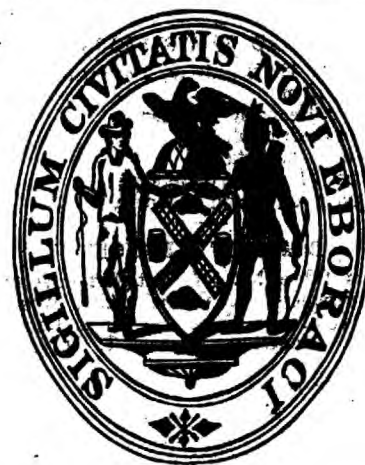

Second—Pursuant to the said constitutional provision and statute hereinbefore recited, the Board of Estimate and Apportionment of the petitioner, by a resolution duly adopted on the 31st day of May, 1912, required the Comptroller of the petitioner to prepare and submit to said Board a statement showing in detail indebtedness incurred by the petitioner for dock investment prior to the first day of January, 1910, with the dates of maturity of such indebtedness, the terms of any and all agreements and contracts made by or in behalf of the petitioner with respect to such investment, the gross revenue received by the petitioner therefrom, the interest paid and to be paid by the petitioner on said indebtedness, the annual installments necessary for the amortization thereof, and the current net revenue derived by the petitioner from said investment, and pursuant to such resolution the said Comptroller did prepare and submit to said Board such statement, and thereupon, the said Board of Estimate and Apportionment did, by resolution adopted on the 11th day of July, 1912, direct that application be made to this Court for a determination of the amount of indebtedness incurred by the petitioner, prior to the first day of January, 1910, for dock investment, which may be excluded in ascertaining the power of the petitioner to become otherwise indebted under the provisions of said section ten of article eight of the Constitution of the State of New York.

Third—Prior to the year 1879 and to and including the 31st day of December, 1909, it was the practice to make all payments of money of whatever character on account of the several functions of the Department of Docks and Ferries of the petitioner and of its predecessor departments, viz.: docks, recreation buildings and municipal ferries, out of a common fund known as the Dock Fund. The moneys in the dock fund were and are now provided principally by issue of long time bonds of The City of New York. These bonded obligations were issued prior to the 1st day of January, 1879, by the Mayor, Aldermen and Commonality of The City of New York, one of the predecessor corporations of The City of New York as now constituted and are described and designated as "Dock Bonds," and since January 1, 1879, such money has been and is now provided by the issue of corporate stock of The City of New York.

Prior to January 1, 1910, the yearly maintenance and operating expenses of the Department of Docks and Ferries and its predecessor departments were paid from the proceeds of the sale of bonded obligations and the cost of such maintenance, and the amount of such operating expenses incurred prior to January 1, 1910, form part of the bonded indebtedness enumerated in the paragraph of this petition marked "Fourth"; since January 1, 1910, pursuant to the provisions of chapter 277 of the Laws of 1909 the yearly maintenance and operating expenses of the Department of Docks and Ferries have been charged to and paid from annual appropriations made for the Department of Docks and Ferries in the tax budget of the petitioner, and since that date have not been charged against or paid from the proceeds of the sale of corporate stock.

Annexed hereto, marked "Exhibit A" and made a part hereof to the same extent as if the facts therein stated were herein fully and at length set forth, is a comprehensive statement giving in detail data as to all the activities of the Department of Docks and Ferries of The City of New York and its predecessor departments, under the following subdivisions:

1. Bonded indebtedness.
2. Contract liability.
3. Land liability.
4. Terms of agreements and contracts.
5. Gross revenue received by the City.
6. Interest paid and to be paid by the City on bonded indebtedness.
7. Annual installment necessary for amortization of indebtedness.
8. Current net revenue received by the City.

Fourth—The bonded obligations for indebtedness incurred prior to January 1, 1910, for which the petitioner is liable, issued by it and its predecessor corporations previous to said day for the several activities under the jurisdiction of the Department of Docks and Ferries and its predecessor departments, showing the year when issued, the year of maturity and the rate of interest, are as follows:

Of this amount the sum of \$1,206,542.88 had been expended for the acquisition of property and for construction work.

There was therefore outstanding on the 31st day of December, 1911, of the bonds issued prior to January 1, 1910, on account of the various activities under the jurisdiction of the Department of Docks and Ferries and its predecessor departments, bonded indebtedness amounting to the sum of \$100,164,970.52.

Fifth—During the years 1910 and 1911, corporate stock aggregating \$9,296,292.62 was issued by the petitioner on account of all the activities under the jurisdiction of the Department of Docks and Ferries, as shown in the following schedule:

Sixth—In 1899 corporate stock to the amount of \$100,000, to mature in 1929, bearing interest at the rate of three per cent. per annum, was issued, the proceeds of which were used for the improvement of Wallabout Basin, Borough of Brooklyn. This fund was used for the construction of piers Nos. 3 and 4 in the Wallabout Basin and for paving, etc., to fill in land in the rear of the bulkhead wall on the easterly side of Wallabout Market. This issue of corporate stock is not classified in the accounts of the Department of Finance, the Department of Docks and Ferries among stocks and bonds issued for dock purposes, but in view of the purposes for which the proceeds of the sale of this corporate stock was used, the facts with respect thereto are submitted to the Court.

Seventh—Of the bonded obligations for indebtedness incurred prior to January 1, 1910, for which the petitioner is liable, issued by it and its predecessor corporations for the several activities under the jurisdiction of the Department of Docks and Ferries and its predecessor departments, the sum of \$7,975,008.58 was issued to pay for uplands, lands under water, wharfs, piers, bulkheads, floating plant and appurtenances and for construction work for all the activities of the Department of Docks and Ferries and its predecessor departments other than recreation buildings, municipal ferries and the Roosevelt Street-Broadway Ferry, and if the \$100,000 of corporate stock, proceeds whereof were used for the improvement of Wallabout Basin, in the Borough of Brooklyn, is included, then the amount will be \$7,975,008.58; and bonded obligations to the amount of \$10,672,608.69 were issued to pay the expense of maintenance and operation of such activities.

