A. N. SPOONER, Esq., Commissioner of Docks:

Sir—I have the honor to submit the following report of work done under my charge and supervision for the quarter ending June 30, 1908:

NORTH RIVER.

Battery Wall, North River.

The southerly platform has been straightened by the force of the Department. The existing platforms at this locality and the steamboat landing have been maintained during the quarter.

Boat Landing, Pier "A."

The boat landing at Pier "A," North River, has been repaired during the quarter, and the float inside the landing has been maintained.

Liberty Street Section, North River.

The authorization for this section is action of the Commissioner of Docks, December 10, 1902, Bureau Order No. 910. The work at this section is being done by the Central Railroad Company of New Jersey, which company is in course of constructing ferry terminal building with the necessary ferry structures at this locality. A permit has been awarded and work will shortly be begun on construction of a passenger bridge across West street, leading to the new terminal.

Pier (New) 13, North River.

The work of building an extension to this pier out to the pierhead line has been in progress by the force of the Department during the quarter.

Between Piers 24 and 25, North River.

The work of placing a platform and awning shed on the new-made land at this locality has been done by the Old Dominion Steamship Company, under permit from this Department.

Canal Street, North River.

The force of the Department has been engaged in reconstructing the unleased portion of the pier at this street. The work, which was originally begun on the 8th of December, 1906, was finished on the 20th of May, 1908.

Between Piers 31 and 32, North River.

An iron frame awning shed has been erected at this locality for the protection of the horses during the summer by the New York City Railway Company, under permit from this Department.

Chelsea Section, North River.

On the 28th of December, 1900, the Board of Docks authorized the construction of a section of the bulkhead wall between Bloomfield and West Twenty-third streets, North River. The bulkhead wall proper is now completed for the entire length of the section. This section includes Piers 53, 54, 55, 57, 58, 59, 60, 61 and 62, all of which were completed some time since.

Pier 53—Fender piles were driven at this pier and sheet piling placed on the south side of pier. Two stairways have been cut for the use of the New York and Albany Transportation Company, and the temporary shed has been extended by the same company. The granite pavement at the approach to the pier has been opened for the purpose of erecting standpipe by the New York Edison Company.

Pier (new) 54—Fire runways have been built under this pier and under the bulkhead platform. Two electric hoisters have been placed on the pier, and a temporary shelter erected outside of the shed by the Cunard Steamship Company. The work of building a freight shed on this pier, with lateral extension on the adjacent bulkhead platform, has been in progress under Contract No. 1054.

Pier (new) 56—Fire runways have been built under the pier and bulkhead platform. The work of building a freight shed on this pier, with lateral extension on the adjacent bulkhead platform, has been in progress under Contract No. 1054.

Pier (new) 57—The column foundations for this pier have been repaired. The work of constructing a freight shed on this pier, with lateral extension on the adjacent bulkhead platform, has been in progress under Contract No. 1060.

Pier (new) 58—Temporary backing log was removed, and fire runways built under the pier and bulkhead platform. The work of constructing a freight shed on this pier with lateral extension on the adjacent bulkhead platform has been in progress under Contract No. 1060.

Pier (new) 59—The work of constructing a freight shed on this pier with lateral extension on the adjacent bulkhead platform has been in progress under Contract No. 1060.

Pier (new) 60—The work of constructing a freight shed on this pier with lateral extension on the adjacent bulkhead platform has been in progress under Contract No. 1061.

Pier (new) 61—The work of constructing a freight shed on this pier with lateral extension on the adjacent bulkhead platform has been in progress under Contract No. 1061.

Pier (new) 62—Fender piles were pulled, temporary backing log was replaced, and cluster of fender piles was driven at the outer end of the pier. The work of constructing a freight shed on this pier with lateral extension on the adjacent bulkhead platform has been in progress under Contract No. 1061.

At Fourteenth street a crosswalk pavement has been laid to replace the patented asphalt pavement laid by the New York City Railway Company between its tracks on the marginal street. Between Fourteenth and Twenty-second streets the pavement has been repaired or relaid, and at Twenty-third street a crosswalk has been placed in front of the ferry house.

Marginal Street Within the Lines of the Section.

