#### Budget Hearing on Fiscal Year 2027 Preliminary Expense and Capital Budgets

In accordance with Section 241 of the New York City Charter, the Queens Borough Board will hold a hybrid public hearing on the Mayor's Fiscal Year 2027 Preliminary Expense and Capital Budgets on Monday, February 23rd and Tuesday, February 24th, 2026 beginning at 10:00 A.M. We look forward to hearing your comments on the Mayor's Fiscal Year 2027 Preliminary Budget. This input will be used to develop the Queens Borough Board Budget Priorities for Fiscal Year 2027. All Expense and Capital requests for funding should be presented at the hearing. However, If you are applying for Capital funding and represent a Not for Profit (501c3), please review the guidelines and complete the application that is published on our website by Thursday, February 19th at 5:00 P.M. The hearing will be held via zoom and in Room 200 in Queens Borough Hall. Please be prepared to submit (15) fifteen written copies of your testimony if you are attending in person and are unable to send prior to the hearing.

Notice is hereby given that pursuant to Section 5-07 of the Rules of Procedure for Environmental Review (CEQR) and 6 NYCRR 617.8 (State Environmental Quality Review) that the New York City Department of City Planning, acting on behalf of the City Planning

Commission (CPC) as CEQR lead agency, has determined, based on the Environmental Assessment Statement, that a draft environmental impact statement (DEIS) is to be prepared for the **Montefiore Large Scale Community Facility Development (LSCFD) Update and Mapping Actions** project (CEQR Number 26DCP104X). The CEQR lead agency hereby requests that the applicant prepare a DEIS in accordance with 6 NYCRR 617.9(b) and Sections 6-08 and 6-12 of Executive Order No. 91 of 1977 as amended (City Environmental Quality Review).

The Applicant, Montefiore Medicine Academic Health System, Inc. (Montefiore), is seeking several discretionary actions (the Proposed Actions) to facilitate development of a new Advanced Care Pavilion and the relocation and expansion of the existing emergency department to modernize Montefiore's healthcare services at the Montefiore Einstein/East Campus (Einstein/East Campus), located in the Morris Park neighborhood of Community District 11 in the Bronx, along Morris Park Avenue and Eastchester Road. The new Advanced Care Pavilion would comprise a 20-story hospital building that would contain 420 high-acuity intensive-care beds; a relocated and expanded Emergency

Department (ED) with 76 treatment rooms; surgical, procedural, and diagnostic imaging facilities; medical offices; and structured parking space (the Proposed Project). To realize the Proposed Project, Montefiore proposes to expand the existing Large-Scale Community Facility Development (LSCFD) boundary to include two areas across the street from the existing LSCFD, as well as abutting portions of Newport Avenue, Van Nest Avenue, and Tenbroeck Avenue. Specifically, portions of Newport and Van Nest Avenues would be eliminated, discontinued, and closed, allowing their conveyance to the Applicant, and a privately owned, unimproved portion of Tenbroeck Avenue that abuts the existing LSCFD would be eliminated (demapped). The new Advanced Care Pavilion would be constructed on the western approximately 3.9-acre portion of Bronx Block 4117 between the existing Jack D. Weiler Hospital (Weiler Hospital) and Ullmann Research Center Building, including on the portions of Van Nest and Newport Avenues that would be demapped. Montefiore would demolish the Harold and Muriel Block Building (which houses the Lubin Dining Hall) as well as the Gruss Magnetic Resonance Research Center to create a footprint that could accommodate the Proposed Project (Development Site).

