Resolution Adopted.

WHEREAS, THERE HAS BEEN SUBMITTED to this Commission by the Division of Factory Inspection the following appeals from orders issued by the said Division of Factory Inspection, the granting of which would constitute a variation of law, and

Whereas, there has also been submitted to this Commission the recommendations made by the Division of Factory Inspection, after inspection had been made and investigation had been made of the premises noted below, with respect to the appeals of the following appellants:

Premises, (1) Amsterdam, Livingston st., (Building 2); appellant, A. V. Morris & Sons, 14—Provide two legal exits from 3rd floor remote from each other. Three- and one-story nonfireproof building, erected before Oct. 1, 1913; open lofts; sprinkler with one source of water supply; combustibles carried; no fire alarm system; occupancy of building 29; 23 above the 1st floor, one or two occasionally above the 2d floor; exit, one wooden stairway, doors to which open out but are not self-closing; imperfect fire escape on front of one-story building; openings to balconies fireproof; openings 7 feet high by 29 inches wide; no egress from roof of three-story section; imperfect horizontal exit on 2d floor leading to roof of one-story building.

Recommendation: Accept iron balcony and stairs properly handrailing, constructed at 3d floor, on west, side of building; third window from northerly end and leading to one-story concrete roof; railing to be built along west edge of one-story roof from balcony of drop stairs back at least 10 feet from front of one-story roof; also steps to be provided leading to window on 3d floor, giving access to balcony and stairway, said steps to have hand rail each side; exit sign to be placed over 2d floor window; same to be nonfireproof.

Cruden & Son, 2—Additional exit. 3—Make roof fireproof. 4—Prohibit occupancy. 5—Exit stairs to 44 inches wide. 6—Enclose elevator shaft, 7—Elevator enclosure 3 feet above floor. 8—Bottom of elevator pit fireproof. 9—Guard projecting ledges of elevator shaft. 10—Gratings under sheaves. 11—Make and file elevator report. 12—Sign on elevator indicating safe load. 13—Buffers in elevator pit. 16—Enclose exit stairs fireproof.

Two-story nonfireproof building erected since Oct. 1, 1913; open lofts; no sprinklers; no combustibles; no fire alarm; one on 2d floor; exit, one interior stairway not properly enclosed, doors to which slide but are not self-closing; other openings not fire resisting; no egress from roof; one girl employed on 2d floor assorting trash; one man employed on 1st floor; two proprietors; 4 people in building. There is also a shed with a flat roof leading to 2d floor window, from which there is a stairway to ground some 60 feet away. Building measures 33 feet by 40 feet inside.

Recommendation: There being less than six people in the building, waive orders 2, 4, 5 and 6. Accept as compliant with orders 6, 7 and 8 enclosure of elevator with fireproof material on ground floor and an enclosure on 2d floor to a height of 6 feet. Orders 9, 10, 11, 12, 13 to be complied with. Order 3 to make roof combustible material to be waived. Should occupancy be increased to more than five people, additional exit to be provided, viz.: install at end of building where shed now stands a nonfireproof stairway enclosed with fire-resistant partitions, in accordance with Rule 504 of the Industrial Code, said enclosure to extend to the underside of the roof, all openings to be provided with approved self-closing fire doors opening outwardly so as not to obstruct the stairway, and present stairway also to be enclosed with fire-resistant partitions, as per Rule 504, to underside of roof and openings to be provided with self-closing fire doors opening outwardly so as not to obstruct the passageway.

Premises, (11) Volney, Battle Island; appellant, Arrowhead Mills, Inc., 4—Prohibit occupancy in Digestor Room. One-, two- and five-story nonfireproof factory building; open lofts; sprinkler; combustibles; no fire alarm; 3 above 2d floor; exits, one unenclosed interior stairway; doors open out, but are not self-closing; no egress from roof; imperfect fire escape on side; openings to balconies not fireproof.

Premises, (4) Geneva, Exchange st.; appellant, Allegretti Mfg. Co., 3—Extend stair enclosure to 3 feet above the roof and construct roof of enclosure of fireproof material. Two-story nonfireproof building erected since October 1, 1913; open lofts; no sprinklers; no fire alarm; combustibles carried; no fire alarm; open lofts; 3 above 2d floor; exits, one unenclosed interior stairway; doors open out, but are not self-closing; no egress from roof; imperfect fire escape on side; openings to balconies not fireproof; size, 6 feet high by 4 feet wide; exits remote.

Premises, (12) Utica, 905 Columbia st.; appellant, Associated Manufacturers and Merchants Association, 4—Proper dressing room for females. Females hang their clothes on hooks or nails on walls of posts where they work; 54 females employed; present dressing room measure 6 feet by 7 feet.

Recommendation: Acceptance of present dressing room if fully equipped; emergency room to be provided and lockers also provided for employees' clothes.

