COMMISSIONERS OF THE SINKING FUND OF THE CITY OF NEW YORK.

Proceedings of the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, at a Meeting Held in the Aldermanic Chamber, City Hall, at 11 o'clock a. m., on Wednesday, October 9, 1912.

Present at Roll Call—Ardolph L. Kline, Acting President, Board of Aldermen; Douglas Mathewson, Deputy and Acting Comptroller; Robert R. Moore, Chamberlain, and Henry H. Curran, Chairman Finance Committee, Board of Aldermen. His Honor the Mayor arrived later. (See note.)

The minutes of the meeting held September 18, 1912, were approved as printed.

The following communication was received from the Commissioner of Docks recommending a lease of bulkhead property between 63d and 64th streets, East River, Borough of Manhattan, to the American Malting Company:

July 25, 1912.

Hon. WILLIAM J. GAYNOR, Mayor and Chairman of the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund:

Sir—After due consideration, I am of the opinion that the interests of the City would be best served by a lease to the American Malting Company of the following described property:

All and singular the wharfage and cramage which may arise, accrue or become due at the bulkhead:

Beginning at a point in the physical bulkhead as now existing between East 63d and East 64th streets, East River, Borough of Manhattan, City of New York, where the southerly line of East 64 street, if prolonged, would intersect said bulkhead, and extending southwesterly and along the face of said bulkhead a distance of three hundred and five (305) feet, more or less, to the southeasterly corner of said bulkhead, which said southeasterly corner is located about two and five-tenths (2.5) feet northerly of the southerly line of East 63d street, prolonged, being further described as all that physical bulkhead lying between the southerly line of East 63d street and the southerly line of East 64th street, East River, as shown upon the accompanying map.

Also the following parcels behind said physical bulkhead:

Parcel "A," space sufficient to maintain the now existing grain elevator, comprising an area of about nine hundred (900) square feet.

Parcel "B," space sufficient to maintain the southeasterly corner of the now existing brick malthouse, comprising an area of about one hundred and fifty (150) square feet.

Parcel "C," space sufficient to maintain the scales now existing immediately north of the north line of East 63d street, comprising an area of about one hundred and twenty (120) square feet.

All of which parcels "A," "B" and "C" are shown upon the accompanying map. The lease is to be for a term of years, commencing June 1, 1912, and terminating December 31, 1919.

The rental to be at the rate of \$3,371.75 per annum.

The remaining terms and conditions of the lease to be similar to those contained in leases of wharf property now used by this department.

This company and its predecessors have been in possession of this bulkhead for many years. The rental proposed to be charged is an increase of \$1,559.25 per annum over the rental paid by them under their last lease, which expired June 1, 1912.

The upland is owned by the company and the bulkhead was built by them after spending a large amount of money for the removal of a ledge of rock, for submarine blasting and for the erection of a platform. The City incurred no expense whatever.

The depth of water does not permit of the approach to the bulkhead of any class of vessels or boats other than canal boats or lighters of light draught. Practically the entire period during which the bulkhead property is put to use is during the season of the year when the Erie Canal is open and malt and barley are brought in canal boats from Buffalo. During the winter season, the dock is used to some extent by railroad lighters, which from time to time bring malt to the elevator for distribution in New York City. Taking into consideration the limited use of which the bulkhead property in question is capable, I consider the rental to be paid is adequate and sufficient.

The bulkhead platform at the foot of 63d street, East River, although included in the lease, is occupied by a sentry box for the use of a guard to prevent the escape of prisoners by water from Blackwell's Island.

The improvement of the waterfront at this point is due entirely to the creation of the industry carried on by the present occupant, at whose expense the improvements were made.

Taking all these facts into consideration, I beg to recommend that the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund approve of said proposed lease upon the terms above recited. Yours respectfully, CALVIN TOMKINS, Commissioner of Docks.

many years. They erected the bulkhead in 1874, assuming that they owned the property.

The rental proposed is reasonable.

Parcel "B," space sufficient to maintain the southeasterly corner of the now existing brick malthouse, comprising an area of about one hundred and fifty (150) square feet.

Parcel "C," space sufficient to maintain the scales now existing immediately north of the north line of East 63d street, comprising an area of about one hundred and twenty (120) square feet.

All of which parcels "A," "B" and "C" are shown upon the accompanying map.

City of New York, Department of Docks and Ferries, Pier "A," North River, New York, August 6, 1912.

Hon. WILLIAM A. PRENDERGAST, Comptroller:

Sir—This Department has prepared a contract for dredging the Main Channel in Jamaica Bay, from Barren Island to Mill Basin. The contract is based upon the removal of 1,800,000 cubic yards of material, and it is estimated that the work will cost 12 cents per cubic yard, a total of \$216,000.

The authorization for dredging at Jamaica Bay, C. D. D. 24, is for \$150,000. Of this amount there is unencumbered at the present time about \$140,000.

I request that the sum of \$76,000 be transferred from "C. D. D. 25, Acquisition of Lands for Filling-in Purposes," to "C. D. D. 24, Dredging Main Channel Between Spring Creek Basin and the Southeasterly Point of Barren Island."

In connection with this dredging the United States Government is to reimburse this Department to the extent of 8 cents per cubic yard for all of the dredging done, but in order to make a valid contract for the dredging, as I understand it, it is necessary that you certify that the funds are available for the entire amount of the contract. Should the contract be awarded at the rate of 12 cents per cubic yard, the actual outlay to the City will be but 4 cents per cubic yard, and the money received from the Government will then be returned to the account C. D. D. 24.

The contract for this dredging will be designated as No. 1355 in our files.

Gentlemen—On August 6, 1912, the Commissioner of Docks requested a transfer of \$76,000 from "Code No. C. D. D. 25, Acquisition of Lands For Filling-in Purposes," to "Code No. C. D. D. 24, Dredging Main Channel Between Spring Creek Basin and the Southeasterly Point of Barren Island." Both are corporate stock accounts.

In connection therewith I report as follows:

The Dock Department has prepared a contract for dredging in Jamaica Bay, based upon the removal of 1,800,000 cubic yards at an estimated cost of 12 cents per cubic yard, a total of \$216,000. An authorization of \$150,000 was made for dredging. About \$140,000 remain unencumbered in this fund, C. D. D. 24.