The Consolidated Gas Company is laying a 12-inch gas main along the easterly side of this marginal street. An outlet sewer between Fourteenth and Eighteenth streets has been placed. A 12-inch water main is being placed along the marginal street for the whole length of the section by the Department of Water Supply, Gas and Electricity. Public lighting posts have been placed between Twenty-second and Twenty-third streets by the Empire City Subway Company. Between Bloomfield and West Fifteenth streets the work of curbing and flagging and laying granite pavement with crosswalks has been in progress under Contract No. 1066. Between West Fifteenth and West Nineteenth streets the work of curbing and flagging and laying granite pavement has been in progress under Contract No. 1081. Between Nineteenth and Twenty-second streets the work of curbing and flagging and laying granite pavement with crosswalks has been in progress under Contract No. 1074. The work of constructing pedestrian approaches to the ferries between Twenty-second and Twenty-third streets, under Contract No. 1096, Class 1, was completed on the 11th of June, 1908. Along the whole length of the section between Fourteenth and Twenty-second streets the New York City Railway Company has been paving with granite the 2-foot strip on either side of their tracks.

Pier at Thirtieth Street, North River.

Repairs have been made to this pier by the force of the Department during the quarter, and the middle dump on the pier has been repaired for the Department of Street Cleaning.

Pier at Thirty-fifth Street, North River.

The sheathing and backing logs on this pier have been repaired during the quarter by the force of the Department.

Pier at Thirty-ninth Street, North River.

The pier at Thirty-ninth street has been repaired during the quarter by the force of the Department.

Pier at Fortieth Street, North River.

Repairs have been made to this pier during the quarter by the force of the Department.

West Forty-second Street Section, North River.

By an order from the Engineer-in-Chief, dated the 14th of November, 1905, the sections originally known as "West Forty-second Street Section," "West Forty-second Street Section Extended," and "West Forty-third Street Section," were consolidated and are now known as "West Forty-second Street Section." The wall was practically completed with the exception of the coping for all the portion except that extending across the foot of West Forty-second street during a prior quarter.

During the present quarter work has been in progress on this section. Ferry terminal is being built at Forty-second street by the New York Central and Hudson River Railroad Company under permit from this Department.

Forty-sixth Street, North River.

Repairs have been made to the pier at this street by the force of the Department during the quarter.

Forty-seventh Street, North River.

The pier at this street has been repaired during the quarter, and the dumping board is being rebuilt and repaired by the force of the Department for the Department of Street Cleaning.

Fifty-first Street, North River.

Repairs have been made to the unleased portion of the pier at this street by the force of the Department.

Fifty-fifth Street, North River.

An extension is being constructed in this pier out to the pierhead line by the force of the Department, and general repairs have been made to the pier.

Ninety-seventh Street, North River.

Extensive repairs are being made to the pier at the foot of this street. An extension 15 feet in width has been constructed to the north side of this pier by the force of the Department, and the area at the foot of the street has been paved with second-hand paving blocks.

Claremont Section, North River.

The work at this section is being done under resolution of the Board of Docks passed November 16, 1900. During the present quarter earth filling has been received and placed and levelled off to grade.

One Hundred and Thirty-first and One Hundred and Thirty-second Streets—The marginal street has been cleaned between these two streets and an approach built to the pier at the foot of One Hundred and Thirty-second street.

Carmansville Section, North River.

The authorization for this section is action of the Commissioner of Docks, May 14, 1907, R. O. 5221. During the present quarter the Department force has been engaged in building rip-rap wall from mean low water up. Ashes have been deposited in rear of the rip-rap embankment.

Marginal Street, North River.

The asphalt pavement on the North and East Rivers has been repaired during the quarter under Contract No. 1004. Repairs have also been made where necessary to the asphalt pavement already laid in accordance with the terms of the maintenance bond to keep the pavement in good condition. The Department has taken up and relaid the granite pavement to grade where necessary along the North River, between the Battery and West One Hundred and Fifty-eighth street.

EAST RIVER.

Whitehall Terminal, East River.

The work at this section will be found described further on in the report under the heading "Ferries."

Broad Street Section, East River.

The authorization for this section is resolution of the Board of Docks dated December 22, 1899. The pavement at the approach to Pier 4, East River, has been relaid during the quarter.

Old Slip Section, East River.

The Commissioner of Docks on the 7th of December, 1904, issued the necessary authorization for the construction of the bulkhead wall from the northerly side of Pier (new) 7, where it joins the Broad street section, to the northerly side of Burling slip, East River. This stretch of wall is divided into two sections, the Old Slip section and the Maiden Lane section.

The Old Slip section extends from the northerly or upper end of the Broad street section and runs along the established bulkhead line to a point opposite the southerly line of Wall street. The work on the bulkhead wall has practically been completed as far as the southerly side of Pier 12.

