STATE INDUSTRIAL COMMISSION—DEPARTMENT OF LABOR.

Resolution Adopted.

WHEREAS, THERE HAS BEEN SUBMITTED
to this Commission by the Division of Factory Inspection the following appeals from orders issued by the said Division of Factory Inspection, the granting of which would constitute a variation of law, and

Whereas, there has also been submitted to this Commission the recommendations made by the Division of Factory Inspection, after reinspection had been made and investigation had of the premises noted below, with respect to the appeals of the following appellants:

Premises, (1) Amsterdam, Livingston st. (Building 2); appellant, A. V. Morris & Sons. 14—Provide two legal exits from 3rd floor remote from each other. Three and one-story nonfireproof building, erected before Oct. 1, 1913; open lofts; sprinkler with one source of water supply; combustibles carried; no fire alarm system; occupancy of building, 29; 23 above the first floor, one or two occasionally above the 2d floor; exit, one wooden stairway, doors to which open out but are not self-closing; imperfect fire escape on front of one-story building; openings to balconies fireproof; openings 7 feet high by 29 inches wide; no egress from roof of three-story section; imperfect horizontal exit on 2d floor leading to roof of one-story building.

Recommendation: Accept iron balcony and stairs properly handrailed, constructed at 3d floor, on west side of building; third window from northerly end and leading to one-story concrete roof; railing to be built along west edge of one-story roof from balcony of drop stairs back at least 10 feet from front of one-story roof; also steps to be provided leading to window on 3d floor, giving access to balcony and stairway, said steps to have hand rail each side; exit sign to be placed over 2d floor window; same to be nonfireproof.

Premises, (2) Buffalo, 462 Jefferson st.; appellant, A. Criden & Son. 2—Additional exit. 3—Make roof fireproof. 4—Prohibit occupancy. 5—Exit stairs to 44 inches wide. 6—Enclose elevator shaft. 7—Elevator enclosure 3 feet above roof. 8—Bottom of elevator pit fireproof. 9—Guard projecting ledges of elevator shaft. 10—Gratings under sheaves. 11—Make and file elevator report. 12—Sign on elevator indicating safe load. 13—Buffers in elevator pit. 16—Enclose exit stairs fireproof.

Two-story nonfireproof building erected since Oct. 1, 1913; open lofts; no sprinklers; no combustibles; no fire alarm; one on 2nd floor; exit, one interior stairway, not properly enclosed, doors to which slide but are not self-closing; other openings not fire resisting; no egress from roof; one girl employed on 2d floor assorting rags; one man employed on 1st floor; two proprietors; 4 people in building. There is also a shed with a flat roof leading to 2d floor window, from which there is a stairway to ground some 60 feet away. Building measures 33 feet by 40 feet inside.

Recommendation: There being less than six people in the building, waive orders 2, 4, 5 and 16. Accept as compliant with orders 6, 7 and 8 enclosure of elevator with fireproof material on ground floor and an enclosure on 2d floor to a height of 6 feet. Orders 9, 10, 11, 12, 13 to be complied with. No. 3 to make roof incombustible material to be waived. Should occupancy be increased to more than five people, additional exit to be provided, viz.: install at end of building where shed now stands a nonfireproof stairway enclosed with fire-resisting partitions in accordance with Rule 504 of the Industrial Code, said enclosure to extend to the underside of the roof, all openings to be provided with approved self-closing fire doors opening outwardly so as not to obstruct the stairway, and present stair way also to be enclosed with fire-resisting partitions, as per Rule 504, to underside of roof and openings to be provided with self-closing fire doors opening outwardly so as not to obstruct the passageway.