To make a valid contract it is necessary that funds sufficient to meet the entire contract be available. The transfer is therefore requested to replenish Account No. C. D. D. 24, bringing the total to \$216,000.

The United States Government is to reimburse the Department of Docks and Ferries to the extent of 8 cents per cubic yard. This money will be returned to the account C. D. D. 24.

I recommend the adoption of the attached resolution granting the request.

2. For dredging in the main channel in Jamaica Bay, between Spring Creek Basin and the southeasterly point of Barren Island, contingent upon the execution of a contract with the United States Government, through which provision shall be made for the reimbursement of The City of New York by the United States Government for all or a part of the cost of said dredging, \$150,000.

3. For the acquisition of lands located in or on Jamaica Bay needed for filling purposes, the precise location of such lands to be determined upon in the future by the Commissioner of Docks acting co-ordinately with the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, \$750,000.

—provided, however, that no obligations shall be incurred by contract or otherwise against the appropriations herein previously recommended, except in accordance with law.

—be amended to make the amount in Item No. 2 read two hundred and twenty-six

thousand dollars (\$226,000), and the amount in Item No. 3 read six hundred and seventy-four thousand dollars (\$674,000).

Gentlemen—The Commissioner of the Department of Street Cleaning in a communication to your Board under date of September 16, 1912, requests a renewal of the lease of the store, rear room and front part of cellar in the premises No. 332 Myrtle avenue, Borough of Brooklyn, for another term of three years from December 1, 1912, at an annual rental of \$420, payable quarterly, and otherwise upon the same terms and conditions as contained in the existing lease.

The Commissioner says that the rent is the lowest, in his opinion, that can be obtained for suitable premises in that neighborhood.

The premises mentioned consist of a store 13 by 36 feet, with rear room 13 by 14 feet, and cellar 18 by 50 feet in a four-story brick tenement, with store 20 by 52 feet. The premises are occupied by Sections Nos. 13 and 15, a total of forty-seven men.

He therefore requests that a lease be secured of room 2512 (containing 153 square feet) in the Park Row Building, which adjoins the other offices of the Engineering Bureau, for a term of 6½ months, from October 15, 1912, to April 30, 1913, at a rental of \$30 a month. The Consulting Engineer, with two other engineers, is now occupying a small room which is so crowded with the three desks that there is no space for a map table or other needed furniture.

The rate of \$2.35 a square foot asked for this room is above the average paid by the City for rooms in this building for use of the Department of Water Supply, Gas and Electricity, but this is the regular rate fixed by the owner for this room. On February 18, 1909, application was made to the Sinking Fund Commission by the Board of Elections for a lease of 8,000 square feet of floor space in said warehouse for a term of five years at an annual rental of \$3,000. No such lease was ever executed, but on September 13, 1909, the Board of Elections went into possession and began storing election material in the said warehouse.

Subsequently, and on February 23, 1910, Messrs. Belford & Son withdrew their proposition to rent the above mentioned space to the Board of Elections for \$3,000 a year, and on December 10, 1909, the Board of Elections applied to the Sinking Fund Commission for the making of a lease with Messrs. P. Belford & Son for 30,000 cubic feet of space for a term of five years at \$1,800 a year. This proposed lease also has

never been executed, although the City is in constant possession of the premises since September 13, 1909, and is still in possession, occupying approximately half of the building in question.

The City is now paying for storage of election material in the Eagle Storage Fireproof Warehouse, Nos. 28-44 Fulton street, Borough of Brooklyn, \$1,800 a year for 26,000 cubic feet of space, or at the rate of 6.92 cents a cubic foot. The Belford Warehouse in Wyckoff street is not a fireproof building.

As a result of negotiations by the Division of Real Estate of this Department, Messrs. P. Belford & Son have agreed to compromise their claim by accepting a rental at the rate of \$1,350 a year, from September 13, 1909, to September 1, 1912, and to make a new lease at the same rate for the period from September 1, 1912, to December 1, 1914, when the lease with the Eagle Storage Warehouse also expires. Under this arrangement, the amount of money to be paid to P. Belford & Son as rent from September 13, 1909, to September 1, 1912, is \$4,001.25.

As the City is still in possession of approximately half of the building at No. 61 Wyckoff street, it has been deemed advisable that this proposition be accepted. This rental of \$1,350 a year, is at the rate of 4½ cents a cubic foot, while the rate in the fireproof Eagle Storage Warehouse is 6.92 cents a cubic foot.

I therefore respectfully recommend, the settlement being fair and reasonable for the City and for the claimants, that the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund adopt a resolution authorizing the payment to P. 1911, form of contract, plans, specifications and estimate of cost \$475,000 for the fabrication and erection of the structural steel for the Eighth Coast Artillery District Armory, N. G., N. Y., in the Borough of The Bronx.

The proposal of the bidders provided that bids be submitted under four alternatives, viz.:

Item 1. An aggregate price for the entire steel work as shown on the drawings, which price will include the preparation of shop drawings by other parties as hereinafter stipulated in Paragraph 18.

Item 2. An aggregate price for the entire steel work as shown on the drawings except that portions of the trusses are to consist of straight sections, as hereinafter described in Paragraph 36, which price will include the preparation of shop drawings by other parties as hereinafter stipulated in Paragraph 18.

Item 3. An aggregate price for the entire steel work as shown on the drawings, which price will include the preparation of shop drawings by the Contractor as hereinafter stipulated in Paragraph 19.

Item 4. An aggregate price for the entire steel work as shown on the drawings, except that portions of the trusses are to consist of straight sections as hereinafter described in Paragraph 36, which price will include the preparation of shop drawings by the Contractor as hereinafter stipulated in Paragraph 19.

At a meeting of the Armory Board, held on September 27, 1912, the following bids were received:

The lowest bid received is in excess of the estimate (\$475,000), submitted by the Armory Board and approved by the Deputy and Acting Comptroller on September 5, 1912; but as all of the bidders are reputable firms, it is fair to assume that the estimate of the Architect was too small, and that the above figures represent a reasonable value of the work at the present time. I would note that the price per ton for structural steel has been steadily advancing since last winter, and I am advised that it will still continue to advance.