During the present quarter granite block pavement has been laid or relaid in the vicinity of Piers 8, 9, 10, 11 and 12.

Maiden Lane Section, East River.

By authorization of the Commissioner of Docks, dated 7th of December, 1904, the construction of the bulkhead wall along this section of the water-front was ordered. The work extends from the southerly line of Wall street, where it joins the Old Slip section, to about the southerly line of Burling slip, East River.

During the quarter granite block pavement has been relaid in the vicinity of Piers 14 and 15.

Fulton Section, East River.

This section of the bulkhead wall was authorized by the Board of Docks on the 26th of April, 1901. This resolution was amended by action of the Commissioner of Docks on the 7th of December, 1904.

During the present quarter no work has been done on the bulkhead wall proper, but earth filling has been placed in the rear of that portion of the wall built. A granite pavement with bridgestones has been laid between Piers 15 and 16, and granite pavement at approach to Pier 16 was relaid.

Pier 18 and Bulkhead Between Piers 18 and 19, East River.

A shed is being erected on a portion of Pier 18, and bulkhead platform erected between Piers 18 and 19, in accordance with plans approved by this Department. The work is being done by the New York Wholesale Fish Dealers' Association, and the inner end of Pier 18 has been rebuilt.

Peek Slip Section, East River.

The authorization for this section is action of the Commissioner of Docks, dated January 14, 1903. During the quarter the temporary approach to Pier 19 was removed and the approach paved.

James Slip Section, East River.

The authorization for this section is action of Commissioner of Docks, dated April 30, 1907, Bureau Order No. 5191. This section extends from the easterly side of Oliver street pier, or Pier 25, East River, westerly along the bulkhead line to the centre line of Pier (old) 31, a distance of about 320 feet.

Work has been in progress on this section during the quarter, 144 linear feet of wharfage room having been made by the work done. Earth filling has been placed in rear of that portion of the wall completed. A contract, No. 1085, has been awarded for building a new pier at the foot of James slip, East River, and for building a new bulkhead platform easterly from said pier, between James slip and Oliver street, and the work has been begun. A contract has been prepared for building a new pier at the foot of Oliver street, but has not yet been let. Test borings have been made and examination made in connection with proposed improvement to the water-front in this vicinity.

Catharine Section, East River.

The authorization for this section is resolution of the Board of Docks passed February 24, 1899. Platform and approach to Pier 27 have been removed to make way for paving.

Market Section, East River.

The authorization for this section is resolution of the Board of Docks, passed February 23, 1900. Mooring posts have been set during the quarter. The granite pavement at the approach to Pier 28 and between Piers 28 and 29 has been relaid. Pavement in the vicinity of Piers 30 and 31 has been relaid and bridgestone placed.

Pier 32, East River.

The work of repairing and rebuilding the platform and building lateral extension to this pier is in progress.

Rutgers Section, East River.

The authorization for this section is the resolution of the Board of Docks, passed February 3, 1899. During the quarter granite approach to Piers 33 and 34 and pavement between Piers 33 and 34 have been relaid.

Jefferson Section, East River.

The authorization for this section is resolution of the Board of Docks passed February 23, 1900. Test piles have been driven in the vicinity of Clinton street to ascertain the nature of the river bottom. Temporary pile approach is being built to pier at Clinton street.

Stanton Street Section, East River.

The authorization for this section is resolution of the Board of Docks passed March 1, 1893. Granite pavement has been laid at the approach to the pier at Stanton street.

New Bellevue Section, East River.

The officials of the Bellevue and Allied Hospitals being desirous of extending the grounds of the Bellevue Hospital, between Twenty-sixth and Twenty-eighth streets, East River, by reason of the extensive improvements proposed to the hospital buildings in that locality, the bulkhead wall is being built along the new bulkhead line as modified by the Secretary of War September 16, 1903, with the further modification extending the bulkhead line across the foot of Twenty-ninth street and back to the established line of 1890, at the northerly side of Twenty-ninth street. Work on this section of the bulkhead wall has been in progress during the quarter under Bureau Order No. 4981. The inner end of pier at Twenty-eighth street, where removed to make way

for the bulkhead wall construction, has been rebuilt, and earth filling has been placed in rear of that portion of the wall finished. The removal of the inner end of the pier at the foot of Twenty-ninth street to make way for the bulkhead wall construction is in progress.

Fifty-third Street, East River.

A pier is being constructed at this street by the force of the Department.