The Proposed Actions include:

- A modification to the LSCFD to incorporate additional parcels, including proposed demapped street segments as described in the City Map Amendment action (see below);
- A zoning map amendment to rezone existing R4 district and R4A districts to an R6 district and partially to a C1-1 commercial overlay affecting Block 4117, Lots 1 and 5, Block 4120, p/o Lots 4 and 7, Lots 8, 12, and 16-20, and Block 4090, Lots 19, 37, and 17 (collectively, the Rezoning Area);
- A zoning text amendment:
  - (i) to ZR 79-43 (Special Permit for Limited Bulk Modifications for certain Large-scale Community Facility Developments), to make the provisions of the section applicable to a geographic area that includes the Development Site, and
  - (ii) to Appendix F, to designate a Mandatory Inclusionary Housing (MIH) area coterminous with the proposed Rezoning Area;
- A CPC Special Permit pursuant to ZR 79-43, as amended, to modify the provisions of ZR 24-53 (Alternate Front Setbacks) and ZR 24-552 (Required Rear Setbacks for Tall Buildings) (with a proposed 10-year period for substantial construction pursuant to ZR 1-42(c)); and
- A City Map amendment to:
  - (i) eliminate, discontinue, and close segments of Newport Avenue and Van Nest Avenue, and
  - (ii) eliminate a privately owned, unimproved portion of Tenbroeck Avenue that abuts the existing LSCFD.

Approval of the Proposed Actions would facilitate the development of the Proposed Project, which would be massed as 20-story hospital building, including a nine-story podium and an eleven-story tower. The building would contain approximately 2,157,100 gsf (1,634,300 zsf), with an approximate height of 354 feet measured from the adjoining grade on Morris Park Avenue (including the 40-foot mechanical penthouse but excluding other mechanical equipment constituting permitted obstructions). Within the podium, approximately 800 parking spaces would be provided (408,000 gsf), including up to 50 spaces that would be made available to local residents on a transient basis.

Implementation of the Proposed Actions would require review and approval of the discretionary actions pursuant to the City's Uniform Land Use Review Procedure (ULURP). DCP is acting as lead agency on behalf of the CPC and is conducting a coordinated environmental review under the City Environmental Quality Review (CEQR) process.

The analysis year for the Proposed Actions is 2037.