Premises, (3) Buffalo, Wells & Carroll sts., 23 Wells st.; appellant, Office Toilet Supply Co. 4—Additional exit. Six-story nonfireproof fac-

tory building with open lofts; no sprinkler; no combustibles; fire alarm signal system installed; 2 fire extinguishers on each floor; proposed occupancy, 73; 49 above the 1st floor; 24 above the 2nd floor; occupancy of the 6th floor, one employee permanently, one or two occasionally; exit, one interior stairway enclosed with wood stud and lath and plaster partitions, doors to which open out, but are not self-closing; imperfect fire escape on side of building; horizontal exit in form of a bridge from 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th floors; provided with hinged self-closing doors at each end of bridge.

Recommendation: Accept as exits from this building, stairway as at present enclosed, and horizontal exits on 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th floors; from 2nd floor fire escape balcony, with counterbalanced stairway to safe landing place beneath, doors to stairway enclosure to be made self-closing.

Premises, (4) Geneva, Exchange st.; appellant, Allegretti Mfg. Co. 3—Extend stair enclosure to 3 feet above the roof and construct roof of enclosure of fireproof material. Two-story nonfireproof building erected since October 1, 1913; open lofts; no sprinklers; no fire alarm; combustibles carried; 10 in building; none above the first floor; exits, two interior stairways properly enclosed with fireproof partitions, doors to same open outwardly and are self-closing; exits remote; no egress from roof. Plans filed for building and approved February 28, 1917. Extension of stairs to roof and skylight in enclosure not required. Stair enclosure was to extend 3 feet above the roof and roof of enclosure was to be incombustible material; i. e., fireproof, 4 inches thick; manufacturing done on ground floor; second floor used for storage purposes only.

Recommendation: Accept present stairs not extending to roof and without skylight; also waive order to extend enclosure to 3 feet above roof and make roof of enclosure of fireproof material.

Premises, (5) Jamestown, 12 W. 2d st.; appellant, Journal Printing Co. 5—Additional exit. 6—Prohibit occupancy. Four- and three-story nonfireproof factory building with divided lofts; sprinkler installed; no combustibles carried; fire alarm signal system installed; occupancy above the 2d floor, 21; 3 above the 3d floor; exits, one interior stairway located in the four-story building extending from 1st to 4th floors; one interior stairway located in the three-story section, extending from 1st to 3rd floors; doors to stairway opening outwardly, and are self-closing; no egress from roof of four-story building; imperfect horizontal exit on 2d and 3d floors.

Recommendation: Accept as second means of exit from 4th floor, extending of stairway in three-story building to roof, with bulkhead at roof level, thus giving access to hinged window opening from 4th floor of four-story section.

Premises, (6) Little Falls, S. 2d st.; Mills No. 1 and No. 2; appellant, Phoenix Underwear Co.; Mr. Caffey appearing. Stills of incombustible material at horizontal exits; doors to open outwardly. Four-story nonfireproof factory building with open lofts; sprinklers; no combustibles; no fire alarm; occupancy in July, above the 2d floor of Mill No. 1, 62 males, 55 females; Mill No. 2, 29 males, 8 females; occupancy on reinspection, above the 2d floor, Mill No. 1, 88; Mill No. 2, 19 people. Mill No. 1 is "L"-shaped, the addition being three stories and main building four stories high; no openings in wall between three- and four-story portions of Mill No. 1; in southwest corner of three-story section is a tower stairway extending to roof; also a stairway leading from the roof of the three-story portion to 4th floor of four-story section; in southeast corner of four-story section is a tower stairway extending to 4th floor and continued to roof by ladder. Mill No. 2 is four stories high and is connected with four-story portion of Mill No. 1 by horizontal exits in the form of bridges, and to the three-story section of Mill No. 1 by horizontal exits in the form of bridges; there is also a tower stairway located along the southerly wall; some of the doors leading to these stairways are sliding, others opening out; no safe egress from roof. In both buildings are sliding fire doors leading to these two stairways from all floors; there are smoke doors on the tower side of the openings on the 1st and 4th floors of both tower stairways.