The bid \$532,000, of the Owego Bridge Company, provisionally accepted by the Armory Board, is for Item 2, which provides for straight cords for the upper four sections of each half truss. The shop drawings to be furnished by the Engineer who designed the structural steel at a cost to the contractor of \$2.00 per ton.

This bid is \$4,000 higher than the bid of the same company (Item 4), in which the company makes the shop drawings.

For work of this magnitude, and since the difference in money is so small, I concur in the action of the Armory Board that the Engineer who designed the structural steel should be employed to make the shop drawings.

If this bid is accepted, it is estimated that there will be a sufficient balance to complete the armory, if the balance, approximately \$80,000, in the fund, appropriated to build a retaining wall, is made available for the erection of the armory building, and I recommend that said action be taken if it becomes necessary.

I, therefore, recommend the adoption of the attached resolution changing the estimated cost for the structural steel. Respectfully,

Resolved, That the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund hereby amend the said action of the Deputy and Acting Comptroller, acting for the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, approving the estimate of cost for the structural steel work for the Eighth Coast Artillery District Armory at Four Hundred and Seventy-five Thousand Dollars (\$475,000), for the work specified under Item two (2), of the proposed contract for furnishing all the labor and material for the fabrication and erection of the structural steel for the new Eighth Coast Artillery District Armory, N. G., N. Y., in the Borough of The Bronx; which calls for straight cords for the upper four sections of each half truss, and the shop drawings to be furnished by the engineer, who designed the structural steel, at a cost to contractor of two dollars (\$2.00) per ton, by substituting Five Hundred and Thirty-two Thousand Dollars (\$532,000), as the estimated cost, in place of Four Hundred and Seventy-five Thousand Dollars (\$475,000).

The report was accepted, and the resolution adopted, all the members present voting in the affirmative.

The Deputy and Acting Comptroller presented the following report and offered the following resolution relative to a lease to the City of premises at No. 619 6th avenue, Borough of Manhattan, for use of the Mayor's Bureau of Weights and Measures.

October 3, 1912.

To the Honorable the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund:

Gentlemen—The Commissioner of the Mayor's Bureau of Weights and Measures in a communication to your Board under date of August 6, 1912, requests that suitable quarters be obtained in which to establish a new office for his bureau, to be used exclusively for snow removal work. He stated that he wished to locate this office somewhere between 34th and 59th streets and Lexington and 8th avenues. He later stated verbally that he wanted a room on the ground floor, well lighted, and large enough for from twelve to fifteen Clerks and Tabulators, and located as near the subway station as possible. A search was made by the Division of Real Estate of this Department to find something that would answer these requirements and could be obtained at a fair rental, but the only available room found is Room 16, on the second floor, 6th avenue front, of the Sheridan Building, No. 619 6th avenue, Manhattan.

This room is 15 feet 10 inches by 32 feet 3 inches, and contains 510 square feet. The rent is at the rate of \$700 a year, and the lease is to be from October 1, 1912, to April 1, 1913, a period of six months. The rate is therefore a trifle more than \$1.37 a square foot.

For comparison, Room 15, adjoining, contains 480 square feet, and is rented for \$650 a year, or a trifle more than \$1.35 a square foot.

Rentals in this building are not figured on a square-foot basis. The lease includes heat, light, water and janitor service.

The Commissioner of the Mayor's Bureau of Weights and Measures has personally inspected this room and has expressed his approval.

Last winter the men employed by this Bureau in snow removal work were located at 244 West 49th street, which store is occupied by the mechanical division of the Bureau, but those quarters are now so crowded that it has been found necessary to locate the snow men elsewhere.

Deeming the rent reasonable and just under the circumstances, I respectfully recommend that the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund adopt a resolution authorizing a lease of room No. 16, on the second floor, 6th avenue front, in the Sheridan building, 619 6th avenue, northwest corner of 6th avenue and 36th street, Borough of Manhattan, for use of the Mayor's Bureau of Weights and Measures, for a term of five and one-half months, October 15, 1912, to April 1, 1913, at a rental at the rate of \$700 a year, payable quarterly, the lessor to furnish heat, light, water and janitor service and make inside and outside repairs. Lessor, Edward H. Van Ingen, 150 5th avenue, Manhattan. Respectfully,

Resolved, That the Corporation Counsel be and is hereby requested to prepare a lease to the City from Edward H. Van Ingen, of Room 16, on the second floor, 6th avenue front, of the Sheridan building, No. 619 6th avenue, northwest corner of 6th avenue and 36th street, Borough of Manhattan, for the use of the Mayor's Bureau of Weights and Measures, for a term of five and one-half months, from October 15, 1912, to April 1, 1913, at a rental at the rate of Seven Hundred Dollars (\$700) a year, payable quarterly; the lessor to furnish heat, light, water and janitor service, and make inside and outside repairs; and the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund

deeming the said rent fair and reasonable, and that it would be for the interest of the City that such lease be made, the Comptroller be and is hereby authorized and directed to execute the same, when prepared and approved by the Corporation Counsel, as provided by sections 149 and 217 of the Greater New York Charter.

The report was accepted, and the resolution adopted, all the members present voting in the affirmative.

The Deputy and Acting Comptroller presented the following report and offered the following resolution, relative to the hiring of the main hall of the Grand Central Palace, 46th street and Lexington avenue, Borough of Manhattan, for use of the Municipal Civil Service Commission.

October 3, 1912.

To the Honorable the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund:

Gentlemen—The Secretary of the Municipal Civil Service Commission, in a communication to your Honorable Board, under date of September 9, 1912, states that at a meeting of that Commission, held on September 4, 1912, the following resolution was adopted:

"Resolved, That the Sinking Fund Commissioners be requested to authorize the Comptroller to pay to the Merchants and Manufacturers' Exchange of New York, for use of the Grand Central Palace, 46th and 47th streets and Lexington avenue, Manhattan, for the purpose of conducting an examination for Court Attendant on July 1 and 2, and for Lay Sanitary and Tenement House Inspector on July 3, 1912, between the hours of 9 a. m. and 4 p. m., without the necessity of entering into a lease therefor, the sum of \$600 (\$200 for each day) and \$315 additional for electric light, together with \$12.50 for drinking water, ice and service, making a total of \$927.50, said amount to be charged to the account, "Miscellaneous City Special Contract Obligations, Rents, No. 1631, for the City of New York."