Eighth—On December 31, 1909, there were outstanding liabilities upon contracts in connection with the activities more particularly described in the paragraph of this petition marked "Seventh," amounting to the sum of \$2,472,029.94, all of which were discharged from the proceeds of the sale of corporate stock issued during the years 1910 and 1911. Subdivision 2 of Part II of Exhibit "A," hereto annexed, under the caption "Contract Liability," is a schedule showing in detail such indebtedness.

Ninth—On December 31, 1909, the liability of petitioner for land in process of acquisition for use in connection with such activities amounted to the sum of \$6,798,728.51, of which the sum of \$2,200,416.01 was paid from the proceeds of the sale of corporate stock issued during the years 1910 and 1911. Subdivision 3 of Part II of Exhibit "A," hereto annexed, under the caption "Land Liability," is a schedule showing in detail such indebtedness.

Tenth—Of the corporate stock issued during the years 1910 and 1911 for the Department of Docks and Ferries, the sum of \$3,406,097.96 was used for such activities, of which corporate stock in the sum of \$2,445,661.93 was issued to discharge contract liability incurred prior to the first day of January, 1910, and corporate stock in the sum of \$2,180,505.68 was issued to defray land liability incurred prior to the first day of January, 1910.

Eleventh—There are now outstanding bonded obligations for which the petitioner is liable totaling \$76,398,633.31, issued to pay debt incurred prior to January 1, 1910, for such activities; and if the \$100,000 of corporate stock issued for the improvement of Wallabout Basin is included, the amount of such bonded obligations will be \$76,498,633.31.

Twelfth—In Schedules "A," "B" and subdivisions 1 and 3 of Schedule "C" of "Exhibit A" hereto annexed, is contained a schedule of all agreements and contracts in force on the 31st day of December, 1911, with respect to such activities, showing the terms thereof.

Thirteenth—The yearly gross revenue of the petitioner from such activities as of the 31st day of December, 1911, was the sum of \$4,563,459.65.

Fourteenth—The annual interest paid and to be paid on the sum of \$72,975,008.58, being the bonded obligations for which the petitioner was liable on December 31, 1909, proceeds whereof were used for the acquisition of property and for construction work, was and will be the sum of \$2,615,014.07. If the \$100,000 of corporate stock issued in 1899 for the improvement of Wallabout Basin is included, the amount of such interest was and will be the sum of \$2,618,014.07.

The annual interest paid and to be paid by the petitioner upon the corporate stock issued in the years 1910 and 1911 to discharge contract liability amounting to the sum of \$2,472,029.94 incurred prior to the first day of January, 1910, was and will be the sum of \$89,104.18, making a total of \$2,804,221.24.

From this should be deducted the annual interest paid prior to its redemption upon bonded obligations issued for such activities redeemed during the years 1910 and 1911, amounting to the sum of \$1,206,542.88, which interest amounted to the sum of \$34,464.55.

Therefore the annual interest paid and to be paid by the petitioner on account of bonded

indebtedness incurred for such activities is the sum of \$2,749,756.69, and if the interest upon the corporate stock issued in 1899 for the improvement of Wallabout Basin is included, the amount of such interest will be the sum of \$2,752,756.69.

Fifteenth—The annual installments necessary for the amortization of the bonded obligations for which the petitioner is liable, amounting to said sum of \$72,975,008.58, is the sum of \$1,057,779.67. If the \$100,000 of corporate stock issued in 1899 for the improvement of Wallabout Basin is included, the amount required for annual amortization purposes will be the sum of \$1,059,881.59.

The annual installments necessary for the amortization of the corporate stock issued in the years 1910 and 1911 to discharge contract liability amounting to the sum of \$2,472,029.94, incurred prior to the first day of January, 1910, is the sum of \$29,073.95.

The annual installments necessary for the amortization of the corporate stock issued in the years 1910 and 1911 to discharge land liability amounting to the sum of \$2,200,416.01, incurred prior to the first day of January, 1910, is the sum of \$19,648.58, making a total of \$1,099,502.20.

From this should be deducted the annual installments necessary for the amortization of the bonded obligations issued for such activities redeemed during the years 1910 and 1911, amounting to the sum of \$1,206,542.88, which annual installments were the sum of \$25,179.49.

Therefore, the annual amortization requirements for the redemption of bonded indebtedness incurred for such activities is the sum of \$1,074,322.71; and if the annual installment necessary for the amortization of the corporate stock issued in 1899 for the improvement of Wallabout Basin is included, the amount of such annual installments will be the sum of \$1,076,424.63.

Therefore, the total annual interest and amortization charges on such indebtedness amount to the sum of \$3,824,079.40; and if the annual interest and amortization charges upon the corporate stock issued in 1899 for the improvement of Wallabout Basin are included, such amount will be the sum of \$3,829,181.32.

Sixteenth—The current net revenue which the petitioner is receiving from such activities is the sum of \$3,675,352.77, arrived at by deducting from the yearly gross revenue as stated in paragraph thirteenth of this petition, viz., \$4,563,459.65, the expenses of operation and maintenance and depreciation in the value of the floating plant used in connection therewith to the sum of \$888,106.88.

Seventeenth—The following statement is submitted for the information of the Court, to the end that the Court may be fully apprised of the character of the revenues received by the petitioner from such activities, more particularly as to their stability and permanency, and as to the constant annual increase thereof.

Wherefore, your petitioner prays that this Court will, pursuant to said chapter 276 of the Laws of 1910, designate six daily newspapers of general circulation published in The City of New York, at least one of which is published in the Borough of Brooklyn, in said city, in which notice of this application shall be given as prescribed by said act and fix the date when the application of your petitioner shall be heard, and that this Court shall determine the amount of the indebtedness incurred for dock investment prior to the 1st day of January, 1910, which may be excluded in ascertaining the power of the petitioner to become otherwise indebted under the provisions of section ten of article eight of the Constitution of the State of New York and for such other and further relief as may be just.