Recommendation: Provide smokeproof doors at openings to stairway enclosure on 2d and 3d floors of building No. 2, but waive the order as to imperfect rear fire escape with nonfireproof openings 38 by 38 inches; remote.

Premises, (7) Oswego, appellant, Oswego Milling Co.; L. Lyndon, Copy. Enclose stairways. Provide additional means of exit. Premises consist of 2 two-story buildings, a five-story building and a seven-story building; five and seven-story buildings connected by horizontal exits; horizontal exits have fire doors on one side only; two unenclosed interior stairways in seven-story building and exterior wooden stairway on five-story building; occupancy of second floor, 28; third floor, 10; 4th, 5th, 6th, 7th floors regular occupancy about 10 altogether.

Recommendation: Stairway at north end of seven-story building to be enclosed as 504-c; stairway at southeast corner of seven-story building to remain as is; stairway from 4th to 7th floors of seven-story building inside, to be enclosed with fire resisting partitions from 6th to 7th floors only; horizontal exits on 1st, 2d, 3d, 4th and 5th floors to be made to conform to Section 79-4-9, except that one fire door will be permitted on condition that doors lap top and sides of opening at least 4 inches, and that doors are self-closing. As second means of exit from five-story building, accept exterior screened stairway from grade to roof of two-story building and thence from roof of said two-story section to roof of five-story building with balcony at roof level; an opening to be made in the southerly wall of seven-story section at 6th floor leading to roof of five-story section, thus giving access to said exterior screened stairway. As an alternative to enclosing the stairway in the seven-story building from the 6th to 7th floors with fire resisting partitions, exterior screened stairway may be carried from roof of five-story section to the 7th floor of the seven-story building, thus taking in the 7th floor. Exterior screened stairway to conform to Section 79-4-10.

Premises, (8) Ogdensburg; appellant, Republican-Journal Co. 1—Drive belt of middle job press to be guarded. 3—Cease using common drinking cups. 4—Designate waterclosets for sexes. 5—Maintain red lights over exits. 7—Repair hole in flooring, 1st floor. Upon reinspection all orders complied with except No. 5. Occupancy, one man and one woman second floor, 3 men on third floor.

Recommendation: Waive order for "Red Lights over Exits" so long as occupancy above 1st floor does not exceed 5.

Premises, (9) Ogdensburg; appellant, Republic-Journal Co. 6—Prohibit occupancy. 8—Additional exit. Three-story nonfireproof building with divided lofts; no sprinkler; combustibles; no fire alarm; occupancy of 1st floor, 4 men and 1 woman; 2d floor, 1 man and 1 woman; 3d floor, 3 men; exits, one interior stairway extending to 3d floor from street, located at center of building, doors to which open outwardly but are not self-closing; no egress from roof; imperfect rear fire escape with non-fireproof openings, 38 by 38 inches; remote.

Recommendation: Accept as exit, in view of small occupancy, the balcony fire escape on rear of building, with stairs to roof of one-story extension and stair from thence to ground.

Premises, (10) Syracuse, 323 South Salina st.;

appellant, J. Henry Walters. Additional exit. Five-story nonfireproof tenant factory building with open lofts; no sprinkler; no combustibles; no fire alarm; exit, one interior unenclosed stairway, doors to which open out but are not self-closing; safe egress from roof; tenant proposes to use the 3d floor as a millinery establishment and employ 18 people.

Recommendation: Accept horizontal exit on 3d floor leading to building No. 321 South Salina st. as a second means of exit for the millinery establishment on 3d floor while not more than 18 are employed; when Code adopted in re exits from Mercantile Buildings, building to be put in compliance therewith.

Premises, (11) Volney, Battle Island; appellant, Arrowhead Mills, Inc. 42—Prohibit occupancy in Digester Room. 43—Additional exit from Digester Room. One, two- and five-story nonfireproof factory building; open lofts; sprinkler; combustibles; no fire alarm; 3 above 2d floor; exits, one unenclosed interior stairway; doors open out, but are not self-closing; no egress from roof; imperfect fire escape on side; openings to balconies not fireproof; size, 6 feet high by 4 feet wide; exits remote.