Yorkville Section, East River.

The authorization for this section is the action of the Commissioner of Docks of October 10, 1904, Bureau Order No. 2757. A contract, No. 1046, was awarded during a prior quarter for the excavation and removal of rock over the site of a proposed bulkhead wall and outshore from same, between East Sixty-fifth and East Seventy-fourth streets, East River, and work has been completed during the quarter, and the work on the concrete foundation for the wall has been in progress. Work on the wall proper has been in progress during the quarter, and earth filling has been placed behind the bulkhead wall.

Blackwell Section, East River.

By action of the Commissioner of Docks of October 10, 1904, Bureau Order No. 2756, the work of improving the water-front, which was being done under resolution of the Board of Docks for the East Seventy-fourth, East Seventy-fifth and East Seventy-seventh street sections, was consolidated, and a new section established, as Blackwell Section, beginning at the southerly line of East Seventy-fourth street and extending to the northerly line of East Eighty-first street, a distance of 1,958.03 feet. A portion of the section in the neighborhood of East Seventy-fourth street and East Seventy-fifth street was practically completed for quite a strip of wall during a previous quarter, and work was suspended until the work in the other sections make a joint with it. During the present quarter work has been in progress on the bulkhead wall, and 53 linear feet of new wharfage room has been made by the work done. Concrete foundation is being placed, and between Seventy-eighth and Seventy-ninth streets base blocks have been set. Granite has been built up in this same locality. Pavement has been placed between Seventy-sixth and Seventy-seventh streets.

North Brother Island, East River.

A contract, No. 1036, was awarded during a prior quarter for building a concrete sea wall and platform on piles, at the easterly side of this island, and work has been in progress during the quarter.

Rikers Island, East River.

A contract is being prepared and will shortly be let for preparing for and building a rip-rap embankment and wall to close the gaps in the existing wall at Rikers Island.

One Hundred and Twenty-fifth Street, Harlem River.

A shed has been constructed on the bulkhead north of this street by the Pennsylvania Railroad Company under permit from this Department.

One Hundred and Forty-first to One Hundred and Fifty-second street, Harlem River, Filling is being placed outshore to bulkhead line by John F. Purcell at this locality under permit from this Department.

West One Hundred and Fifty-ninth Street to Speedway, Harlem River.

Improvements are made to the water-front at this locality by the Interborough Rapid Transit Company under permit from this Department.

One Hundred and Seventy-first Street, Harlem River.

A pier and slip about 680 feet south of One Hundred and Seventy-first street, Harlem River, are being constructed by Edward J. Farrell under permit from this Department.

Rider Avenue, Mott Haven Canal.

Two coal pockets and screening tower are being constructed at this locality by Tinsley Brothers, under permit from this Department.

Cabot Street, East River.

The New York, New Haven and Hartford Railroad Company are constructing twelve steel transfer bridges at this locality under permit from this Department.

Between Dupont and Tiffany Streets, East River.

Bulkheads are being constructed at this locality by the Oak Point Land and Dock Company, under permit from this Department.

Clasons Point, Long Island Sound.

A stone-filled crib has been built at this locality by Clinton Stephens under permit from this Department. Work was commenced September 1, 1907, and finished June 20, 1908. A close pile bulkhead has been constructed and filling placed at this same locality by Clinton Stephens under permit from this Department. This work was begun May 24, 1908, and finished June 20, 1908.

Repairs to Unleased Piers and Bulkheads Owned by the City.

Repairs were made to unleased piers and bulkheads owned by the City on the North, East and Harlem Rivers as required from time to time.

BOROUGH OF BROOKLYN.

Whale Creek, Borough of Brooklyn.

In that section of the Borough of Brooklyn adjacent to Newtown Creek, near Greenpoint avenue, proceedings have been instituted to acquire the necessary property to secure pier room which existed only on Whale Creek, an arm of Newtown Creek. Near the mouth of Whale Creek the property to be acquired will not only enable the City to build over 1,000 feet of bulkhead, but also two piers. Plans and specifications for this concrete sea wall and one pier with an improved modern concrete reinforced deck were prepared during a prior quarter, but as yet nothing has been done towards the improvement on this part of the water-front.

Between Twenty-eighth and Sixty-fourth Streets, South Brooklyn.

A plan has been submitted and approved by the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund establishing new lines for bulkheads and piers, with Marginal street, wharf or place, extending from Twenty-eighth to Sixty-fourth street, South Brooklyn. Plans and studies are in progress for the dock improvement of this water-front in the near future, and test borings are being taken to ascertain the nature of the river bottom. A contract is in course of preparation for dredging between Twenty-eighth and Thirty-sixth streets, South Brooklyn.

