BOROUGH OF BROOKLYN.

LOCAL BOARD—BAY RIDGE DISTRICT.

Borough of Brooklyn, Monday, April 25, 1904.

Meeting held in Borough Hall at 2.30 P. M.

The roll was called, and the following members answered to their names:

John C. Brackenridge, Commissioner of Public Works, presiding; Alderman Malone, Fifty-first Aldermanic District; Alderman Lundy, Fifty-second Aldermanic District.

The Commissioner presented the following:

No. 65.

On motion of Alderman Malone, a petition to alter the map or plan of The City of New York by laying out as a public park the property bounded by Ninety-second street, Fourth avenue, Ninety-fourth street and Fifth avenue, was laid over indefinitely.

No. 66.

A resolution to construct a sewer in Bay Nineteenth street, between Benson and Bath avenues, was adopted by unanimous vote.

Approved by the President of the Borough April 30, 1904.

No. 67.

A resolution to regulate and grade Tenth avenue, between Seventy-ninth and Eighty-sixth streets, was adopted by unanimous vote.

Approved by the President of the Borough April 30, 1904.

No. 68.

Resolutions to regulate, grade, set or reset curb, lay sidewalks and pave gutters in Bay Fifteenth street, between Cropsey avenue and Eighty-sixth street; and to pave with macadam Bay Fifteenth street, between Cropsey avenue and Eighty-sixth street, were adopted by unanimous vote.

Approved by the President of the Borough April 30, 1904.

No. 69.

Resolutions to regulate and grade, set or reset curb, lay crosswalks and pave gutters of Bay Sixteenth street, between Cropsey avenue and Eighty-sixth street; and to pave with macadam Bay Sixteenth street, between Cropsey avenue and Eighty-sixth street; and to construct a sewer in New Utrecht avenue, between Cropsey and Bath avenues, were adopted by unanimous vote.

Approved by the President of the Borough April 30, 1904.

No. 70.

Resolutions to regulate and grade, set or reset curb, lay crosswalks and curb gutters of Bay Seventeenth street, between Cropsey avenue and Eighty-sixth street; and to pave with macadam Bay Seventeenth street, between Cropsey avenue and Eighty-sixth street, were adopted by unanimous vote.

Approved by the President of the Borough April 30, 1904.

No. 71.

Resolutions to regulate and grade, set or reset curb, lay crosswalks and pave gutters in Bay Nineteenth street, between Benson avenue and Gravesend Bay; and to pave with macadam Bay Nineteenth street, between Benson avenue and Gravesend Bay, were adopted by unanimous vote.

Approved by the President of the Borough April 30, 1904.

No. 72.

Resolutions providing for the construction of a sewer in Eighty-seventh street, between Third and Fourth avenues, with outlet sewer in Eighty-seventh street, between Second and Third avenues; and to regulate and grade, set or reset curb and pave gutters; and to pave with macadam Eighty-seventh street, between Third and Fourth avenues, were adopted by unanimous vote.

Approved by the President of the Borough April 30, 1904.

No. 73.

A petition to grade lots on the south side of Fifty-second street, between Sixth and Seventh avenues; on the north side of Fifty-third street, between Sixth and

Seventh avenues, and on the west side of Seventh avenue, between Fifty-second and Fifty-third streets, known as Nos. 17, 18, 19, 21, 37, 47, 52, 57, 66 and 67, Block 809, Eighth Ward Map, was denied, all members of the Board present voting in the negative.

No. 74.

On motion of Alderman Malone, a petition to grade lots on the south side of Fifty-fourth street, between Sixth and Seventh avenues, known as Nos. 19, 23, 24, 29, 34, 37 and 40, Block 825, Eighth Ward Map, was laid over indefinitely.

No. 75.

A resolution to pave sidewalks with cement, opposite the lots lying on the north side of Fortieth street, between Fifth and Sixth avenues, known as Nos. 37, 50 and 61, Block 913, Eighth Ward Map, was adopted by unanimous vote.

Approved by the President of the Borough April 30, 1904.

No. 76.