Recommendation: At 2d floor, two-story section, provide fireproof self-closing door or cast-iron window at least 2 feet by 6 feet, same to open outwardly so as not to obstruct the passageway; also on 3d floor of Digester House provide same kind of window; properly constructed runway with substantial railing over vats on top of two-story section from foot of fire escape stairs landing on roof to stairs leading from this roof; steps to be provided inside of windows from floor to sill at openings to fire escape; fire escape to be continued to 5th floor by means of double rung stationary iron ladder at least 18 inches wide.

Premises, (12) Utica, 905 Columbia st.; appellant, Associated Manufacturers and Merchants Association. 4—Proper dressing room for females. Females hang their clothes on hooks or nails on walls of posts where they work; 54 females employed; present dressing room measures 6 feet by 7 feet.

Recommendation: Acceptance of present dressing room if fully equipped; emergency room to be provided and lockers also provided for employees clothes.

Premises, (13) Barker, N. Y.; appellant, Springville Canning Co. 1—Prohibit occupancy. 2—Additional exit. Three-story nonfireproof building; open lofts; no sprinkler; no combustibles; no fire alarm; occupancy of building varies; on date of visit there were 4 above the 1st floor, 2 above the 2d floor; exit, one interior stairway. Since inspection was made, appellant had placed a ladder on outside of building accessible from 2d and 3d floors, as remote as possible from interior stairway.

Recommendation: Accept the ladder while conditions and occupancy remain unchanged.

AND it appearing that there are practical difficulties and unnecessary hardships in complying with the strict letter of the law and the rules and regulations of the Industrial Code on the premises above noted, and in granting the variations herein set forth the spirit of the law and of the rules and regulations will be carried out and public safety secured; and

It further appearing that each of the appellants has been advised that he will be given an opportunity to be heard at this time and place if he desired to appear, and such of the appellants who appeared having been heard, therefore

Be it resolved that the variations noted above be and the same hereby are granted during the period that the conditions remain as of this date.

