IN BOARD OF EXAMINERS, OCTOBER 11, 1898.

The Board of Examiners met this day at 2.15 P.M.

The roll was called, with the following result:

Present—Thomas J. Brady, Commissioner of Buildings for the Boroughs of Manhattan and The Bronz, in the chair, and Messrs. Dobbs, Moore, Bonner, McMillan, Fryer, Conover and O'Reilly,
Alsent-Mr. Post.
The minutes of October 4, 1898, were read and, on motion, approved.

Petitions were then submitted for approval, as follows:

Finn 772, New Beildings, 1898—Petition to allow the exection of a shed, same to be constructed of frame supports to carry trussed roof, all three sides of shed independent of lark walls of adjoining property to be inclosed with 2-lock angle and T non frame, same to be covered with corrugated from; side on Twenty-eighth street to be left open, frame supports exposed on this open side to be covered with corrugated from; height of shed to be 20 feet h inches, instead of 15 feet, as required, and to remove said shed, which is now at southwest corner of First avenue and Twenty-eighth street, to proposed location, in parts, all as shown on plan, and as stated in perition; northess; corner of First avenue and Twenty-eighth street.