A resolution providing for the paving with cement the sidewalks opposite lots lying on the south side of Forty-ninth street, between Seventh and Eighth avenues, known as Nos. 9, 23, 29, 30, 31, 35 and 38, Block 786, Eighth Ward Map, was adopted by unanimous vote.

Approved by the President of the Borough April 30, 1904.

No. 77.

Resolutions to grade lots lying on the south side of Forty-second street, between Fourth and Fifth avenues, known as Nos. 27 and 28, Block 724, Eighth Ward Map; and to pave sidewalks with cement, opposite lots lying on the south side of Forty-second street, between Fourth and Fifth avenues, known as Nos. 6, 27, 28, 32 and 37, Block 724, Eighth Ward Map, were adopted by unanimous vote.

Approved by the President of the Borough April 30, 1904.

No. 78.

A resolution to pave sidewalks with cement, opposite lots lying on the north side of Fiftieth street, between Fifth and Sixth avenues, known as Nos. 38, 49 and 58½, Block 784, Eighth Ward Map, was adopted by unanimous vote.

Approved by the President of the Borough April 30, 1904.

No. 79.

A resolution to inclose with a close board fence six feet high the lot lying on the southeast corner of Fourth avenue and Fifty-ninth street, known as No. 6, Block 863, Eighth Ward Map, was adopted by unanimous vote.

The Secretary presented a communication from the Chairman of the Aldermanic Committee relative to the proposed opening ceremonies of the Rapid Transit Tunnel and an estimate of its cost; also a resolution of the Board of Aldermen requesting an issue of \$50,000 Special Revenue Bonds for said purpose:

CITY OF NEW YORK—BOARD OF ALDERMEN,
CITY HALL, September 15, 1904.

Hon. EDWARD M. GROUT, Comptroller:

DEAR SIR—In compliance with your request, that a statement be sent to you of the proposed opening ceremonies of the Rapid Transit Tunnel and an estimate made of its cost, I beg to submit the following:

At a joint meeting of the Committee appointed by the Board of Aldermen, the Committee appointed by the Rapid Transit Commission and Mr. Seward, of the Chamber of Commerce, the following plan of celebration was presented, discussed and practically adopted:

His Honor the Mayor requests the citizens of the City to make the day of the opening ceremonies a holiday and to decorate their houses appropriately.

The opening ceremony to be held in front of the City Hall, a large grand stand being erected in plaza facing front entrance (capable of holding 4,000 people), and a smaller stand on City Hall steps for the speakers and City officials.

The exercises to consist of—

Invocation by Bishop Potter.

Introductory address by Chairman, Hon. Charles V. Fornes.

Speech by his Honor the Mayor.

Speech by Hon. A. E. Orr.

Speech by the Comptroller.

Speech by Hon. August Belmont.

Benediction by Archbishop Farley.

Interspersed with music.

After the benediction the officials and prominent guests will proceed to the tunnel at City Hall entrance and board the cars.

His Honor the Mayor will operate the controller and start the first train, which will proceed slowly up the subway, passing all stations.

The public to be admitted by ticket to the stations along the route to witness the passing of the first train.

In the evening there will be an electric illumination, band concert and display of fireworks in front of the City Hall and in front of the Borough Hall, Borough of The Bronx.

For the decorative scheme I beg to refer you to the accompanying plan "A."

For the electric illumination, plan "B."

This in general is the proposed scheme of a celebration commensurate with the importance of the occasion and the dignity of the City.

It is exceedingly difficult to give anything like an estimate of the cost of such a celebration.

When the Committee knows the amount the City considers sufficient for such a celebration they will be in a position to ask for precise bids and make awards within the amount of the appropriation.

The question of the amount for decorations, fireworks and printing would depend entirely upon the amount allowed by the City, and it is practically impossible to make an estimate which would be a guide.

The Committee feels, and we know you do, that the ceremony to commemorate the completion of so important an event in the history of our City should be held on as grand a scale as possible.

PLANS AND SPECIFICATION.

Interior Decoration of City Hall.

Specification "A"—The entrances will be festooned with flags and shields. The arches in corridor will be draped with bunting, flags, silk banners and shields, with groups of silk flags.