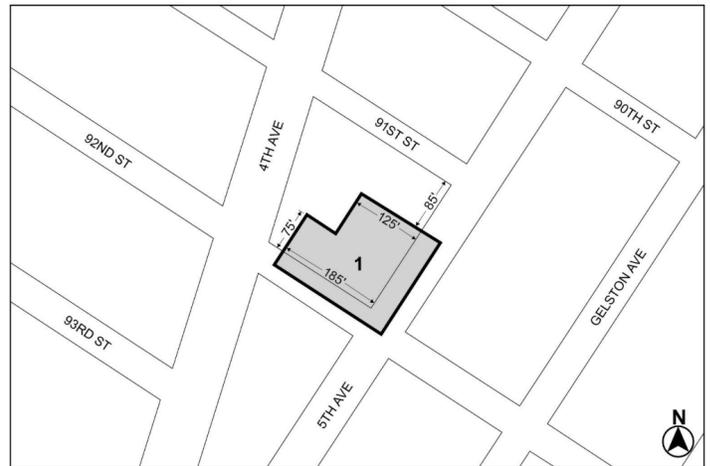

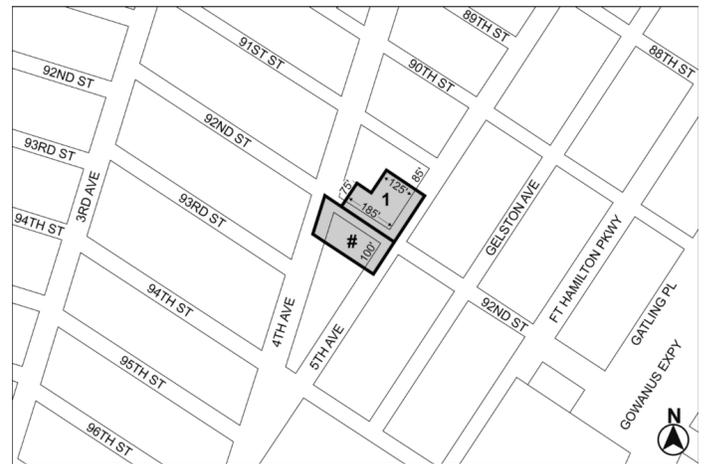

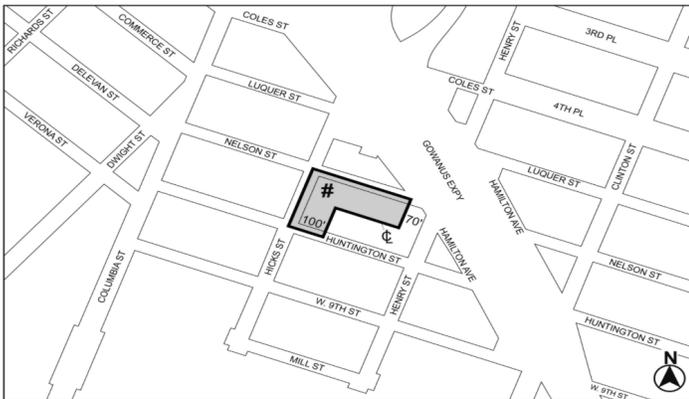

**Name, Description, and Location of Proposal:**

Montefiore LSCFD Update and Mapping Actions

The Applicant, Montefiore Medicine Academic Health System, Inc. (Montefiore), is seeking several discretionary actions (the Proposed Actions) to facilitate development of a new Advanced Care Pavilion and the relocation and expansion of the existing emergency department to modernize Montefiore’s healthcare services at the Montefiore Einstein/East Campus (Einstein/East Campus), located in the Morris Park neighborhood of Community District 11 in the Bronx, along Morris Park Avenue and Eastchester Road. The new Advanced Care Pavilion would comprise a 20-story hospital building that would contain 420 high-acuity intensive-care beds; a relocated and expanded Emergency Department (ED) with 76 treatment rooms; surgical, procedural, and diagnostic imaging facilities; medical offices; and structured parking space (the Proposed Project). The Proposed Project would be massed as a 20-story building with a nine-story podium and eleven-story tower. The building would contain approximately 2,157,100 gsf (1,634,300 zsf), with an approximate height of 354 feet measured from the adjoining grade on Morris Park Avenue (including the 40-foot mechanical penthouse but excluding other mechanical equipment constituting permitted obstructions). Within the podium, approximately 800 parking spaces would be provided (408,000 gsf), including up to 50 spaces that would be made available to local residents on a transient basis. To realize the Proposed Project, Montefiore proposes to expand the existing Large-Scale Community Facility Development (LSCFD) boundary to include two areas across the street from the existing LSCFD, as well as abutting portions of Newport Avenue, Van Nest Avenue, and Tenbroeck Avenue. Specifically,

portions of Newport and Van Nest Avenues would be eliminated, discontinued, and closed, allowing their conveyance to the Applicant, and a privately owned, unimproved portion of Tenbroeck Avenue that abuts the existing LSCFD would be eliminated (demapped). The new Advanced Care Pavilion would be constructed on the western approximately 3.9-acre portion of Bronx Block 4117 between the existing Jack D. Weiler Hospital (Weiler Hospital) and Ullmann Research Center Building, including on the portions of Van Nest and Newport Avenues that would be demapped. Montefiore would demolish the Harold and Muriel Block Building (which houses the Lubin Dining Hall) as well as the Gruss Magnetic Resonance Research Center to create a footprint that could accommodate the Proposed Project (Development Site).