The examinations mentioned were written examinations and were held in the main hall of the Grand Central Palace, which occupies practically all of the first floor of the building, 200 by 275 feet, and has a net floor area of 48,700 square feet. The hall was set with 1,300 tables and chairs on each of the three days mentioned.

The rate of \$200 a day is the same as has been paid by the City on previous occasions, notably for the Municipal Civil Service Commission on August 1, 1911, for examination of police patrolmen and also for the Board of Elections, on August 22, 1911, for examination of election officers, and is the lowest price charged for the use of this hall.

The item of \$315 for electric light covers four hours on July 1, four hours on July 2, and six hours on July 3, making a total of fourteen hours, at the rate of \$22.50 an hour, which is the regular rate charged and is the same as that previously paid by the City.

In explanation of the use of artificial light for day examinations, even in mid-summer, it may be said that this hall is so large and has so many pillars that it has not sufficient light even on bright days for writing or desk work.

The charge of \$12.50 for drinking water, ice and service is itemized as follows:

This charge for drinking water is always made an extra item by the management.

I, therefore, respectfully recommend, the charges being reasonable and just, and the same as paid by the City on former occasions, that the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund adopt a resolution authorizing the Comptroller to pay to the Merchants and Manufacturers Exchange of New York, for use of the main hall of the Grand Central Palace, 46th and 47th streets and Lexington avenue, Borough of Manhattan, by the Municipal Civil Service Commission, for the purpose of conducting an examination for Court Attendant, on July 1 and 2, and for Lay Sanitary and Tenement House Inspector on July 3, 1912, between the hours of 9 a. m. and 4 p. m., without the necessity of entering into a lease therefor, the sum of \$600, being rent at the rate of \$200 for each day, and \$315 for electric light, together with \$12.50 for drinking water, ice and service, making a total of \$927.50, said amount to be charged to the account, "Miscellaneous City Special Contract Obligations, Rents, No. 1631, for the City of New York." The report was accepted, and the resolution adopted, all the members present voting in the affirmative.

The Deputy and Acting Comptroller presented the following report, and offered the following resolution, relative to the assignment of certain instruments of the Department of Parks, Borough of The Bronx:

To the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund:

Gentlemen—On September 10, 1912, the Commissioner of Parks, Borough of The Bronx, requested the transfer of the following articles to his department from the Department of Water Supply, Gas and Electricity: 1 precise level, No. 3959, C. L. Berger, 1 Stackpole Bros. transit, No. 2035, 1 Stackpole Bros. dumpy level, No. 643, 1 Wye level, No. 2151.

In a communication to your Commission, dated September 9, 1912, the Commissioner of Water Supply, Gas and Electricity stated that his department had no further need for these instruments, and transferred the same to your disposal. The Deputy and Acting Comptroller presented the following report and offered the following resolution relative to the assignment of one calculating instrument to the Commissioner of Public Works, Borough of Manhattan:

To the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund:

Gentlemen—On August 5, 1912, the Commissioner of the Tenement House Department stated that about a year and half ago his department loaned a Thacher calculating instrument to the office of the Commissioner of Public Works, Manhattan, where the instrument is now in daily use. The Tenement House Commissioner asks for authority to transfer the calculating instrument permanently to the Commissioner of Public Works.

The proposed transfer is in compliance with the provisions of section 205 of the Greater New York Charter.

Gentlemen—By resolution adopted December 18, 1911, the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund authorized the Commissioner of Water Supply, Gas and Electricity, to grant to the Westchester Lighting Company the privilege of laying a twelve-inch cast iron pipe across the Aqueduct Property, at Mosholu Avenue, near Grand Avenue, Borough of The Bronx, compensation to be at the rate of ten dollars (\$10) per annum.

In a communication addressed to the Department of Finance, under date of September 18, 1912, the Westchester Lighting Company states that, as it was decided not to run this main across the Aqueduct Property, and as the permit has therefore never been used, they desire that the resolution authorizing the privilege be rescinded.

Resolved, That the Comptroller be and hereby is authorized to pay from the "Sinking Fund for the Redemption of the City Debt, No. 1," upon the maturity of said stock the sum of eight hundred and twenty-five thousand five hundred and fifty-three and 60-100 dollars (\$825,553.60) for the redemption of that portion of the said stock that is held by the public and to cancel that portion of said stock amounting to one million eight hundred and seventy-four thousand eight hundred and eighteen and 80-100 dollars (\$1,874,818.80) that is held by the "Sinking Fund for the Redemption of the City Debt, No. 1."

The report was accepted, and the resolution adopted, all the members present voting in the affirmative.

The Deputy and Acting Comptroller presented the following report and offered the following resolutions relative to a lease of rooms at Nos. 54-60 Lafayette street, Borough of Manhattan, for use of the Municipal Civil Service Commission:
September 13, 1912.

To the Honorable the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund:
Gentlemen—The Secretary of the Municipal Civil Service Commission in a communication to your Honorable Board under date of July 24, 1912, requests that a lease of the seventh floor in the Merchants' Association Building, 54-60 Lafayette street (old number 66-72), Borough of Manhattan, be secured for a term of one year from October 12, 1912, and that the lease of the eighth or top floor in the same building be obtained for a term of five years from October 12, 1912. These two floors have an aggregate area of 6,886 square feet each, or a total of 13,772 square feet. Both floors have been occupied by the Municipal Civil Service Commission for the past five years at a rental of \$15,500 a year, being at the rate of \$1.12½ a square foot, including heat, light, water, repairs, elevator and janitor service.

Provision has been made in the new Municipal Building to house the Medical Bureau, gymnasium, etc., which now occupy the seventh floor in the Lafayette street building, but no provision has been made in the new Municipal Building for the large examination room which now occupies the top floor of the building in Lafayette street.

This top floor is well adapted for its present use, having windows on every side and many skylights, and very few pillars. Its location is also desirable. The owners of the building demanded a rental of \$8,750 for this floor on a five years' lease,

but as a result of negotiations by the Division of Real Estate of this department, they have consented to accept a rental of \$7,750 a year, being half of the total rental now paid for the two floors.