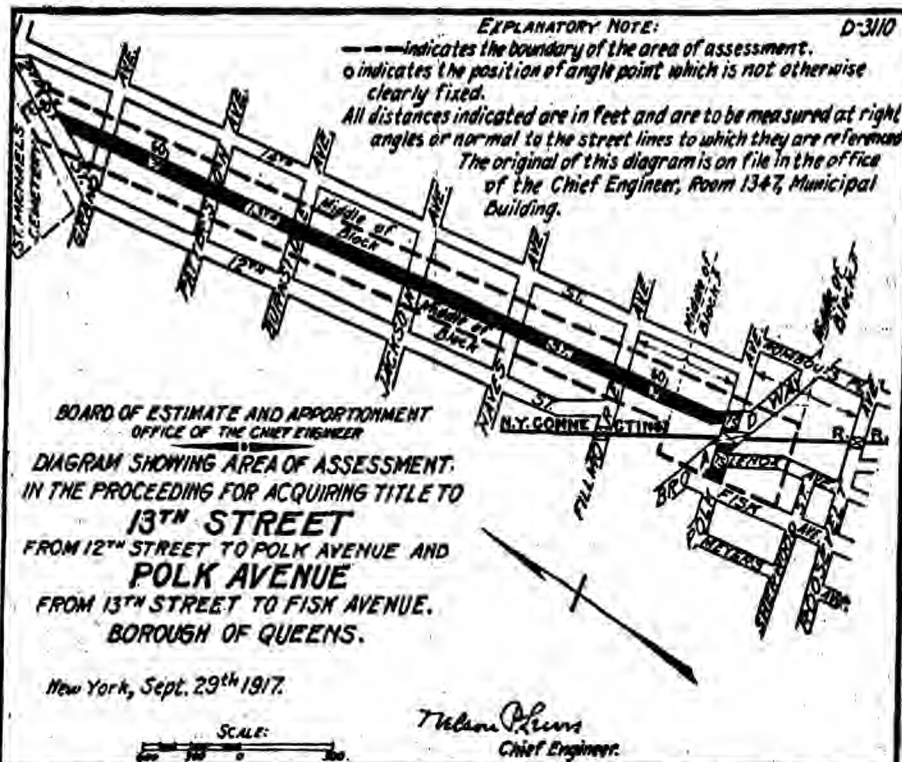

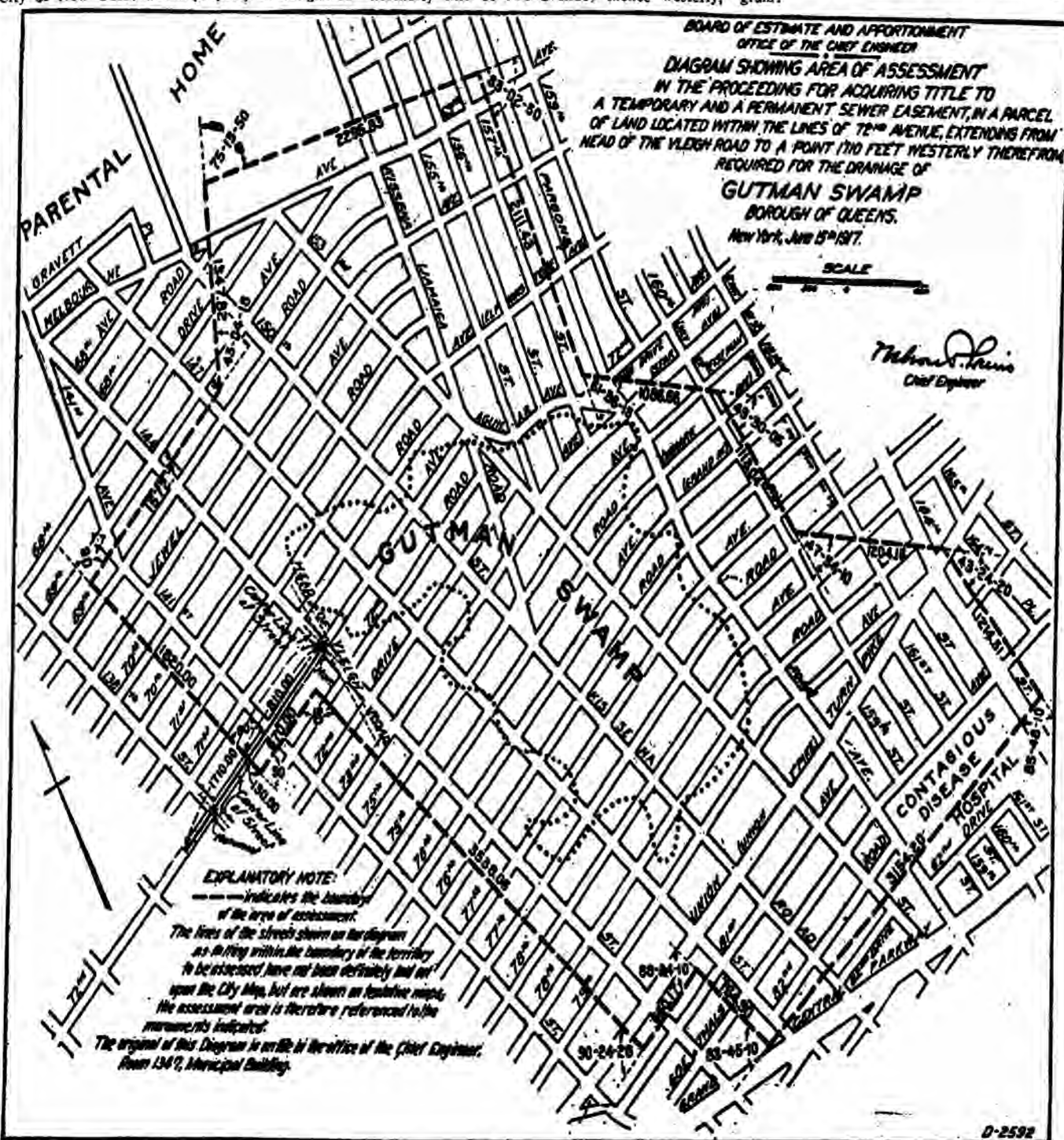

THE BUILDINGS AND APPURTENANCES thereto will be sold to the highest bidder, who must pay cash or certified check, drawn to the order of the Comptroller of The City of New York, and must also give a certified check or cash in half the amount of the purchase price as security for the faithful performance of the terms and conditions of the sale. Where the amount of the purchase price does not equal or exceed the sum of \$50, the sum of \$50 will be the amount of the security to be deposited. This security may at any time after the expiration of the contract period be applied by the City to the cost of completing any of the work required under the contract, but unfinished at the expiration of the contract period.

The purchaser shall not lease, occupy, cause or permit the building or buildings, etc., purchased by him to be used or occupied for any purpose other than that of their speedy removal, nor shall he collect any rental or other revenue for the use of either the land or the buildings, etc., situated thereon. The breach of either or any of these conditions shall forthwith void the sale and cause immediate forfeiture of the purchase money and the security deposited for the faithful performance of the conditions of the sale. Each bid shall contain the name and place of residence of the person making the same, and the names of all persons interested with him therein, and, if no other person be so interested, it shall distinctly state that fact; also, that it is made without any connection with any other person making a bid for the same purpose, and is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud, and that no member of the Board of Aldermen, head of a department, chief of a bureau, deputy thereof, or clerk therein, or other officer or employee of The City of New York is, shall be or become interested, directly or indirectly, as contracting party, partner, stockholder, surety or otherwise in or in the performance of the contract, or in the supplies, work or business to which it relates, or in any portion of the profits thereof. The bid must be verified by the oath, in writing, or the party or parties making the bid that the several matters stated therein are in all respects true.