The Proposed Actions are as follows:

- A modification to the LSCFD to incorporate additional parcels, including proposed demapped street segments as described in the City Map Amendment action (see below);
- A zoning map amendment to rezone the existing R4 district and R4A district to an R6 district and partially to a C1-1 commercial overlay affecting Block 4117, Lots 1 and 5, Block 4120, p/o Lots 4 and 7, Lots 8, 12, and 16-20, and Block 4090, Lots 19, 37, and 17 (collectively, the Rezoning Area);
- A zoning text amendment:
  - (i) to ZR 79-43 (Special Permit for Limited Bulk Modifications for certain Large-scale Community Facility Developments), to make the provisions of the section applicable to a geographic area that includes the project site, and
  - (ii) to Appendix F, to designate an Mandatory Inclusionary Housing (MIH) area coterminous with the proposed Rezoning Area;
- A CPC Special Permit pursuant to ZR 79-43, as amended, to modify the provisions of ZR 24-53 (Alternate Front Setbacks) and ZR 24-552 (Required Rear Setbacks for Tall Buildings) (with a proposed 10-year period for substantial construction pursuant to ZR 1-42(c)); and
- A City Map amendment to:
  - (i) eliminate, discontinue, and close segments of Newport Avenue and Van Nest Avenue, and
  - (ii) eliminate a privately owned, unimproved portion of Tenbroeck Avenue that abuts the existing LSCFD.

The analysis year for the Proposed Actions is 2037.

**Statement of Significant Effect:**

On behalf of the City Planning Commission (CPC), the Department of City Planning has determined, pursuant to 6 NYCRR Part 617.7, that the Proposed Actions may have a significant adverse effect on the environment as detailed in the following areas, and that an environmental impact statement will be required: Land Use, Zoning, and Public Policy; Community Facilities and Services; Open Space; Shadows; Urban Design and Visual Resources; Hazardous Materials; Water and Sewer Infrastructure; Transportation; Air Quality; Greenhouse Gas Emissions and Climate Change; Noise; Public Health; Neighborhood Character; Construction, and Effects on Disadvantaged Communities.

The Proposed Actions would not result in significant adverse impacts related to: Socioeconomic Conditions, Historic and Cultural Resources, Natural Resources, Solid Waste and Sanitation Services, and Energy.

**Supporting Statement:**

The above determination is based on an Environmental Assessment Statement prepared for the Proposed Actions which finds that:

1. Land Use Zoning, and Public Policy - The Proposed Actions include Zoning Map and Text Amendments. Therefore, the Proposed Actions would affect regulations and policies governing zoning within the Project Area and could have the potential to result in significant adverse impacts.
2. Socioeconomic Conditions – The Proposed Actions would not have the potential to result in the direct displacement of 500 residents, would not result in any indirect residential displacement, and would neither directly or indirectly result in business displacement. Further, the Proposed Action, while anticipated to affect conditions in one specific industry, would not result in adverse effects on specific industries, including the loss of substantial diminishment of a particularly important product or service within the city. Therefore, the Proposed Actions do not have the potential to result in significant adverse impacts related to socioeconomic conditions and no further analysis is warranted.
3. Community Facilities - The Proposed Actions would not result in

the development of residential units, nor would they introduce new residents to the area. As a result, assessments of the indirect effects on community facilities, including public schools, libraries, and childcare are not warranted. Additionally, the Proposed Actions would not introduce a sizeable new neighborhood, and the Proposed Project would be developed in an area that is currently served by police and fire services that would be unaffected by the Proposed Actions. Therefore, the Proposed Actions would not have direct or indirect effects on police or fire services, and further analysis is not warranted. The Proposed Actions would have direct effects on a healthcare facility and an assessment of these direct effects is warranted.