Washington Street, Brooklyn.

Runways, derricks, etc., are being removed, granite unloading derrick erected with hopper, and repairs are being made to decking of Manhattan Bridge pier by Ryan & Parker Construction Company, under permit from this Department.

Degraw Street, Brooklyn.

Crib bulkhead is being removed and reconstructed at this locality by John Pierce Company, under permit from this Department.

Between Forty-third and Fifty-first streets, Brooklyn.

Five piers and bulkheads are being built at this locality by the Bush Terminal Company under permit from this Department. The work has been suspended.

Between Sixty-fourth and Sixty-fifth Streets, Brooklyn.

The Long Island Railroad Company is constructing bulkhead and rack at this locality, under permit from this Department.

Neptune Avenue, Coney Island Creek, Brooklyn.

A sheet pile bulkhead and lift bridge are being constructed and gas mains and water pipe laid at this locality by the Brooklyn Gas Company, under permit from this Department.

Sheepshead Bay, Brooklyn.

A sheet pile bulkhead is being constructed, filling placed and Marginal street constructed at this locality by the Manhattan Beach Surety company, under permit from this Department.

Other work done by private parties in the Borough of Brooklyn has been supervised and a general supervision of the water-front made.

BOROUGH OF QUEENS.

Lawrence Point, Queens.

Piers and bulkheads are being built at this locality by the Astoria Light and Power Company, under permit from this Department.

Belle Harbor, Rockaway Point, Queens.

The upland at this locality is being filled in by the West Rockaway Land Company, under permit from this Department. The work has been suspended.

A large number of permits have been granted to occupy land and to erect structures thereon at Jamaica Bay, Borough of Queens.

Other work done by private parties in the Borough of Queens has been supervised, and a general supervision of the water-front made.

BOROUGH OF RICHMOND.

A description of the work being done for the ferry terminals in this Borough will be found later on in the report under the heading of "Ferries."

A number of pieces of work have been done in the Borough of Richmond by private parties and supervised by the Department of Docks and Ferries.

Pavement on Marginal Street, North, East and Harlem Rivers.

The asphalt pavement has been repaired at various places along the North, East and Harlem Rivers, where necessary to repair pavement already laid. The granite pavement along the North and East Rivers has been repaired from time to time. The work under Contract No. 1094 for repairing the asphalt pavement along the North and East Rivers has been in progress during the quarter.

Pavement on East River.

Pavement has been repaired along the East River water-front as required.

Old Material Storage Basin, Brooklyn.

A basin was established at the Wallabout Basin, Brooklyn, for the storage of old material under Bureau Order No. 6091. Work was begun on the 12th of April, 1908.

Pile Basin, Shermans Creek.

The pile basin at Shermans Creek on the Harlem River has been maintained and cared for.

Timber Basin, Seventy-fifth Street, North River.

At the Timber Basin, timber has been received under Department orders and contracts, cared for and issued as required. The Timber Basin has been maintained and cared for.

Department Yards at West Fifty-seventh street, North River, and Twenty-fourth Street, East River.

At the Department Yards the force of the Department has been engaged in the construction of concrete blocks, the handling and cutting of granite, the care of materials and the issue of supplies for various pieces of work. The yards have been maintained in good order and condition.

Floating Property.

All the floating property of the Department has been cared for during the quarter and repaired where necessary.

Dredging.

All the dredging has been supervised, whether done by the Department or by private parties.

Surveying Party.

All the necessary lines, levels, grades, soundings, surveys and examinations have been made and given. Work done by private parties has been supervised, automatic tide gauges have been attended to and the daily and weekly reports have been made. The records of the anemometer and weather vane, etc., have been compiled. An extensive survey of the water-fronts of Brooklyn, Queens and Richmond is in progress.

Recreation Piers.

The recreation piers on the North, East and Harlem Rivers have been repaired from time to time as required, and maintained during the quarter.

FERRIES.

New Staten Island Ferry.

Whitehall Terminal.

The new Staten Island ferry, operating between the foot of Whitehall street, Manhattan, and the foot of South street, Borough of Richmond, with the Whitehall terminal at the Manhattan end and the St. George terminal at the Staten Island end, was started in operation by the City on October 23, 1905.