Note.—In addition to the amounts included in the foregoing schedules of bonds issued to provide funds for dock purposes it appears that in 1899 corporate stock to the amount of \$100,000 was issued to mature in 1929, with interest at the rate of 3 per cent., the proceeds whereof having been used for the improvement of Wallabout Basin, Borough of Brooklyn. An analysis of the disbursements from this account indicates that the fund was used for the construction of Piers Nos. 3 and 4 in the Wallabout Basin and for paving, etc., the filled in land in the rear of the bulkhead wall on the easterly side of Wallabout Basin. Although this issue of corporate stock is not classified in the accounts of the Department of Finance or the Department of Docks and Ferries among stock and bonds issued for dock purposes, it would seem proper in view of the disposition of the proceeds of the stock that for the purpose of this statement it should be considered as part of the City's indebtedness for dock investment. If this view of the matter is sustained the net bonded indebtedness for dock purposes December 31, 1909, would be \$101,647,970.52, and on December 31, 1911, the amount would be \$109,561,263.14.

Indebtedness Represented by Investment.

Based upon the Departmental records of the expenditures made from the Dock Fund from 1879 to 1909, inclusive, an apportionment has been made of the bonded indebtedness, amounting, as herein previously shown, to \$101,547,970.52, as between the bonded indebtedness represented by expenditures for the acquisition of land and other property and construction thereon, which may be termed investment account, and the expenditures for yearly maintenance and operation of the several Departmental functions. This apportionment shows that of the \$101,547,970.52 total bonded indebtedness, \$83,144,617.78 is represented in property and construction and the balance of \$18,403,352.74 in expenses of yearly operation and maintenance. If the \$100,000 for the improvement of Wallabout Basin is to be added, the amount represented in property and construction was \$83,244,617.78.

Beginning with January 1, 1910, pursuant to the provisions of chapter 277 of the Laws of 1909, the yearly maintenance and operating expenses of the Department of Docks and Ferries have been charged to appropriations provided in the yearly tax budget, and since that date have not been made a charge against funds provided by the issue of corporate stock. We find, therefore, that of the \$109,461,263.14 total bonded indebtedness outstanding December 31, 1911, \$91,234,367.52 was for permanent investment as represented by expenditures for property and construction, and the balance, \$18,226,895.62, for expenses of operation and maintenance. To the sum \$91,234,367.52 should be added \$100,000 of corporate stock issued for Wallabout Basin improvement, making a total of \$91,334,367.52; provided that this item is to be considered indebtedness for dock investment.

The outstanding liabilities for contracts chargeable to corporate stock funds on December 31, 1909, amounted to \$2,816,686.19. Following is a schedule showing the details of this amount, as also the amounts paid thereon from the proceeds of corporate stock during 1910 and 1911, viz., \$38,889.72.

6. Interest Paid and to be Paid on Bonded Indebtedness.

The annual interest paid and to be paid by the City on \$101,547,970.52, the total amount of dock bonds and corporate stock issued for all of the purposes of the Department of Docks and Ferries still unredeemed and outstanding December 31, 1909, was \$3,692,150.23. If the \$100,000 of corporate stock issued in 1899 for the Wallabout improvement is to be included in the bonded indebtedness the sum of \$3,000 should be added to the amount stated, making the total yearly interest \$3,695,150.23.

The annual interest paid and to be paid on \$83,144,617.78, that being the proportion of the bonded indebtedness outstanding December 31, 1909, represented by disbursements for investment account in property and construction, amounts to \$3,012,205.75. Adding \$3,000 for interest on the \$100,000 corporate stock issued for the Wallabout improvement, all of which was expended for construction, the amount would be \$3,015,205.75.

The annual interest paid and to be paid by the City on corporate stock issued during the years 1910 and 1911 amounts to \$379,883.24, and the interest paid on \$1,383,000 of dock bonds redeemed during the years 1910 and 1911 amounted to \$62,430.

The annual interest cost of the bonded indebtedness of the City for all purposes of the Department of Docks and Ferries, as existing December 31, 1911, was \$4,009,603.47. With \$3,000 added for interest on corporate stock issued for the Wallabout improvement the total would be \$4,012,603.47.

The annual interest paid and to be paid on \$91,234,367.52, that being the proportion of the

bonded indebtedness outstanding December 31, 1911, represented by disbursements for investment account in property and construction, amounts to \$3,337,624.44. Adding \$3,000 for interest on the \$100,000 corporate stock issued for the Wallabout improvement, the amount would be \$3,340,624.44.

7. Annual Installments Necessary for Amortization of Indebtedness.

The annual installments necessary for the amortization of the \$101,547,970.52 of bonds and corporate stock outstanding December 31, 1909, amounted to \$1,403,421.13. Adding to this amount \$2,101.92 necessary for the amortization of the \$100,000 of corporate stock issued for the Wallabout improvement, would make the total \$1,405,523.05.

The annual installments necessary for the amortization of the \$83,144,617.78 of bonded indebtedness outstanding December 31, 1909, represented by investment account in payments for property and construction, amounts to \$1,165,756.89. Adding \$1,101.92 necessary for the amortization of the \$100,000 corporate stock issued for the Wallabout improvement would make the total \$1,166,858.81.

The annual installments necessary for the amortization of the \$9,296,292.62 corporate stock issued during the years 1910 and 1911, amounts to \$83,769.11, and the installments necessary for the amortization of the \$1,383,000 of bonds redeemed during 1910 and 1911 was \$28,862.

The annual installments necessary for the amortization of the bonds and corporate stock issued by the City for all of the purposes of the Department of Docks and Ferries remaining unredeemed and outstanding December 31, 1911, was \$1,458,328.24. With \$2,101.92 added for the \$100,000 corporate stock issued for the Wallabout improvement, the total would be \$1,460,430.16.

about improvement the total would be \$1,460,430.16.

The annual installments necessary for the amortization of \$91,234,367.52 of bonded indebtedness outstanding December 31, 1911, represented by investment account in payments for property and construction, amounts to \$1,222,346.51. Adding \$2,101.92 necessary for the amortization of the \$100,000 corporate stock for the Wallabout improvement would make the total \$1,224,448.43.

8. Current Net Revenue Received by the City.

The current net revenue received by the City from the operation of all of the properties under the jurisdiction of the Department of Docks and Ferries as of December 31, 1911, was \$2,745,435.13, this figure representing yearly gross revenues of \$5,569,639.69, as herein previously shown in detail, less expenses of operation and maintenance, depreciation in the value of ferries and other floating plant and the subvention allowed to the Brooklyn-Manhattan Ferry Company for the year 1911, aggregating \$2,824,204.56.