I therefore respectfully recommend, the rent being reasonable and just, and the same as previously paid, that the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund adopt a resolution authorizing a lease of the seventh floor in the Merchants' Association Building, 54-60 Lafayette street, Borough of Manhattan, for use of the Municipal Civil Service Commission, for a period of one year from October 12, 1912, with the privilege of renewal for an additional year upon the same terms and conditions, at an annual rental of \$7,750, payable quarterly, the lessor to pay taxes and water rates, make all repairs and to furnish heat, light, elevator and janitor service, the lessee to give ninety days' notice in writing to the lessors of its intention to renew the lease. Lessors, Civic Centre Company, 54-60 Lafayette street, and Surety Realty Company, 135 Broadway, Manhattan.

I also respectfully recommend, the rent being reasonable and just, and the same as previously paid, that the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund adopt a resolution authorizing a lease of the top, or eighth, floor in the Merchants' Association Building, 54-60 Lafayette street, Borough of Manhattan, for use of the Municipal Civil Service Commission, for a term of one year from October 12, 1912, at an annual rental of \$7,750, payable quarterly, the lessor to pay taxes and water rates, make all repairs and to furnish heat, light, elevator and janitor service. Lessors, Civic Centre Company, 54-60 Lafayette street, and Surety Realty Company, 135 Broadway, Manhattan. Respectfully,

Resolved, That the Corporation Counsel be and is hereby requested to prepare a lease to the City from the Civic Centre Company, and Surety Realty Company, of the seventh floor of the Merchants' Association Building, 54-60 Lafayette street, Borough of Manhattan, for use of the Municipal Civil Service Commission, for a term of one year from October 12, 1912, with the privilege of renewal for an additional year upon the same terms and conditions, at an annual rental of seven thousand seven hundred and fifty dollars (\$7,750), payable quarterly; the lessor to pay taxes and water rates, make all repairs and furnish heat, light, elevator and janitor service, the lessee to give ninety days' notice in writing to the lessors of its intention to renew the lease; and the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund deeming the said rent fair and reasonable, and that it would be for the interests of the City that such lease be made, the Comptroller be and is hereby authorized and directed to execute the same when prepared and approved by the Corporation Counsel, as provided by sections 149 and 217 of the Greater New York Charter.

Resolved, That the Corporation Counsel be and is hereby requested to prepare a lease to the City from the Civic Centre Company and Surety Realty Company, of the top or eighth floor of the Merchants' Association Building, 54-60 Lafayette street, Borough of Manhattan, for use of the Municipal Civil Service Commission, for a term of one year from October 12, 1912, at an annual rental of seven thousand seven hundred and fifty dollars (\$7,750), payable quarterly; the lessor to pay taxes and water rates, make all repairs and furnish heat, light, elevator and janitor service; and the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund deeming the said rent fair and reasonable, and that it would be for the interests of the City that such lease be made, the Comptroller be and is hereby authorized and directed to execute the same when prepared and approved by the Corporation Counsel, as provided by sections 149 and 217 of the Greater New York Charter.

The report was accepted, and the resolutions severally adopted, all the members present voting in the affirmative.

The following report was received from the Committee on Vacant Property, recommending that the following parcels of land be assigned to the Public Recreation Commission:

Parcel No. 1. Situated on the north side of Rivington street, between Mangin and Tompkins streets, Borough of Manhattan.

Parcel No. 2. Situated at Porter avenue, Harrison place and Ingraham street, Borough of Brooklyn.

Parcel No. 3. Situated between 132d street and Southern boulevard, being approach to the Willis avenue bridge, Borough of The Bronx.

Parcel No. 4. Being the block bounded by Thompson and Nott avenues and Court street, Long Island City, Borough of Queens.

October 7, 1912.

To the Honorable the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund:

Gentlemen—On September 18, 1912, there was referred to the Committee on Vacant Property a communication from the Public Recreation Commission requesting the transfer of certain parcels of real estate to that commission. After investigation this committee begs to report as follows, concerning each parcel for which request for transfer is made:

Parcel No. 1.

North side of Rivington street, between Mangin and Tompkins streets, 200 feet by 125 feet 5 inches, Borough of Manhattan.

On February 21, 1912, this committee recommended that the above parcel be held by the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, and that the Parks and Playgrounds Association be permitted to equip it as a model playground and to operate it under rules and regulations to be approved by the Public Recreation Commission. Parcel No. 1 is now held by the President of the Borough of Manhattan, and is used as a corporation yard. It is understood that he will be ready to transfer it to the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund early next spring. The Parks and Playgrounds Association now feels that this playground should be operated by the Public Recreation Commission. The Public Recreation Commission wishes to be assured of possession of the property when the President of the Borough of Manhattan surrenders it, in order that it may make intelligent estimates and requests for corporate stock and for funds with which to operate the playground. This committee believes that the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund should indicate at this time their willingness to transfer parcel No. 1 to the Public Recreation Commission, to be held by it during the pleasure of the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, provided funds are supplied by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment and the Board of Aldermen for equipment and operation by May 1, 1913.

Parcel No. 2.

Porter avenue, Harrison place and Ingraham street, 200 by 200 feet, Borough of Brooklyn.

On February 21, 1912, the Committee on Vacant Property recommended that this parcel be not sold because the committee believed that this was a logical location for a future playground, but recommended that it be leased for a period of five years because no department had indicated a present use for the property. The parcel is some distance from the Bushwick playgrounds, and is in a rapidly growing section. Your committee is of the opinion that this commission should now rescind its former resolution and should transfer parcel No. 2 to the Public Recreation Commission for use as a playground, subject to the conditions stated for parcel No. 1.

Parcel No. 3.

Land between 132d street and Southern boulevard, being The Bronx approach to the Willis avenue bridge, 475 by 140 feet.

On February 21, 1912, the Committee on Vacant Property recommended that this parcel be held for the present by the Commissioner of Parks of the Borough of The Bronx, inasmuch as he had not indicated his willingness to surrender the same. He has since expressed his willingness to transfer the property to the Public Recreation Commission for use as a model playground. This parcel has been used as a sort of a playfield and is in a locality where a well organized playground should be provided. The Committee on Vacant Property recommends, therefore, that this parcel be transferred to the Public Recreation Commission, subject to the conditions stated for parcel No. 1.