Premises, (13) Barker, N. Y.; appellant, Springville Canning Co., 1—Prohibit occupancy. 2—Additional exit. Three-story nonfireproof building; open lofts; no sprinkler; no combustibles; no fire alarm; occupancy of building varies; on date of visit there were 4 above the 1st floor, 2 above the 2d floor; exit, one interior stairway. 

thence westwardly and parallel with Newport street and the prolongation thereof to the intersection with a line distant 100 feet southeasterly from and parallel with the southeasterly line of Linden avenue, the said distance being measured at right angles to Linden avenue; thence southwardly and always distant 100 feet southeasterly from Linden avenue to the intersection with a line midway between East 91st street and East 92nd street; thence northwardly along the said line midway between East 91st street and East 92nd street to the intersection with a line midway between Lenox road and Linden avenue; thence southwardly along a line always midway between Lenox road and Linden avenue to the intersection with a line midway between Utica avenue and East 49th street; thence northwardly along the said line midway between Utica avenue and East 49th street to the intersection with a line midway between Clarkson avenue and Lenox road; thence westwardly along the said line midway between Clarkson avenue and Lenox road to the intersection with a line midway between Schenectady avenue and East 46th street; thence northwardly along the said line midway between Schenectady avenue and East 46th street to the intersection with a line midway between Clarkson avenue and Winthrop street; thence westwardly along the said line midway between Clarkson avenue and Winthrop street to the intersection with the prolongation of a line midway between Troy avenue and Albany avenue, as these streets are laid out immediately north of Winthrop street; thence northwardly along the said line midway between Troy avenue and Albany avenue and along the prolongation of the said line to the intersection with a line midway between Rutland road and Fenimore street; thence westwardly along the said line midway between Rutland road and Fenimore street to the intersection with a line midway between Albany avenue and Kingston avenue; thence northwardly along the said line midway between Albany avenue and Kingston avenue to the intersection with a line midway between Albany avenue and Lenox road; thence westwardly along the said line midway between Albany avenue and Lenox road to the intersection with a line midway between East New York avenue and Lefferts avenue; thence westwardly along the said line midway between East New York avenue and Lefferts avenue to the intersection with a line midway between Albany avenue and Kingston avenue; thence northwardly and always distant 100 feet westerly from and parallel with the westerly line of Kingston avenue to the point of place of beginning.

Third: That The City of New York and all other parties interested in such proceeding, or in

any of the real property affected thereby, having any objections thereto, shall file such objections in writing, duly verified, in the manner required by law for the verification of pleadings in an action, setting forth the real property owned by the objector, and his post office address, with the Clerk of the County of Kings on or before the 8th day of November, 1917, and within the same time serve on the Corporation Counsel of The City of New York, at his office, Room 83, Franklin Trust Company Building, No. 166 Montague street, Borough of Brooklyn, City of New York, a copy of such verified objections.

Fourth: That on the 9th day of November, 1917, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon of that day, or as soon thereafter as counsel can be heard, the Corporation Counsel of The City of New York will apply to the Honorable Isaac M. Kapper, Justice of the Supreme Court, signing said tentative decree, at Trial Term, Part I, held in and for the County of Kings at the Garfield Building, No. 26 Court street, in the Borough of Brooklyn, City of New York, to fix a time when said Justice will hear the parties who have filed objections to said tentative decree.

The person or persons making a bid for any service, work, materials or supplies for The City of New York, or for any of its departments, bureaus or officers, shall furnish the same in a sealed envelope, indorsed with the title of the supplier, materials, work or services for which the bid is made, with his or their name or names and the date of presentation to the President or Board or to the head of the Department at his or its office, on or before the date and hour named in the advertisement for the same, at which time and place the bids will be publicly opened by the President or Board or head of said Department and read, and the award of the contract made according to law as soon thereafter as practicable.

Each bid shall contain the name and place of residence of the person making the same, and the names of all persons interested with him therein, and, if no other person be so interested, it shall distinctly state that fact; also, that it is made without any connection with any other person making a bid for the same purpose, and is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud, and that no member of the Board of Aldermen, head of a department, chief of a bureau, deputy thereof, or clerk therein, or other officer or employee of The City of New York, shall be or become interested, directly or indirectly, as contracting party, partner, stockholder, surety or otherwise in or in the performance of the contract, or in the supplies, work or business to which it relates, or in any portion of the profits thereof. The bid must be verified by the oath, in writing, or the party or parties making the bid, that the several matters stated therein are all respects true.

The sale will be as of the condition of the property on date of delivery thereof to the purchaser. The City of New York will not be responsible for any change or loss which may occur in the condition of the buildings, or their appurtenances, between the time of the sale thereof and the time of delivering possession to the purchaser, after being properly vacated of all tenants. The sale and delivery to purchaser will be made as nearly together as the circumstances of vacating the structures of their tenants will permit.

All the material of buildings, sheds, walks, structures and cellars of whatsoever nature, with their exterior and interior fixtures, appurtenances and foundations of all kinds, except the exterior walls of the buildings and their foundations, and the sidewalk and curb in front of said buildings, extending within the described area, shall be torn down and removed from the premises. None of the dirt, debris or waste resulting from demolition shall be allowed to remain on the premises, except old mortar or plaster only, which may be left, but not higher at any point than two feet below the curb opposite that point.