Specification "B"—The Mayor's Reception Room will be handsomely decorated with flags, silk banners, shields with eagles, and streamers from chandelier to side walls. The coat-of-arms of The City of New York will be displayed herein.

Specification "C"—The Aldermanic Chambers will be handsomely festooned with flags over windows, silk banners and shields on wall panels, draperies on balconies and festooning over doors, arches, etc. The coat-of-arms of the City and the United States will be handsomely grouped in centre.

Specification "D"—The Governor's room will have the coats-of-arms of the State and City, with American flags, silk banners and shields, with groups of flags. All other rooms, such as the President of the Board of Aldermen, President of the Borough, will be decorated with silk banners, shields and bunting flags.

Specification "E"—The rotunda will have streamers running from the dome to top balcony. From the centre will be suspended a large balloon of silk, of American colors, bearing a group of silk American flags; silk banners will be arranged on the posts and balconies, festooned with flags.

The decorations will consist of all new bunting, flags, silk shields with groups of silk flags in each, and silk American banners with an embroidered eagle in each, throughout the building, and adjusted in the most artistic manner.

Exterior Decorations of City Hall and Park.

The exterior decorations will consist of large American flags on poles on roof, with two lines of string flags on each running to roof. Large fans of bunting flags will be festooned along the roof on front and sides of building. Large American shields with groups of flags, bunting banners and large American flags in fans and draped along window ledges and entrances in the most artistic manner; coats-of-arms of The City of New York, draped with flags, will be displayed over main portal. A Court of Honor will be erected around the main entrance, consisting of 24 white columns (each about 25 feet high), with large base heavily weighted, large gilded ball on top bearing a bunting burgee from pole; shields with groups of flags will be fastened in the centre, and a heavy green roping will swing gracefully from column to column, and columns entwined with ropings. Numerous string flags will be arranged around the park, fastened from tree to tree in the best arrangement possible.

In addition, to have the interior decorations in an elaborate manner, to consist of American silk flags up to 6 feet in length and bunting flags to 16 feet in length, metal shields, bright gilt brass eagles, embroidered and sewed silk banners of the United States and the thirteen original colonies, besides the coat-of-arms of the City, in silk and gold. These banners to be from five to six feet in length, with width in proportion. All to be placed in the Mayor's Room, Aldermanic Chamber, rotunda and the main halls.

All the flags and banners for the exterior work to be of standard, all wool, fast colors bunting, from eight to thirty feet in length, and in good condition. The signals in the park to be from eight to sixteen feet long. All shields to be of wood frame, four feet high, covered with canvas and painted in oil, colors red, white and blue in gold.

The colonnade to consist of twenty-four wooden pedestals, with deep set panels, covered with cloth and painted to represent pure white marble, with gold mouldings, surrounded by columns with gold caps and flagstaves twenty feet high, with flags and banners.

The eagles to be brass, gilt and lacquered. All green roping and garlands to be of natural leaves and branches.

None but American and American code signal flags to be used.

The coat-of-arms to be painted in oil.

The decorations to extend from Broadway to Park row, and from the City Hall to the Post Office, with returns on the east and west wings of the City Hall Building.

Plans and Specifications

for decorating stations of the Subway for the opening ceremonies.

Specification "A"—The entrance to and from subway stations will be festooned with fans and flags on the sides. A frame will be erected over the front and draped with two American flags. Over the four corners of entrances will be displayed a large wreath of natural greens bearing a large bow of red, white and blue ribbons.

Specification "B"—Small ensign and signal flags on ropes will connect entrance and exits, running from peak to peak.

A fan of flags will be displayed inside of entrance over stairway leading down to subway.

Specification "C"—The stations of the subway will have the posts or upright girders wound with garlands of natural foliage.

The ticket office will be primed with flags, banners and shields, bearing a group of flags.

Banners, flags, etc., will also be displayed on the walls in the most artistic manner.

All the decorations for the subway will be fastened to strips of batting, and laid on so that no nails will be driven nor the structure in any way disfigured.

Electric Illuminating Scheme.

