City of New York, which is to be provided for by the issue of long bonds, and an in-crease of the permanent debt; while the other portion is to be provided for by the issue of tem-porary bonds in anticipation of the collection of ments.

The damages are, I think, excessive, and the portion charged on the City, I think, much more than it should be, and will, if paid, be a very large increase of the debt of the City.

These proceedings have, however, as I am informed, received the sanction of the Supreme

Court, and provision must be made for their payment.