PART II.

Dock Purposes.

(This includes uplands, lands under water, wharves, piers, bulkheads, leased ferry slips, floating plant and appurtenances for all purposes of the Department of Docks and Ferries, other than recreation buildings, municipal ferries and the Roosevelt street-Broadway ferry.)

1. Bonded Indebtedness.

The dock bonds and corporate stock of The City of New York outstanding December 31, 1909, the proceeds whereof were expended for dock purposes, amounted to \$83,647,617.27, exclusive of an issue of \$100,000 for the improvement of Wallabout Basin, Borough of Brooklyn. From an analysis of the disbursements made from the fund for the improvement of Wallabout Basin, it appears that the whole amount provided by this issue of corporate stock was expended for the construction of piers and for paying the upland contiguous thereto. As certain revenues from rentals and wharfage are now received by the Department of Docks and Ferries from this dock property, it would seem proper that the indebtedness represented by the outstanding corporate stock issued for this improvement should be included in this statement of the City's indebtedness for dock purposes; notwithstanding the fact that this issue of corporate stock is not classified among bonds for dock purposes on the

records of the Department of Docks and Ferries or the Department of Finance. Including this amount of \$100,000, the City's bonded indebtedness for docks December 31, 1909, was therefore \$83,747,617.27. Of the \$83,647,617.27 bonded indebtedness outstanding December 31, 1909, there was redeemed during the years 1910 and 1911 the amount of \$1,383,000 of bonds maturing during the years specified. This left a balance of bonded indebtedness outstanding December 31, 1911, of bonds issued prior to January 1, 1910, of \$82,264,617.27. In addition to this amount there was issued during the years 1910 and 1911 corporate stock amounting to \$8,406,097.96, thus making a total of \$90,670,715.23 bonded indebtedness outstanding December 31, 1911. With the addition of \$100,000 corporate stock issued for the Wallabout improvement, the total would be \$90,770,715.23.

Based upon the records of the Department of Docks and Ferries of expenditures made from the Dock Fund for dock purposes, an apportionment has been made of the bonded indebtedness therefor as between indebtedness incurred for investment, i. e., the acquisition and construction of dock properties and the yearly expenses of maintenance and operation of this division of the Department's functions. The apportionment thus made shows that of \$83,647,617.27, the amount of bonds outstanding December 31, 1909, the sum of \$72,975,008.58 is represented in dock investment and \$10,672,608.69 in expenses of yearly maintenance and operation. If the \$100,000 for the improvement of Wallabout Basin is to be included, then the amount represented in investment was \$73,075,008.58.

As previously stated in Part I of this statement, the practice of paying the expenses of yearly maintenance and operation of the functions of the Department of Docks and Ferries from the proceeds of the sale of corporate stock was discontinued with the close of 1909 and thereafter all such expenses have been met from yearly tax budget appropriations, as provided in chapter 277 of the Laws of 1909. All the bonded indebtedness incurred during 1910 and 1911, therefore, was to provide for investment purposes. Of the \$90,670,715.23 bonded indebtedness existing December 31, 1911, \$80,174,563.66 was on account of investment and \$10,496,151.57 expenses of maintenance and operation. To the \$80,174,563.66 should be added the \$100,000 corporate stock issued for the Wallabout Basin improvement, or a total of \$80,274,563.66.

The outstanding liabilities for contracts chargeable to corporate stock funds on December 31, 1909, amounted to \$2,472,029.94. Following is a schedule showing the details of this amount, all of which was discharged during the years 1910 and 1911:

Second—Ferry Franchises:

Appended to and made a part of this report is a schedule (marked B), showing ferry franchises and leases (other than municipal ferries and the Roosevelt street-Broadway ferry), under the jurisdiction of the Department of Docks and Ferries, with the location and description of premises, names of lessees, conditions of leases and yearly rental revenue therefrom as indicated December 31, 1909, December 31, 1910, and December 31, 1911.

Third—Temporary Permits for Use of Wharf Property:

In addition to the leases and ferry franchises granted by the Commissioner of Docks with the concurrence of the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund for the occupation of uplands, land under water and wharf property under the jurisdiction of the Department, there are also issued by the Commissioner permits for periods not exceeding one year, without reference to the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund. These permits are issued pursuant to the provisions of section 825 of the Greater New York Charter which says: "Unless said leases are sold at public auction and duly advertised in the City Record and the corporation newspapers for at least ten days, said Commissioner shall make no lease authorized by this section unless the terms of said lease are approved by the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund; but temporary permits for a period not exceeding one year may be granted to use and occupy said wharf property, said permits to be terminable at the will of the Commissioner." Appended to and made a part of this statement is a schedule (marked C) showing in detail all temporary permits authorized by the Commissioner of Docks in force December 31, 1911.

Fourth—Wharfage and Dockage Rates:

The charges for wharfage and dockage are fixed and regulated under the provisions of section 825 and 859 of the Greater New York Charter, which empower the Commissioner of Docks to regulate the charges for wharfage, craning and dockage and to "alter such charges from time to time as the public trade may authorize and the said Commissioner of Docks deems proper; provided that the rates of wharfage on boats navigating the canals of the State shall not be increased beyond the rates in force on April 18, 1871, except as hereinafter specifically provided, and no restriction of the amount of wharf and slip room occupied by them shall be made."

Acting under the authority vested in him by the sections of the City Charter referred to, the Commissioner of Docks has formulated a schedule of wharfage rates, a copy of which (marked Schedule D) is appended to and made a part of this statement.

5. Gross Revenues Received by the City.

The yearly gross revenue, as of December 31, 1911, of the City of New York from dock properties under the jurisdiction of the Department of Docks and Ferries, other than recreation buildings, municipal ferries and the Roosevelt street-Broadway ferry, which revenues for the purpose of this statement include only those which are, in accordance with law, credited to the sinking funds of the City, is shown in the following tabulation:

PART III. RECREATION BUILDINGS.