Parcel No. 4.

Block bounded by Thompson and Nott avenues and Court street, Long Island City, Borough of Queens.

On July 12, 1911, the Committee on Vacant Property recommended that parcel No. 4 be sold, and in a supplementary report on February 21, 1912, recommended that the matter be referred to the Comptroller for report. Up to that time no request had been made by any City department for the use of this property within the next five years. Parcel No. 4 is adjacent to a rapidly growing section of the city, and it might well be transferred to the Public Recreation Commission for use as a model playground, subject to the conditions stated for parcel No. 1.

Resolutions which, if adopted, will carry into effect the above recommendations, are attached hereto. Respectfully submitted,

Resolved, That, provided funds are supplied by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment and by the Board of Aldermen by May 1, 1913, for equipment and operation, parcel No. 2, situated at Porter avenue, Harrison place and Ingraham street, Borough of Brooklyn, be transferred to the Public Recreation Commission, to be held by it during the pleasure of the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund and to be used as a public playground.

Resolved, That, provided funds are supplied by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment and by the Board of Aldermen, by May 1, 1913, for equipment and operation, parcel No. 3, situated between 132d street and Southern boulevard, being approach to the Willis avenue bridge, Borough of The Bronx, be transferred to the Public Recreation Commission to be held by it during the pleasure of the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund and to be used as a public playground.

Resolved, That, provided funds are supplied by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment and by the Board of Aldermen by May 1, 1913, for equipment and operation, parcel No. 4, being block bounded by Thompson and Nott avenues and Court street, Long Island City, Borough of Queens, be transferred to the Public Recreation Commission, to be held by it during the pleasure of the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund and to be used as a public playground.

The report was accepted, and the resolutions severally adopted, all the members present voting in the affirmative.

Note—At this point the Board took a recess and proceeded to the Mayor's office where it reconvened and the meeting continued.

His Honor, the Mayor, took his seat in the Board and thereafter participated in the proceedings.

The following matters on the Calendar requiring a unanimous vote and held pending the arrival of the Mayor were then considered:

The following petition was received from Theodore F. Jackson for a conveyance of the City's interest in a section of the Old Flushing and Newtown Turnpike, in the Borough of Brooklyn:

To the Honorable Commissioners of the Sinking Fund of The City of New York:

The petition of Theodore F. Jackson, by Coombs & Wilson, his attorneys, shows:

That by deed dated November 30, 1896, by Andrew E. Burr (widower) individually and as trustee under the Last Will and Testament of Ida V. Burr for Caroline M. Burr, now Caroline B. Knapp, John T. Burr (widower), Caroline B. Knapp, wife of Harry K. Knapp, and recorded in the office of the Register of Kings County, in section 10, liber 4, cp. 232, on December 30, 1896, the following premises were conveyed to the said Theodore F. Jackson, to wit:

All that certain plot, piece or parcel of land, situate, lying and being in the City of Brooklyn (now Borough of Brooklyn), County of Kings, and State of New York, bounded and described as follows, to wit:

Beginning at the corner formed by the intersection of the northerly side of Flushing avenue with the easterly side of Porter avenue, and running thence northerly along Porter avenue 119 feet 4½ inches to Thames street, and thence easterly along Thames street 125 feet; and thence southerly parallel with Porter avenue 85 feet to Flushing avenue, and thence westerly along Flushing avenue 129 feet 5¾ inches to the place of beginning.

That of the above premises the said Theodore F. Jackson is still the owner of the following premises to wit:

All that certain plot or parcel of land situate in the Borough of Brooklyn, City of New York, County of Kings and State of New York, bounded and described as follows, to wit:

Beginning at the corner formed by the intersection of the northerly side of Flushing avenue with the easterly side of Porter avenue; running thence northerly along the easterly side of Porter avenue one hundred and nineteen (119) feet four and one-half (4½) inches to the southerly side of Thames street; thence easterly along the southerly side of Thames street seventy-five (75) feet; thence southerly parallel with Porter avenue ninety-nine (99) feet one (1) inch to the northerly side of Flushing avenue, and thence westerly along the northerly side of Flushing avenue seventy-seven (77) feet, eight and one-quarter (8¼) inches to the place of beginning, which premises are more fully shown on survey attached hereto, marked "Exhibit A."

That the said property is also distinguished upon the tax maps of the Borough of Brooklyn as Lots Nos. 1, 2 and 3, Block 3015, Section 10, on the land map of County of Kings, and upon a former map the said lots were distinguished as Lots 3, 4 and 5, Block 221, Ward 18.

Your petitioner further claims that the said Theodore F. Jackson, and his predecessors in title, have good title in fee simple to said premises, and that said title includes the record title to said premises and actual possession thereof under a claim of title in fee, exclusive of any other right for more than twenty years last past.

Your petitioner further shows that pursuant to Chapter 674, of the Laws of 1868, Flushing avenue from Division street to the City Line, was extended and widened, and that pursuant to said act all that portion of Flushing avenue and Newtown Turnpike road lying between Broadway and the City Line, and not taken for the opening and widening of Flushing avenue by said act, was declared discontinued and closed, and that the said improvement was accordingly made, and that thereby the northerly line of Flushing avenue and Newtown Turnpike road (as it was then called) was moved southerly 28 feet on the easterly side, and 40 feet on westerly side of premises. (See Exhibit A, survey of Meserole City Surveying Company, of March 25, 1912.)

Your petitioner further shows that the claim, if any, of the City of New York to that portion of premises lying within the lines of Flushing avenue and Newtown Turnpike road, is a mere cloud upon the title of Theodore F. Jackson to said premises and a hinderance to his ownership of same, and petitioner does not by this petition, or by anything herein contained, acknowledge that the said City of New York or anyone else, has any interest in or title to said premises or any part thereof.

Petitioner also states that all taxes and assessments against premises have been paid to date.

Your petitioner further shows that he is informed and believes that releases or quit claim deeds have been executed by The City of New York to the owners of property abutting upon Flushing avenue in the same manner as the property hereinabove described upon payment of the nominal sum of \$1 and \$100 to cover expenses.

