



NY Task Force 1 US&R Team Returns



Yesterday, the New York City Emergency Management Department, New York City Fire Department and New York City Police Department welcomed back 46 members of the Urban Search and Rescue team — New York Task Force 1. The team successfully rescued three individuals, and safely evacuated 33 individuals from affected areas. Furthermore, the team diligently assessed the

damage to 465 structures, identifying potential risks and prioritizing safety measures. Their efforts extended to plotting 116 hazards, providing a comprehensive map that highlighted areas requiring immediate attention for effective mitigation of potential dangers.

"Today, we extend a heartfelt welcome home to the 46 members of New York Task Force 1, who fearlessly responded to the urgent call for assistance in Vermont's flood-stricken communities," said NYC Emergency Management Commissioner Zach Iscol. "Their selflessness, expertise, and remarkable efforts have made a profound impact on the lives of those affected by the floods."






With summer right around the corner, NYCEM wants to make sure New York stays ahead of the heat with preparedness tips that can keep you and those around you safe. We hope you find these tips helpful and encourage you all to share any useful information to your community members.

A few tips include:

- · Keep an eye on older adults, children and those that are sick or overweight as they are at greater risk from extreme heat.
- · Seek shade when outdoors.
- Stay hydrated throughout the day.
- · Utilize heating centers when needed.

Air Quality Safety Reminders

New York State Department of Environmental Conservation's projected forecast places the Air Quality Index (AQI) in New York City at a level potentially unhealthy for at risk groups, with conditions anticipated to persist for the initial part of the upcoming week.

Here are tips to keep you and your loved ones safe:

- The best way to limit exposure to poor air quality is to reduce time outside and limit strenuous activities. The threshold to take these actions, depends on your individual level of risk.
- Call 911 if you or someone you're caring for has trouble breathing.
- Monitoring air quality conditions and being prepared. Visit the EPA's air quality website <u>www.airnow.gov</u> or download the AirNow mobile app.
- When air quality is poor, wearing a high-quality mask (e.g., N95) can reduce exposure to harmful pollutants.
- The City will provide alerts if conditions deteriorate further (e.g., AQI above 200), but warnings sent by your body are equally important. New Yorkers should listen to their body. Reactions to poor air quality can include watery eyes, scratchy throat, headaches, or shortness of breath.

If you feel any of these conditions, go indoors and limit time outside.



Health Department Encourages New Yorkers to Get mpox Vaccinated

The mpox vaccine is effective at preventing mpox. Get the full two-dose series for the best protection.

The two-dose JYNNEOS vaccine is very effective at protecting against mpox, according to new data from the CDC.

- ☑ Getting vaccinated for mpox can reduce your chance of getting mpox, and it may reduce symptoms if you do get it.
- Everyone should receive two doses of the mpox vaccine, at least four weeks apart. If you never received your second dose, make sure to get it, no matter how much time has passed. Vaccines are being administered subcutaneously.
- Anyone of any sexual orientation or gender identity who is at risk for mpox can get vaccinated.



Vaccination is no cost and available regardless of immigration status.