1. BONDED INDEBTEDNESS.

The dock bonds and corporate stock of the City of New York outstanding December 31, 1909, the proceeds whereof were expended for the construction, maintenance and operation of the recreation building upon piers, under the jurisdiction of the Department of Docks and Ferries, amounted to \$2,558,429.45. Of this amount \$812,418.14 was represented by disbursements for investment in the construction of the buildings on City piers used for recreation purposes.

The amount of bonded indebtedness for recreation buildings outstanding December 31, 1911, the proceeds whereof were used for construction and maintenance and operation, was \$2,558,634.11. On December 31, 1911, the amount of outstanding bonds, the proceeds whereof had been expended for investment in the construction of recreation buildings, was \$812,622.80.

2 & 3. CONTRACT AND LAND LIABILITY.

There were no contract or land liabilities for recreation buildings outstanding December 31, 1909, but on December 31, 1911, there was outstanding the following contract, viz.: No. 31530, dated November 9, 1911, with S. F. Hayward & Co., for furnishing and installing additional fire appliances on recreation piers in the Boroughs of Manhattan and Brooklyn, under which the outstanding liability was \$1,297.

4. TERMS OF AGREEMENTS AND CONTRACTS.

The only contracts or agreements in existence between the City and any person, firm or corporation in connection with the recreation buildings are permits issued by the Commissioner of Docks for the sale of milk and other refreshments. These permits are included in the schedule (marked C) appended to this report.

5. GROSS REVENUES RECEIVED BY THE CITY.

There are no revenues received by the City through the maintenance and operation of recreation buildings in the sense that revenues are sought to be used in this connection. The amounts paid by holders of permits for the sale of milk and other refreshments, which are merely nominal, have been included among the revenues of the docks, as herein previously given.

6. INTEREST PAID AND TO BE PAID ON BONDED INDEBTEDNESS.

The annual interest paid and to be paid by

in the bonded indebtedness, the sum of \$3,000 should be added to the amount stated, making the total yearly interest \$3,000,460.37.

The annual interest paid and to be paid on \$72,975,008.58, that being the proportion of the bonded indebtedness outstanding December 31, 1909, represented by disbursements for investment account in property and construction, amounts to \$2,615,014.07. Adding \$3,000 for interest on the \$100,000 corporate stock issued for the Wallabout improvement, all of which was expended for construction, the amount would be \$2,618,014.07.

The annual interest paid and to be paid by the City on corporate stock issued for dock purposes during the years 1910 and 1911 amounts to \$344,319.55, and the interest paid on \$1,383,000 of dock bonds redeemed during the years 1910 and 1911 amounted to \$62,430.

The annual interest on the bonded indebtedness of the City for dock purposes, as existing December 31, 1911, was \$3,279,349.92. With \$3,000 added for interest on corporate stock issued for the Wallabout improvement, the total would be \$3,282,349.92.

The annual interest paid and to be paid on \$80,174,563.66, that being the proportion of the bonded indebtedness outstanding December 31, 1911, represented by disbursements for investment account in property and construction, amounts to \$2,904,869.07. Adding \$3,000 for interest on the \$100,000 corporate stock issued for the Wallabout improvement, the amount would be \$2,907,869.07.

7. Annual Installments Necessary for Amortization of Indebtedness.

The annual installments necessary for the amortization of the \$83,647,617.27 of bonds and corporate stock for dock purposes outstanding December 31, 1909, amounted to \$1,212,480.14. Adding to this amount \$2,101.92 necessary for the amortization of the \$100,000 of corporate stock issued for the Wallabout improvement, would make the total \$1,214,582.06.

The annual installments necessary for the amortization of the \$72,975,008.58 of bonded indebtedness outstanding December 31, 1909, represented by investment account in payments for property and construction, amounts to \$1,057,779.67. Adding \$2,101.92 necessary for the amortization of the \$100,000 corporate stock issued for the Wallabout improvement, would make the total \$1,059,881.59.

The annual installments necessary for the amortization of the \$8,406,097.96 corporate stock issued for dock purposes during the years 1910 and 1911 amounts to \$75,727.70, and the installments necessary for the amortization of the \$1,383,000 bonds redeemed during 1910 and 1911 was \$28,862.

The annual installments necessary for the amortization of \$90,670,715.23, the total of bonds and corporate stock issued by the City for dock purposes remaining unredeemed and outstanding December 31, 1911, was \$1,259,345.84. With \$2,101.92 added for the \$100,000 corporate stock issued for the Wallabout improvement the total would be \$1,261,447.76.

The annual installments necessary for the amortization of \$80,174,563.66 of bonded indebtedness outstanding December 31, 1911, represented by investment account in payments for property and construction, amounts to \$1,108,327.88. Adding \$2,101.92 necessary for the amortization of the \$100,000 corporate stock issued for the Wallabout improvement would make the total \$1,110,429.80.

8. Current Net Revenues Received by the City.

The yearly current net revenues received by the City from all dock properties other than recreation buildings, municipal ferries and the Roosevelt street-Broadway ferry, as of December 31, 1911, amounted to \$3,675,352.77, this figure representing yearly gross revenues of \$4,563,459.65, as herein previously shown in detail, less expenses of operation and maintenance and depreciation in the value of the floating plant used in connection with docks for the year 1911 aggregating \$888,106.88.

PART III. RECREATION BUILDINGS.

1. BONDED INDEBTEDNESS.

The City on \$2,558,429.45, the total amount of dock bonds and corporate stock issued for recreation buildings and the maintenance and operation thereof, still unredeemed and outstanding December 31, 1909, was \$90,662.71.

The annual interest paid and to be paid on \$812,418.14, that being the proportion of the bonded indebtedness outstanding December 31, 1909, represented by disbursements for investment account, amounts to \$28,789.55.

The annual interest on \$2,558,634.11, the bonded indebtedness of the City for recreation buildings and the maintenance and operation thereof, as existing December 31, 1911, was \$90,670.98. The annual interest on \$812,622.80, the proportion of the indebtedness outstanding December 31, 1911, represented by disbursements for investment account, amounts to \$28,797.82.

7. ANNUAL INSTALLMENTS NECESSARY FOR AMORTIZATION OF INDEBTEDNESS.

The annual installments necessary for the amortization of \$2,558,429.45 of bonds and corporate stock for recreation buildings and the maintenance and operation thereof, unredeemed and outstanding December 31, 1909, amounted to \$35,844.26.