The entire City Hall Park, in front of City Hall proper, to be illuminated with 10,000 eight candle power lamps, strung from tree to tree, and from the Park Row side to the Broadway side of the Park streamers of light will run to the City Hall Building. Where these streamers meet the trees a 2-foot double star containing 22 lights of red, white and blue will be erected, making a complete illumination in the Park of about 14,000 lights of various colors.

At the City Hall proper will be installed a similar illumination, which was used for the Twentieth Century Celebration. This illumination will consist of about 8,000 eight candle power lamps. The wording at the top can be anything that the Committee may select.

In addition to this, over the door will be an American flag, containing 400 lights, and on each balcony an American shield containing 300 lights properly colored. On the streamers outlining the building there will be three color lights, red, white and blue, connected with an automatic switch which will light each color in rotation.

This work to be done in a thorough and workmanlike manner, without interfering with the traffic of the streets, and the contractor to agree to turn over to the City the various trees and buildings in the same condition as they received them.

At the various subway stations, the location to be selected by the Committee, we will install about 500 lights (at each station) distributed as follows: At the top of the entrance station a double star will be arranged, and crossing the street from star to star a festoon of light will be installed. The ribs at the top of the building and the cornices are also to be illuminated. From the exit station, across the street, a similar decoration will be installed. These lights will be of red, white and blue, alternate colors.

One station to be decorated free of charge to show the Committee exactly what the scheme of illumination is, so that any changes can be made before the contract is awarded.

Plans and Specifications for Electrical Display.

Surround the Park and the buildings with about 25,000 electric lights of various colors, numerous stars and shields and face devices, the whole to have the effect of fairy land.

Of the above, there is to be one at City Hall, one in the Borough Hall, Borough of The Bronx.

Decorations on Stations.

Each station will be decorated in an artistic manner, inside and outside, the outside to be surrounded by numerous electric lights and stars.

Run an arch of lights from one side of the street to the other on the roof of the depot or entrance. This to be done at 32 stations that will be ready.

In the Board of Aldermen.

Resolved, That in pursuance with the provisions of subdivision 6, section 166, of the Amended Greater New York Charter, the Board of Estimate and Apportionment is hereby requested to authorize the Comptroller to issue Special Revenue Bonds to the amount of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000), to be expended for the proper and fitting celebration of the opening of the underground system of rapid transit in The City of New York.

Adopted by the Board of Aldermen, July 26, 1904, four-fifths of all the members elected voting in favor thereof.

Received from his Honor the Mayor, August 9, 1904, without his approval or disapproval thereof; therefore, as provided in section 40 of the Greater New York Charter, the same took effect as if he had approved it.

CITY OF NEW YORK—DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE,
COMPTROLLER'S OFFICE,
September 23, 1904.

To the Board of Estimate and Apportionment:

GENTLEMEN—For over two years past I have endeavored to secure legislation under which the question of playgrounds for the children, and especially the small children, living in the crowded sections of the City, could be settled and practical results obtained.

I regret to state that the special bill, which was drawn with a view to the acquisition of plots for such a purpose and for the care and maintenance of the same, which failed to become a law a year ago and which during the last session of the Legislature passed both houses and was accepted by the Mayor, was subsequently vetoed by the Governor.

In the amendment, however, to section 47 of the Charter, known as chapter 409 of the Laws of 1904, it now becomes possible for the Board of Estimate and Apportionment to take the initiative in providing the means to secure playgrounds.

The need for such places is most strongly felt in the Borough of Manhattan, and to a less extent in some sections of the Borough of Brooklyn, but there is sufficient open land in the other boroughs to obviate the necessity of any present action towards securing playgrounds in any of the boroughs save Manhattan and Brooklyn.

Briefly, the situation to-day in Manhattan is as follows:

Under the provisions of chapter 320 of the Laws of 1887, known as the "Small Parks Act," these parks were acquired:

No mention was made of playgrounds in the act of 1887, and in consequence the authorities did not feel at liberty to depart from the general manner of treatment heretofore employed in the laying out of these new parks.

