## NYC Department of Sanitation Announces Service Alerts for Christmas Day 2019 and New Year's Day 2020

Editor's Note: With "back-to-back" Wednesday holidays, we offer service announcements for both Christmas Day and New Year's Day, as those with Wednesday recycling collection require special guidance.

Please note that snow operations may affect collection services. It is not unusual for collection times to differ after a holiday and during the winter season.

### Christmas Day

The New York City Department of Sanitation announced that there would be **no trash, curbside compost or recycling collection, nor street cleaning** on Christmas Day, Wednesday, December 25, 2019.

- Residents who normally receive **Wednesday trash and curbside composting collection** should place their materials out at curbside after 4 p.m. on Wednesday, December 25 for collection beginning Thursday, December 26.
- Residents normally receiving **Wednesday recycling collection** should place their material out at curbside after 4 p.m. on Wednesday, January 1 for collection Thursday, January 2.

### New Year's Day

The New York City Department of Sanitation announced that there would be **no trash, curbside compost or recycling collection, nor street cleaning** on New Year's Day, Wednesday, January 1, 2020.

- Residents who normally receive **Wednesday trash and curbside composting collection** should place their materials out at curbside after 4 p.m. on Wednesday, January 1 for collection on beginning Thursday, January 2.
- Residents normally receiving **Wednesday recycling collection** should place their material out at curbside after 4 p.m. on Wednesday, January 1 for collection Thursday, January 2.

To help provide city residents with Sanitation-related service reminders, updates and special event schedules, the New York City Department of Sanitation has launched DSNY Info, its smart phone and tablet app. The app also includes tips to reduce, reuse and recycle, making it easier for New Yorkers send zero waste to landfills. The free app is available for both iOS and Android operating systems, and can be found by searching DSNY Info in the [Apple App](#) and [Google Play](#) stores.

**About the New York City Department of Sanitation**

The Department of Sanitation (DSNY) keeps New York City healthy, safe and clean by collecting, recycling and disposing of waste, cleaning streets and vacant lots, and clearing snow and ice. The Department operates 59 district garages and manages a fleet of more than 2,000 rear-loading collection trucks, 450 mechanical brooms and 705 salt spreaders. The Department clears litter, snow and ice from approximately 6,500 miles of City streets and removes debris from vacant lots as well as abandoned vehicles from City streets.