The annual installments necessary for the amortization of the \$812,418.14 of bonded indebtedness outstanding December 31, 1909, represented by investment account, amounts to \$11,382.19.

8. CURRENT NET REVENUES RECEIVED BY THE CITY.

There are no net revenues received by the City resulting from the maintenance and operation of the recreation buildings. In 1911, the cost of maintenance and operation amounted to \$183,498.16, and as the revenues therefrom were merely nominal, the cost of operation is virtually a deficiency.

MUNICIPAL FERRY PURPOSES.
1. BONDED INDEBTEDNESS.

The corporate stock of The City of New York outstanding December 31, 1909, the proceeds whereof were expended for all purposes of the municipal ferries, amounted to \$15,341,923.80. Of this amount \$9,357,191.06 was represented in expenditures for property and construction or investment account.

The corporate stock outstanding December 31, 1911, the proceeds whereof were used for all purposes of the municipal ferries, amounted to \$16,101,419.63. Of this amount \$10,116,686.89 was represented by disbursements on investment account.

The outstanding liabilities for contracts on account of municipal ferries, chargeable to corporate stock funds on December 31, 1909 amounted to \$344,656.25. Following is a schedule showing the details of this amount, also the amounts paid thereon from the proceeds of corporate stock during 1910 and 1911, viz., \$305,766.53, and the amount thereof undischarged December 31, 1911, viz., \$38,889.72.

Appended to this statement (marked Schedule E) are copies of the rate cards of the Department of Docks and Ferries in force on this date, showing the charges made for the transportation of passengers, horses and vehicles on the City's ferries, as well as a complete list (marked Schedule F) of the outstanding privileges granted by the Commissioner of Docks for the sale of merchandise and for other business concessions on the boats and in the terminals of the municipal ferries.

5. GROSS REVENUES RECEIVED BY THE CITY.

The gross revenues from municipal ferries during the year 1911 amounted to \$987,064.62.

The annual interest paid and to be paid by the City on \$15,341,923.80, the total amount of corporate stock issued for municipal ferry purposes still unredeemed and outstanding December 31, 1909, was \$604,027.13.

The annual interest paid and to be paid on \$9,357,191.06, that being the proportion of bonded indebtedness outstanding December 31, 1909, represented by disbursements for investment account in terminals, ferry boats and other property, amounts to \$368,402.13.

The annual interest on \$16,101,419.63, the bonded indebtedness of the City for municipal ferry purposes, as existing December 31, 1911, was \$634,945.24.

The annual interest paid and to be paid on \$10,116,686.89, that being the proportion of the bonded indebtedness outstanding December 31, 1911, represented by disbursements for investment account, amounts to \$399,320.22.

7. ANNUAL INSTALLMENTS NECESSARY FOR AMORTIZATION OF INDEBTEDNESS.

The annual installments necessary for the amortization of the \$15,341,923.80 corporate stock for municipal ferry purposes outstanding December 31, 1909, amounted to \$155,096.73.

The annual installments necessary for the amortization of the \$9,357,191.06 of bonded indebtedness outstanding December 31, 1909, represented by investment account, amounts to \$94,595.03.

The annual installments necessary for the amortization of \$16,101,419.63 corporate stock outstanding December 31, 1911, the proceeds whereof were used for purposes of the municipal ferries, amounted to \$161,932.89.

The annual installments necessary for the amortization of the \$10,116,686.89 of bonded indebtedness outstanding December 31, 1911, represented by investment account, amounts to \$101,431.19.

8. CURRENT NET REVENUE RECEIVED BY THE CITY.

There are no yearly current net revenues received by the City from the operation of municipal ferries, inasmuch as the expenses of maintenance and operation exceed the gross revenues. In 1911 the gross revenues were \$987,064.62, and the expenses of maintenance and operation \$1,648,099.52, the deficiency for the year being \$661,034.90.

PART V.

ROOSEVELT STREET-BROADWAY FERRY.

1. BONDED INDEBTEDNESS.
There was no corporate stock of The City of New York outstanding December 31, 1909, the proceeds whereof were expended for the construction of the terminals at Roosevelt street, Manhattan and Broadway, Brooklyn, of the Roosevelt Street-Broadway Ferry.

The amount of bonded indebtedness for the Roosevelt Street-Broadway Ferry, outstanding December 31, 1911, the proceeds whereof were used for construction of terminals, etc., was \$130,494.17.

2. CONTRACT LIABILITY.
There were no contract liabilities for the construction of terminals, etc., of this ferry outstanding December 31, 1909, on December 31, 1911.

3. LAND LIABILITY.

There were no land liabilities for this ferry outstanding December 31, 1909, but on December 31, 1911, there was an outstanding liability for property in course of condemnation for the Broadway, Brooklyn, terminal as follows: Ferry property at or near foot of Broadway, Borough of Brooklyn. Title vested

September 16, 1910. Estimated principal, \$305,000; interest, \$23,637.50; making a total of \$328,637.50.

4. TERMS OF AGREEMENTS AND CONTRACTS.

This ferry began operating on March 16, 1911, under a lease granted by The City of New York to the Brooklyn-Manhattan Ferry Company.

Under the terms of this lease the City agreed to furnish terminal facilities at the foot of Roosevelt street, Manhattan, and of Broadway, Brooklyn. The Company agreed to operate the ferry daily except Sundays and holidays, every 20 minutes from 5 a. m. to 9 p. m. and to furnish all needed ferry boats, licensed and approved by the Federal Government.

One-half of the expense of boats and the maintenance repairs and dredging of terminals is to be paid by the Company, and one-half by the City. The one-half which the City will be called upon to pay is fixed at \$11,000 per month, payable at the end of each month.

The net profits from the operation of this ferry, to be ascertained by deducting the total expenses of maintenance, operation and management from the gross receipts, which shall include the total moneys received by the Company for the transportation of vehicles, passengers, horses, cattle, merchandise, goods, effects and things over said ferry, and also the \$11,000 to be paid by the City monthly, shall be divided equally between the Company and the City. Such net profits shall be computed at the end of each year.