By an amendment to this act in 1895, known as chapter 293 of the Laws of 1895, the Board of Street Opening and Improvement was authorized to lay out and acquire so many parks as it might deem necessary, but not less than two in the district east of the Bowery and Catharine street and south of Fourth street, to be finished in part as public playgrounds, and under this act two parks were acquired.

—each containing, at the present time, quite extensive playgrounds.
In 1897 an advisory committee was appointed by the Mayor to suggest sites for additional parks, and in October of that year the committee made a detailed report, recommending that the attention of the City authorities be given to providing playgrounds for the small children, which had been overlooked when the act of 1887 was drafted, and suggesting a number of sites therefor, both independent of and in connection with school buildings.

So far as I can learn, no action was taken in acquiring any new sites, but the playground feature has of late received much attention from both the Park Department and the Board of Education, with the result that ten of the smaller parks now contain playgrounds, of which seven are in addition equipped with gymnasia.

The practical results obtained from the establishment of these playgrounds are many and of much benefit to the children. The streets wherein it was not only dangerous but unlawful for them to play have now been deserted for the parks wherein their rights are first considered and where proper supervision adds to the enjoyment of the weak as well as the strong.

These parks, however, are not sufficiently close together to permit the smaller children living in certain crowded localities to reach them unattended, and my object in attempting to secure the legislation before referred to was to obtain small plots of from four to six or eight city lots each, preferably running through from street to street, which would in a measure overcome this difficulty. Such plots, I think, should be devoted exclusively to playground purposes and not be parked.

Very little improvement will be necessary, except the removal of existing structures and the levelling of the ground, for I believe a sand pile and a few swings will afford all the amusement necessary.

These plots being comparatively small in size, will not appeal to the older children, able to make the journey to the parks where more extensive games may be enjoyed, but will fill the need of the little folks who are so numerous in many districts.

Aside from the amusement features and the removal of a large number of the children from the streets, I am dully impressed with the thoroughly good effect that open spaces will have, not only on the children but on the community in general, letting more air and sunlight in among old tenements constructed before the present Tenement House Law became effective. Many of the members of this Board are familiar with the results obtained in the playgrounds of the smaller parks to-day and also in the children's farm garden in De Witt Clinton Park, from the reports of which it would appear that the change in the physical appearance of the children is most remarkable.

The location of these plots has been very carefully considered and should the Board deem it desirable to make an appropriation, I shall present such sites to the Board from time to time and as often as I shall be able to negotiate for their purchase at private sale on reasonable terms, for I believe that the money so appropriated should be used exclusively for sites and not go to pay the large expenses attendant on condemnation proceedings.

It would seem desirable that as fast as the plots are secured they should be assigned to the Park Department for improvement and supervision.

When it is considered that the traffic in our streets is increasing yearly and the population as well, it is evident that the City should take some action to provide open spaces for the children in which they may be kept off the streets.

There are eight localities in Manhattan and three in Brooklyn which seem to require immediate attention, and I would propose that the Board authorize an issue of Corporate Stock to the amount of \$750,000, to be made available for the purchase of plots for playgrounds.

The person or persons making a bid or estimate for any services, work, materials or supplies for The City of New York, or for any of its departments, bureaus or offices, shall furnish the same in a sealed envelope, indorsed with the title of the supplies, materials, work or services for which the bid or estimate is made, with his or their name or names and the date of presentation to the President or Board or to the head of the Department at his or its office, on or before the date and hour named in the advertisement for the same, at which time and place the estimates received will be publicly opened by the President or Board or head of said Department and read, and the award of the contract made according to law as soon thereafter as practicable.

Each bid or estimate shall contain the name and place of residence of the person making the same, the names of all persons interested with him therein, and, if no other person be so interested, it shall distinctly state that fact; also, that it is made without any connection with any other person making an estimate for the same purpose, and is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud, and that no member of the Board of Aldermen, head of a department, chief of a bureau, deputy thereof, or clerk therein, or other officer of The City of New York is, shall be or become interested, directly or indirectly, as contracting party, partner, stockholder, surety or otherwise in or in the performance of the contract, or in any portion of the profits thereof. The bid or estimate must be verified by the oath, in writing, of the party or parties making the estimate that the several matters stated herein are in all respects true.