4. **Open Space** – The Proposed Actions would result in an increase in incremental non-residential population in the Rezoning Area there is potential for indirect effects on open space resources. Therefore, an open space analysis of indirect impacts due to the non-residential population generated by the Proposed Actions is warranted.
5. **Shadows** - The Proposed Actions would result in a new structure reaching a maximum height of approximately 354 feet in close proximity to at least one sunlight sensitive resource, exceeding thresholds for shadows analysis in the Project Area which could result in new incremental shadows on a sunlight-sensitive resources. The Proposed Actions could have the potential to result in a significant adverse impact on shadows.
6. **Historic and Cultural Resources** – There are no archaeological and/or historic resources, listed in or eligible on the New York State and National Register of Historic Places that will be impacted by the Proposed Action. In addition, both the New York City Landmarks Preservation Commission and New York State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) confirmed that the Development Site does not have architectural significance. As a result, the Proposed Actions would not result in significant adverse impacts related to historic and cultural resources and no further analysis is warranted.
7. **Urban Design and Visual Resources** - The Proposed Actions would occur in a Project Area greater than 1.5 acres and would also facilitate physical changes to bulk and form that are beyond those allowed by the underlying zoning, requiring an urban design and visual resources assessment. The Proposed Actions could have the potential to result in a significant adverse impact on urban design and visual resources.
8. **Natural Resources** - The Proposed Actions would not result in construction on a site containing or adjacent to a natural resource. Therefore, the Proposed Actions do not have the potential to result in significant adverse impacts related to natural resources, and no further analysis is warranted.
9. **Hazardous Materials** - The Proposed Actions would result in new construction including new in-ground excavation and subsurface disturbance within the Project Area and could result in new in-ground disturbances in an area that could potentially increase pathways to human exposure to hazardous materials. Therefore, the Proposed Actions could result in a significant adverse impact on hazardous materials.
10. **Water and Sewer Infrastructure** - The Proposed Actions would not result in an exceptionally large demand for water (i.e., over 1 million gallons per day) and is not located within an area that experiences low water pressure. Therefore, an analysis of water supply is not warranted and no significant adverse impacts related to water supply are anticipated. The Proposed Actions exceed the 2025 CEQR Technical Manual’s threshold of 400 residential units or 150,000 sf or more of non-residential space outside of Manhattan and an assessment of wastewater and stormwater infrastructure is warranted as significant adverse impacts could occur.
11. **Solid Waste and Sanitation** – The Proposed Actions are anticipated to generate an additional 23,052 pounds per week of solid waste, which would not exceed CEQR Technical Manual thresholds. Therefore, the Proposed Actions would not result in significant adverse impacts related to solid waste and sanitation services and no further analysis is warranted.
12. **Energy** – The Proposed Actions would not affect the transmission or generation of energy. The Proposed Project is expected to result in Annual Energy Use of 540,784,970 MBtu. No significant adverse impacts related to energy are anticipated and no further analysis is warranted.
13. **Transportation** – The Proposed Actions would generate additional vehicular and pedestrian traffic and increase demand for parking and bus service. Therefore, the Proposed Actions could have the potential to result in a significant adverse impact related to transportation.

14. **Air Quality** – The Proposed Actions would introduce new stationary sources and create new mobile sources of pollutants. Therefore, the Proposed Actions could result in a significant adverse impact related to air quality.
15. **Greenhouse Gas Emissions (GHG) and Climate Change** – The development associated with the Proposed Actions exceeds 350,000 square feet, which triggers a GHG assessment. Therefore, the Proposed Actions could result in a significant adverse impact related to greenhouse gas emissions.
16. **Noise** – The Proposed Actions would create new vehicular traffic, introduce new sensitive receptors, and may introduce stationary noise source generators. Therefore, the Proposed Actions could result in a significant adverse impact related to noise.
17. **Public Health** – The Proposed Actions could result in impacts related to air quality, water quality, noise, hazardous materials or construction. Therefore, the Proposed Actions could result in a significant adverse impact related to public health.
18. **Neighborhood Character** – The Proposed Actions could affect land use, zoning, and public policy, open space, urban design and visual resources, transportation, and noise. As a result, the Proposed Actions could have the potential to result in a significant adverse impact related the affected area’s neighborhood character.
19. **Construction** – The construction period for the Proposed Actions would be longer than two years, which is considered long term, and would occur in proximity to sensitive receptors. Therefore, the Proposed Actions could result in a significant adverse impact related to construction.