Wherefore your petitioner prays that a quit claim deed or release in the form customary in such cases be granted to him, and that he have such other and further relief as may be just and equitable in the premises, and your petitioner will ever pray.



In connection therewith the Deputy and Acting Comptroller presented the following report with opinion of the Corporation Counsel, and offered the following resolution:

Law Department, Office of the Corporation Counsel, New York, July 10, 1912.

Hon. WILLIAM A. PRENDERGAST, Comptroller.

Sir—I have received your communication of June 28, 1912, transmitting petition of Theodore F. Jackson asking for a conveyance of the interest of the City in a section of the old Flushing and Newtown Turnpike. It is alleged in the petition that the petitioner, or his predecessors in title, have been in actual possession of the premises for more than twenty years last past, and two affidavits supporting this allegation are submitted. I am asked to advise you:

"First—Has the petitioner acquired title to the land in the road by adverse possession?"

"Second—May the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund lawfully sell and convey the interest of the City in the road to this petitioner?"

It appears by the uncontradicted allegations of the petition and of the affidavits that, for a great many years prior to his death, which occurred about the year 1870, Mr. Vandervoort resided on the property now under consideration; that his homestead was located on the farm and was situated on the northerly side of the Bushwick and Newtown Turnpike road; that the farm which he owned laid on both sides of the turnpike road, and that that part lying on the northerly side thereof was inclosed with a board fence erected on the line of said turnpike road, said fence having been erected some time prior to the year 1860; that, when Flushing avenue was opened and graded and paved, this fence was removed from the line of the turnpike road and was placed on the northerly side of Flushing avenue.

Mr. John T. Burr swears that "I am well acquainted with the property owned by Theodore F. Jackson situated at the corner of Flushing and Porter avenues, and more particularly referred to and described in his petition herein.

"When I first became acquainted with the property in question it formed part of the garden or yard adjoining a frame dwelling house which was erected on the northerly side of the said turnpike, and within about one hundred or one hundred and fifty feet of the premises affected by this application, and the wooden fence was constructed on the line of the turnpike in front of this house."

—that when the Vandervoort farm, lying north of Flushing avenue, was purchased by the said Theodore F. Jackson in the year 1880, he caused a map thereof to be made showing the streets and avenues as laid out on the Commissioners' Map of the City of Brooklyn, and, in that year, Mr. Burr became associated with Mr. Jackson in the laying out of the streets, opening, grading and paving the same, and laying sewers therein, and, in opening Thames street, it became necessary to remove the frame dwelling house to the south of its former location, fronting on the new line of Flushing avenue; that

"during all that period of time the premises in question, although not actually inclosed, were occupied and used by myself and my workmen in the work of the said improvement."

Mr. Jackson states in his verified petition that he and his predecessors in title have good title in fee simple to said premises, and that said title includes the record title to said premises and actual possession thereof under a claim of title in fee exclusive of any other right for more than twenty years last past.

It is provided by the Code of Civil Procedure that "where the occupant, or those under whom he claims, entered into the possession of the premises, under claim of title, exclusive of any other right, founding the claim upon a written instrument, as being a conveyance of the premises in question, * * * and there has been a continued occupation and possession of the premises, included in the instrument, * * * or of some part thereof, for twenty years, under the same claim; the premises so included are deemed to have been held adversely." * * * (Section 369).

And further, that "For the purpose of constituting an adverse possession, by a person claiming a title, founded upon a written instrument, * * * land is deemed to have been possessed and occupied in either of the following cases:

"1. Where it has been usually cultivated or improved.
"2. Where it has been protected by a substantial inclosure." (Section 370).
The facts as presented bring the claim of the petitioner squarely within these provisions of law, and I advise you that the petitioner is the owner of the land referred to by reason of adverse possession based upon a record title and actual possession.

As to your second question, I would say that the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund may lawfully sell and convey the interest of the City in the old Flushing and Newtown Turnpike to the petitioner. Respectfully yours,

Gentlemen—In a petition addressed to the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, Theodore F. Jackson prays for a conveyance of the interest of the City in a section of the old Flushing and Newtown turnpike. The property is designated as Lots 1, 2 and 3, Block 3015, section 10 on the tax maps of the Borough of Brooklyn. An adverse possession of the land for more than twenty years last past is alleged and supported by two affidavits. All the papers were submitted to the Corporation Counsel. Under date of July 10, 1912, he forwarded an opinion which contains the following advice:

"The facts as presented bring the claim of the petitioner squarely within these provisions of law" (sections 369 and 370, Code of Civil Procedure), "and I advise you that the petitioner is the owner of the land referred to by reason of adverse possession based upon a record title and actual possession."

I recommend the adoption of the attached resolution authorizing a conveyance to this petitioner. Respectfully,

Jackson, in a verified petition, addressed to the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, requests a conveyance of the interest of the City in a section of Flushing avenue and Newtown turnpike, designated on the tax maps of the Borough of Brooklyn as Lots 1, 2 and 3, Block 3015, Section 10; therefore, be it

Resolved, That the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund hereby determine that the land described as follows, is not required for any public use:

All that certain lot, piece or parcel of land, situate, lying and being in the Borough of Brooklyn, County of Kings, City and State of New York, bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at the corner formed by the intersection of the northerly side of Flushing avenue with the easterly side of Porter avenue, running thence northerly along the easterly side of Porter avenue forty feet (40 feet), to the northerly side or line of what was formerly known as the Flushing avenue and Newtown Turnpike road, thence easterly along said northerly line of said road seventy-five feet five and three-eighths inches (75 feet 5 3/8 inches), thence southerly and parallel with the easterly side of Porter avenue twenty-eight feet (28 feet), to the northerly side of Flushing avenue, thence westerly along the northerly side of Flushing avenue seventy-seven feet eight and one-quarter inches (77 feet 8 1/4 inches), to the easterly side of Porter avenue at the point or place of beginning, be the said several dimensions more or less.

—and be it further

Resolved, That, pursuant to the provisions of section 205 of the amended Greater New York Charter, the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund hereby authorize a conveyance to Theodore F. Jackson, residing at Westhampton Beach, County of Suffolk, State of New York, of all the right, title and interest of The City of New York in and to that portion of Flushing avenue and Newtown Turnpike road hereinabove described, it being the intention to convey all that part of Flushing avenue and Newtown Turnpike road lying within the lines of Lots 1, 2 and 3, Block 3015, Section 10, as designated on the tax maps of The City of New York, Borough of Brooklyn, in use on January 1, 1912.