5. GROSS REVENUE RECEIVED BY THE CITY.

The gross revenue received from this ferry for the nine and one-half months period, from March 16, 1911, to December 31, 1911, was \$19,175.42.

6. INTEREST PAID AND TO BE PAID ON BONDED INDEBTEDNESS.

There was no annual interest paid or to be paid on corporate stock issued for this ferry outstanding December 31, 1909.

The annual interest to be paid on \$130,494.17, that being the amount of bonded indebtedness outstanding December 31, 1911, all of which was represented by disbursements for investment account, amounts to \$4,637.33.

7. ANNUAL INSTALLMENTS NECESSARY FOR AMORTIZATION OF INDEBTEDNESS.

There were no annual installments necessary for the amortization of corporate stock issued for his ferry outstanding December 31, 1909.

The annual installments necessary for the amortization of \$130,494.17, that being the amount of bonded indebtedness outstanding December 31, 1911, all of which was represented by disbursements for investment account, amounts to \$1,203.43.

8. CURRENT NET REVENUE RECEIVED BY THE CITY.

There was no yearly current net revenue received by the City from the operation of this ferry for the first period (nine and one-half months) of its operation, inasmuch as the subtraction allowance exceeded the City's half share of the net profits, the former amounting to \$104,500, and the latter to \$19,175.42, the deficiency for this period being \$85,324.58.

Legal Wharfrage Rates, City of New York (promulgated by the Commissioner of Docks, November, 1908, and now in force).

Regular Wharfrage—2 cents per ton up to 200 tons, and one-half cent per ton for any excess over 200 tons. If vessel occupies an outside berth, and is not working cargo or ballast, one-half of this rate.

Floating Grain Elevators—Half rates.

Floating Structures—Not otherwise provided for, double rates.

State Traffic.

North River Barges, Market Boats and Barges—Sloops employed upon the rivers and waters of the State, and schooners employed exclusively upon the rivers and waters of the State, as follows: Under 50 tons, 50 cents; 50 tons, and under 100 tons, 62½ cents; 100 tons, and under 150 tons, 75 cents; 150 tons, and under 200 tons, 87½ cents; 200 tons, and under 250 tons, \$1; 250 tons, and under 300 tons, \$1.12½; 300 tons, and under 350 tons, \$1.25; 350 tons, and under 400 tons, \$1.37½; 400 tons, and under 450 tons, \$1.50; 450 tons, and under 500 tons, \$1.62½; 500 tons, and under 550 tons, \$1.75; 550 tons, and under 600 tons, \$1.87½; For 600 tons and upwards, 12½ cents per 50 tons in excess of last rate.

Canal Boats—Per diem, 50 cents loaded, 30 cents unloaded. (It is understood that a "canal boat" is a vessel built for navigating the canals of the State, measuring not more than 98 feet in length, nor more than 18 feet in width, and whose registered net tonnage does not exceed 150 tons.)

Vessels freighting brick upon the Hudson river, same rate. Scows or barges freighting gravel, broken stone, cement or sand upon the rivers and waters of the State, 50 cents per day.

Clam and Oyster Vessels—Under 200 tons, 1½ cents per ton for an inside berth and 1 cent per ton for an outside berth, but no vessel to pay less than 25 cents per day, nor for less than one day.

Lighters and Barges engaged in lightering freight in Harbor of New York, 1 cent per running foot.

Coal Hoists on Scows or Floats, with Coal Hooper, etc., \$1 per day.

Canal boats (as described above) engaged in transporting coal in the Harbor, 30 cents per diem, loaded; 30 cents unloaded; all other boats transporting coal, one cent per running foot loaded or unloaded.

Twenty-four hours from the time of day or night when a boat reaches a pier or slip constitute a day for all vessels. A fraction of a day counts as one day, and vessels remaining any fraction over twenty-four hours pay for another day.

Top wharfrage on merchandise, 5 cents per ton. (Accrues after the expiration of 24 hours from time of landing.)

Payment of Wharfrage.

Dock Masters must collect in cash any and all wharfrage daily, except in cases where a credit account has been opened by consent of the Commissioner. Payment for wharfrage by those having credit accounts must be made direct to the Cashier of the Department within ten days after receipt of bill.

NOTICE TO BIDDERS AT SALES OF OLD BUILDINGS, ETC.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS UNDER WHICH BUILDINGS, ETC., WILL BE SOLD FOR REMOVAL FROM CITY PROPERTY.

THE BUILDINGS AND APPURTENANCES thereto will be sold to the highest bidder, who must pay cash or certified check, drawn to the order of the Comptroller of The City of New York, and must also give a certified check or cash in half the amount of the purchase price as security for the faithful performance of the terms and conditions of the sale. Where the amount of the purchase price does not equal or exceed the sum of \$50, the sum of \$50 shall be the amount of the security to be deposited. This security may at any time after the expiration of the contract period be applied by the City to the cost of completing any of the work required under the contract, but unfinished at the expiration of the contract period.

The purchaser shall not lease, occupy, cause or permit the building or buildings, etc., purchased by him to be used or occupied for any purpose other than that of their speedy removal, nor shall he collect any rental or other revenue for the use of either the land or the buildings, etc., situated thereon. The breach of either or any of these conditions shall forthwith void the sale and cause immediate forfeiture of the purchase money and the security deposited for the faithful performance of the conditions of the sale. The placing therein or permitting the occupancy of any such building by any tenant free, for rent or otherwise, excepting the necessary watchmen or the workmen engaged in the actual demolition thereof, shall of itself be a breach of the above conditions of sale.

The sale will be as of the condition of the property on date of delivery thereof to the purchaser. The City of New York will not be responsible for any change or loss which may occur in the condition of the buildings, or their appurtenances between the time of the sale thereof and the time of delivering possession to the purchaser, after being properly vacated of all tenants. The sale and delivery to purchaser will be made as nearly together as the circumstance of vacating the structures of their tenants will permit.

