It seems clear to us that the intention of the petition presented by the property-owners was that the work should be done by the Board of Health out of any funds under its control, or "its appropriations" from moneys raised by general taxation. This is corroborated by the statement further in the petition, that the amount so expended would soon be reimbursed to the City by the increased value which would be placed on the lots benefited for the purposes of taxation, and this improvement would "furnish a revenue to reimburse the City for the expenditure solicited."

This conclusion necessarily disposes of the petition in the Matter of De Graaf, one of the grantees of Hugh N. Camp.

The decision made in the Matters of Schaeffler and Daly, on March 9, 1886, is made applicable, and the assessment in these cases should be vacated.

The Chairman put the question whether the decision, as presented, shall stand [as the decision of the Commissioners.