No bid will be considered unless as a condition precedent to the reception or consideration of such bid, it be accompanied by a certified check upon one of the State or National banks or trust companies of The City of New York, or a check of such bank or trust company signed by a duly authorized officer thereof, drawn to the order of the Comptroller, or money or corporate stock or certificates of indebtedness of any nature issued by The City of New York, which the Comptroller shall approve as of equal value with the security required in the advertisement to the amount of not less than three nor more than five per centum of the amount of the bond required, as provided in section 420 of the Greater New York Charter.

All bids for supplies must be submitted in duplicate.

The certified check or money should not be inclosed in the envelope containing the bid, but should be either inclosed in a separate envelope addressed to the head of the Department, President or Board, or submitted personally upon the presentation of the bid.

For particulars as to the quantity or quality of the supplies, or the nature and extent of the work, reference must be made to the specifications, schedules, plans, etc., on file in the said office of the President, Board or Department.

No bid shall be accepted from or contract awarded to any person who is in arrears to The City of New York upon debt or contract, or who is a defaulter as surety or otherwise, upon any obligation of the City.

The contract must be bid for separately. The right is reserved in each case to reject all bids if it is deemed to be for the interest of the City so to do.

Bidders will write out the amount of their bids in addition to inserting the same in figures.

Bidders are requested to make their bid upon the blank forms prepared and furnished by the City, a copy of which, with the proper envelope in which to inclose the bid, together with a copy of the contract, including the specifications, can be obtained upon application therefor at the office of the Department for which the work is to be done or the supplies are to be furnished. Plans and drawings of construction work may be seen there.