All the material of the buildings, sheds, walks, structures and cellars of whatsoever nature, with their exterior and interior fixtures, appurtenances and foundations of all kinds, except the exterior walls of the buildings and their foundations and the sidewalks and curb in front of said buildings, extending within the described area shall be torn down and removed from the premises. None of the dirt, debris or waste resulting from demolition shall be allowed to remain on the premises, except old mortar or plaster only, which may be left, but not higher at any point than two feet below the curb opposite that point. The exterior walls and their foundations shall be taken down only to a plane whose elevation shall be the level of the curb in front of the building. Where there is no curb the elevation of the surrounding ground shall be considered curb level. All wells, cesspools, sinks, etc., existing on the property must be filled to the level of the surrounding ground with clean earth.

The purchaser at the sale shall also withdraw and remove all abandoned water taps and old service mains, and in place thereof cause to be inserted a brass plug in the main water pipe in the street, in compliance with the rules and regulations of the Department of Water Supply, Gas and Electricity, and furnish the Department of Finance with a certificate from the Department of Water Supply, Gas and Electricity that this has been performed.

The purchaser at the sale shall also remove all house sewer connections to the main sewer in the street, and the opening of the main sewer in street shall be properly closed in compliance with the directions of the Bureau of Sewers in the Borough in which the buildings are situated, and furnish the Department of Finance with a

certificate from the Bureau of Sewers that the work has been properly performed.

The permit for all opening in the street to be obtained by and at the expense of the purchaser of the building.

Failure to remove said buildings, appurtenances, or any part thereof, within thirty days from the day of possession will work forfeiture of ownership of such buildings, appurtenances or portion as shall then be left standing, together with all moneys paid by said purchaser on account thereof at the time of the sale, and the bidder's assent to the above conditions being understood to be implied by the act of bidding and The City of New York will, without notice to the purchaser, cause the same to be removed and the cost and expense thereof charged against the security above mentioned.

The work of removal must be carried on in every respect in a thorough and workmanlike manner, and must be completed within thirty days from the day of possession, and the successful bidder will provide and furnish all materials of labor and machinery necessary thereto, and will place proper and sufficient guards and fences and warning signs by day and night for the prevention of accidents, and will indemnify and save harmless The City of New York, its officers, agents and servants, and each of them, against any and all suits and actions, claims and demands of every name and description brought against it, them or any of them, and against and from all damage and costs to which it, they or any of them be put by reason of injury to the person or property of another, resulting from negligence or carelessness in the performance of the work, or in guarding the same, or from any improper or defective materials or machinery, implements or appliances used in the removal of said buildings.

Where party walls are found to exist between buildings purchased by different bidders, the materials of said party walls shall be understood to be equally divided between the separate purchasers.

Party walls and fences, when existing against adjacent property not sold, shall not be taken down. All furrings, plaster, chimneys, projecting brick, etc., on the faces of such party walls are to be taken down and removed. The walls shall be made permanently self-supporting, beam-holes, etc., bricked up, and the wall pointed and made to exclude wind and rain and present a clean exterior. The roofs and adjacent buildings shall be properly flashed and painted and made watertight where they have been disturbed by the operations of the contractor.

The Comptroller of The City of New York reserves the right on the day of sale to withdraw from sale any of the buildings, parts of buildings and machinery included therein, or to reject any and all bids, and it is further

Resolved, That, while the said sale is held under the supervision of the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, the Comptroller is authorized to cause the sale to be advertised and to direct the sale thereof as financial officer of the City.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS.

The person or persons making a bid or estimate for any services, work, materials or supplies for The City of New York, or for any of its departments, bureaus or offices, shall furnish the same in a sealed envelope, indorsed with the title of the supplies, materials, work or services for which the bid or estimate is made, with his or their name or names and the date of presentation to the President or Board or to the head of the Department at his or its office, on or before the date and hour named in the advertisement for the same, at which time and place the estimates received will be publicly opened by the President or Board or head of said Department and read, and the award of the contract made according to law as soon thereafter as practicable.

Each bid or estimate shall contain the name and place of residence of the person making the same, and names of all persons interested with him therein, and, if no other person be so interested, it shall distinctly state that fact; also, that it is made without any connection with any other person making an estimate for the same purpose, and is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud, and that no member of the Board of Aldermen, head of a department, chief of a bureau, deputy thereof, or clerk therein, or other officer of The City of New York is, shall be or become interested, directly or indirectly, as contracting party, partner, stockholder, surety or otherwise in or in the performance of the contract, or in the supplies, work or business to which it relates, or in any portion of the profits thereof. The bid or estimate must be verified by the oath, in writing, of the party or parties making the estimate that the several matters stated herein are in all respects true.

Each bid or estimate shall be accompanied by the consent, in writing, of two householders or freeholders in The City of New York, or of a guaranty or surety company duly authorized by law to act as surety, and shall contain the matters set forth in the blank forms mentioned below.

No bid or estimate will be considered unless, as a condition precedent to the reception or consideration of any proposal, it be accompanied by a certified check upon one of the State or National banks of The City of New York, drawn to the order of the Comptroller, or money or corporate stock or certificates of indebtedness of any nature issued by The City of New York, which the Comptroller shall approve as of equal value with the security required in the advertisement, to the amount of not less than three nor more than five per centum of the amount of the bond required, as provided in section 420 of the Greater New York Charter.

The certified check or money should not be inclosed in the envelope containing the bid or estimate, but should be either inclosed in a separate envelope addressed to the head of the Department, President or Board, or submitted personally upon the presentation of the bid or estimate.

For particulars as to the quantity and quality of the supplies, or the nature and extent of the work, reference must be made to the specifications, schedules, plans, etc., on file in the said office of the President, Board or Department.

No bid shall be accepted from or contract awarded to any person who is in arrears to The City of New York upon debt or contract, or who is a defaulter, as surety or otherwise, upon any obligation to the City.

The contract must be bid for separately. The right is reserved in each case to reject all bids or estimates if it is deemed to be for the interest of the City so to do.

Bidders will write out the amount of their bids or estimates in addition to inserting the same in figures.

Bidders are requested to make their bids or estimates upon the blank forms prepared and furnished by the City, a copy of which, with the proper envelope in which to inclose the bid, together with a copy of the contract, including the specifications, in the form approved by the Corporation Counsel, can be obtained upon application therefor at the office of the Department for which the work is to be done. Plans and drawings of construction work may also be seen there.