The conveyance to be made is subject to the following conditions:

That the petitioner waives any and all claim for damages arising out of the closing of the road.

That the petitioner is the owner of the lands fronting on the section of road conveyed.

That the deed contains the following reservation:

* * * * * excepting and reserving to the party of the first part all easements and other rights of every kind and description which it has in and to Flushing avenue and Porter avenue by reason of its ownership of or interest in the premises hereby conveyed or otherwise with the same force and effect and to the same extent as though this conveyance had not been made or delivered. And the party of the second part, in further consideration of this conveyance, does hereby for himself, his heirs, successors and assigns, waive, surrender and release any right to damages which has accrued or may at any time accrue from the use, for any rapid transit, municipal, public or semi-public purpose of Flushing avenue and Porter avenue by reason of ownership of or interest in the premises hereby conveyed or herein described; without prejudice, however, to any rights or claims which have accrued or may hereafter accrue by virtue of such uses to the grantee herein or his successors in interest by reason of his ownership of the premises adjoining those hereby conveyed.

That the said conveyance be made in such form as shall be approved by the Corporation Counsel; and be it further

Resolved, That the interest of The City of New York in and to the same is hereby appraised at the sum of one hundred and one dollars (\$101), plus twelve dollars and fifty cents (\$12.50), to cover the cost of drawing deeds, to be paid by the petitioner, and evidence produced that all taxes, assessments and liens due the City which appear against the land in the road and the petitioner's abutting property, have been paid before the execution and delivery of the deed.

The report was accepted and the resolution unanimously adopted.

The Deputy and Acting Comptroller presented the following report and offered the following resolution relative to an amendment to resolution, adopted July 17, 1912, authorizing a conveyance to the Barnthal Realty Company of the City's interest in certain property located at Tremont avenue and West 177th street, Borough of The Bronx:

To the Honorable the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund:

Gentlemen—On July 17, 1912, the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund adopted a resolution authorizing a release to the Barnthal Realty Company in consideration of the sum of \$9,000, of all the right, title and interest of The City of New York in and to certain property located at Tremont avenue and West 177th street, Borough of The Bronx.

This strip is a part of Tremont avenue which was closed and discontinued by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment by resolution adopted July 2, 1909. It was originally acquired by the City in proceedings instituted in 1884 for the opening of Tremont avenue, in which proceedings the report of the Commissioners of Estimate and Assessment was confirmed July 19, 1893. The Barnthal Realty Company, or their predecessors in title, were at that time assessed for benefit for the opening of Tremont avenue, and have never received any award for damages for the closing. In my opinion, therefore, the consideration should be the same as in other cases of closed streets, where no award was received for damage by reason of such closing, which is 50 per cent. of the appraised value.

The value of the piece in question has been appraised by the Division of Real Estate of this Department at \$9,000.

I therefore respectfully recommend that the resolution above mentioned be amended by fixing the consideration to be paid by the Barnthal Realty Company at \$4,500, instead of \$9,000. Respectfully,

That a certified copy of the deed under which the said Westchester Exempt Firemen's Association holds title to the abutting property is herewith presented and made a part of this petition.

Wherefore, Your petitioner makes application for a release of all the right, title and interest of The City of New York in and to the premises first above described, pursuant to section 205 of the Greater New York Charter, and that such other and further relief may be granted as to this honorable body might seem just and proper.

Gentlemen—In a petition to the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, Peter Schweickert states that he is the president of the Westchester Exempt Firemen's Association of The City of New York, an incorporated association of former volunteer firemen, who are the owners of certain property situated on the southeasterly corner of White Plains avenue and Bartholdi street, Borough of The Bronx, known as Lot 65 on a map of the New York Lace Makers' Association in Williamsbridge. He states that The City of New York in opening White Plains road, abandoned a strip of land about 4.29 feet in width abutting on the property in question, and he requests a deed to the Westchester Exempt Firemen's Association of the City of New York for this strip, so that there would be no question about their title to the property.

In the proceeding for the acquiring of title to White Plains road from the northern boundary of the City of New York to Morris Park avenue in the Borough of The Bronx, the easterly line of White Plains road at this point is some four feet westerly from the easterly line of old White Plains road. This leaves a strip of land between White Plains road and the petitioners' property. Investigation shows that the City is not the owner of the fee in said strip of land.

In the proceeding above mentioned there was no award made to the owners of the property on this side of the old White Plains road. There was, however, an assessment levied against Lot 65 for \$421.81. It is obvious that the City cannot use this strip of land for any useful purpose.



No bid or estimate will be considered unless, as a condition precedent to the reception or consideration of any proposal, it be accompanied by a certified check upon one of the State or National banks of The City of New York, drawn to the order of the Comptroller, for money or corporate stock or certificates of indebtedness of any nature issued by The City of New York, which the Comptroller shall approve as of equal value with the security required in the advertisement, to the amount of not less than three nor more than five per centum of the amount of the bond required, as provided in section 420 of the Greater New York Charter.

The certified check or money should not be inclosed in the envelope containing the bid or estimate, but should be either inclosed in a separate envelope addressed to the head of the Department, President or Board, or submitted personally upon the presentation of the bid or estimate.

For particulars as to the quantity and quality of the supplies, or the nature and extent of the work, reference must be made to the specifications, schedules, plans, etc., on file in the said office of the President, Board or Department.

No bid shall be accepted from or contract awarded to any person who is in arrears to The City of New York upon debt or contract, or who is a defaulter, as surety or otherwise, upon any obligation to the City.

The contract must be bid for separately. The right is reserved in each case to reject all bids or estimates if it is deemed to be for the interest of the City so to do.

Bidders will write out the amount of their bids or estimates in addition to inserting the same in figures.

Bidders are requested to make their bids or estimates upon the blank forms prepared and furnished by the City, a copy of which, with the proper envelope in which to inclose the bid, together with a copy of the contract, including the specifications, in the form approved by the Corporation Counsel, can be obtained upon application therefor at the office of the Department for which the work is to be done. Plans and drawings of construction work may also be seen there.