A contract, No. 1090, has been prepared for building a new ferry house for the Staten Island ferry at Whitehall street, East River, and same has been let and work will shortly be begun.

A quarterly examination has been made of the ferry slips, and obstructions removed.

St. George Terminal.

A quarterly examination has been made of the three ferry slips. Steam ashes have been deposited under the steam and trolley railroad terminal platforms. Various repairs have been made to the ferry terminal under Bureau Order No. 3761.

Stapleton Terminal.

Plans and specifications have been prepared for the erection of a machine shop, dumping board, coal pocket, coal handling machinery and the installation of a fire service on the pier foot of Canal street, Stapleton, adjoining the ferry structures, but the contract for the work has never been let. Neither has the contract been let for the ferry terminal house in this locality.

South Brooklyn Ferry.

New Thirty-ninth Street Ferry, South Brooklyn.

Manhattan Terminal.

On November 1, 1906, the City came into possession of the property of the New York and South Brooklyn Ferry and Steam Transportation Company, operating a ferry between Whitehall street, Manhattan, and Thirty-ninth street, South Brooklyn, and since that time the City has been operating the ferry as a municipal ferry.

The work of removing old piers and ferry structures between Whitehall and Broad streets, East River, and building new ferry structures for the Thirty-ninth street ferry terminal, Manhattan, was completed on the 11th of June, 1908.

Under Contract No. 1053, the work of building between Whitehall and Broad streets, East River, a new ferry house for the new Thirty-ninth street ferry, Manhattan Terminal, has been in progress.

Thirty-ninth Street Ferry Terminal, Brooklyn.

Filling has been placed in rear of the ferry structures at this locality under Bureau Order No. 5526.

Improvement of the Water-front, South Brooklyn.

A plan for the improvement of the water-front between Twenty-eighth and Thirty-eighth streets, South Brooklyn, was adopted by the Commissioner of Docks June 5, 1908, and approved by the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund on the 30th of June, 1908.

Draughtsmen.

In the office of the Chief Engineer the Draughtsmen have been engaged on plans and studies for contract work, plans for the improvement of the water-front, plans and specifications for new piers and repairs, change of lines, examination of plans submitted by private parties, solar printing and general routine work.

The total new wharfage room made by the Department of Docks and Ferries for the quarter amounts to 1,977 linear feet. Wharfage room destroyed by the City in making way for new improvements amounts to 561 linear feet. The area of the City's piers has been increased by 19,631 square feet. New wharfage room made by private parties under permit from the Department of Docks and Ferries amounted to 826 linear feet, and the wharfage room destroyed by private parties amounted to 2,004 linear feet.

Section 95. No fat, tallow or lard shall be melted or rendered, except when fresh from the slaughtered animal and taken directly from the places of slaughter in The City of New York, and in a condition free from sootiness and taint and all other causes of offense at the time of rendering, and all melting and rendering must be in steam-tight vessels, and the gases and odors therefrom must be destroyed by combustion or other means equally effective, and according to the best and most improved means and processes; and everything preceding, following and in connection with such melting and rendering, and the premises where the same shall be conducted, must be free from all offensive odor and other cause of detriment to the public health.

No fat, lard or tallow shall be brought into The City of New York to be rendered or melted, and none shall be rendered or melted that has come from any place outside of The City of New York, without a permit from the Board of Health. The business of melting or rendering fat, tallow or lard shall not be carried on or conducted in The City of New York without a permit from the Board of Health.

The person or persons making a bid or estimate for any services, work, materials or supplies for The City of New York, or for any of its departments, bureaus or offices, shall furnish the same in a sealed envelope, indorsed with the title of the supplies, materials, work or services for which the bid or estimate is made, with his or their name or names and the date of presentation to the President or Board or to the head of the Department at his or its office, on or before the date and hour named in the advertisement for the same, at which time and place the estimates received will be publicly opened by the President or Board or head of said Department and read, and the award of the contract made according to law as soon thereafter as practicable.

Each bid or estimate shall contain the name and place of residence of the person making the same, and names of all persons interested with him therein, and, if no other person be so interested, it shall distinctly state that fact; also, that it is made without any connection with any other person making an estimate for the same purpose, and is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud, and that no member of the Board of Aldermen, head of a department, chief of a bureau, deputy thereof, or clerk therein, or other officer of The City of New York is, shall be or become interested, directly or indirectly, as contracting party, partner, stockholder, surety or otherwise in or in the performance of the contract, or in the supplies, work or business to which it relates, or in any portion of the profits thereof.
