### Name, Description and Location of Proposal:

### Xu Hotel and Residences

The Negative Declaration originally issued on October 20 2014, has been revised in order to reflect a correction in the description of the proposed rezoning area.

The applicant, CG & J Realty LLC, is seeking a zoning map amendment to rezone Block 4960, Lot 29 (the "project site") and part of Lots 28, 57, 58, 59, 60, 61, 62, and 63 from a R6/C2-2 district to C4-3 and R6 districts in the Downtown Flushing neighborhood of Queens, Community District 7 (the "proposed action"). The proposed action would facilitate the construction of an approximately 214,539 gross square foot (gsf) eleven-story, mixed-use building containing hotel, residential, commercial, and community facility uses.

Block 4977, Lot 130 had been previously included in the list of lots to be rezoned by the proposed action. It should be noted that Block 4977, Lot 130 is a designated park and therefore is not subject to zoning. As detailed in the Revised EAS, it was determined that the corrections to the rezoning area would not have the potential for significant adverse impacts on the environment and would not alter the conclusions of the previous environmental review.

The project site is located in a R6/C2-2 district which allows residential and community facility Use Groups 1 through 4, with a permitted residential floor area ratio (FAR) ranging from 0.78 to 2.43 and a community facility FAR of 4.8. The existing C2-2 commercial overlay permits Use Groups 1 through 9 and 14 and a maximum commercial FAR of 2.0. The proposed action seeks to extend the C4-3 zoning district to the south of the project site to facilitate a mixed use building with a wider range of commercial uses than what would be permitted on an as-of-right-basis. The proposed C4-3 zoning district permits Use Groups 1 through 6, 8, 9, 10, and 12 and a commercial FAR of up to 3.4, a residential FAR of between 0.78 and 2.43, and a community facility FAR of up to 4.8.

The project site, Block 4960, Lot 29, is currently developed with a one-story 25,300 square foot (sf) supermarket and an accessory parking lot containing 38 parking spaces. Vehicular access to the parking lot is provided via curb cuts onto Northern Boulevard and Leavitt Street. The rezoning boundary also extends beyond the project site and includes portions of the following non-Applicant owned lots: Block 4960, Lots 28 and 57 through 63. These parcels are not expected to be redeveloped or enlarged as a result of the proposed action. Block 4960, Lots 28 and 57 through 62 are developed with one- to three-family residential buildings. Block 4960, Lot 63 is developed with a City owned parking lot that serves Flushing Town Hall, a Landmark Preservation Commission (LPC) designated landmark and National Register listed site located directly west of the project site. The rezoning area extends 125 feet in from the Northern Boulevard street line, therefore approximately 0.16 feet (two inches) in width of Block 4960, Lots 28 and 57 through 62 would be zoned C4-3. The remainder of the C2-2 commercial overlay would be removed from these lots and would maintain their effective R6 zoning. It is an open space area owned by the NYC Department of Parks and Recreation.

The proposed action would facilitate a proposal by the applicant to construct an approximately 214,539 gsf eleven-story mixed-use building on the project site. The proposed development would include approximately 43 dwelling units within 37,361 gsf of floor area, 191 hotel rooms within 97,401 gsf of floor area, 10,420 gsf of accessory retail space, and approximately 7,037 gsf of community facility space (non-profit club). The proposed development would also include 155 accessory attended parking spaces (plus 16 reservoir spaces), 33 bicycle parking spacing, and one loading berth. The cellar level of the building would be used for hotel parking and accessed from ramps on the basement level on Leavitt Street and by vehicle elevators. The first floor of the building would be used for residential parking garage and would be accessed from ramps on the basement level on Leavitt Street.

To: All Interested Agencies, Groups, and Individuals:

This publication gives notice that the City of New York (the City) has conducted an evaluation of several proposals under the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development's (HUD) Community Development Block Grant-Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) grant, as required by Executive Order 11988 in accordance with HUD regulations 24 CFR 55.20 Subpart C Procedures for Making Determinations on Floodplain Management. This evaluation is made to determine the potential affect that proposed activities in the floodplain will have on the human environment. Through the "Disaster Relief Appropriations Act, 2013" (Public Law 113-2, January 29), the City's initial allocation of CDBG-DR funds is \$1,772,820,000. Of this total, the City has allocated \$648 million in funding for assistance to address the various unmet housing needs. The focus of this notice is the NYC Build-It-Back: Multi-Family Building Rehabilitation Program, which will be administered by the Department of Housing Preservation & Development (HPD). Of the initial \$648 million of CDBG-DR funds allocated to housing, \$215 million would be provided to HPD for the rehabilitation of multifamily buildings (5+ units) and 3-4 unit buildings that are not owner-occupied. ### **Proposed Action in the Floodplain:**

Under the Multifamily Building Rehabilitation Program, actions may include rehabilitation and resiliency measures such as repair to structure and grounds; elevation of facilities including electrical, mechanical, plumbing and elevator equipment to the extent practicable; and in the event of substantial damage and substantial improvement, modifying structures to elevate residential use above the base flood elevation. Additionally, eligible homeowners could seek reimbursement for pre-award costs associated with reconstruction, rehabilitation and demolition work. Specific project descriptions for the properties which are subject to this notice are contained below.

 $3030\ Emmons\ Ave,\ Brooklyn$  - This development is a 134-unit, seven-story rental apartment building. The owner is seeking reimbursement for Sandy-related damages to the common areas, two apartments, lobby area, mechanical, electrical and boiler rooms. The owner is also seeking reimbursement for temporary repairs done after the storm, including Sandy debris removal and temporary boilers.

105 Oceana Drive East, Brooklyn - This is a 112-unit condominium development consisting of two eight-story buildings. The condominium board is seeking reimbursement for completed repair work to address Sandy-related damages. Extreme flooding damaged mechanical equipment including the sump pump, boiler, and compactor rooms. The electrical equipment was also damaged.

 ${\bf 10~Shore~Boulevard, Brooklyn}$  - This development consists of a six-story building with 141 units. The owner is seeking repair and reimbursement for Sandy-related damages. Extreme flooding to the basement area resulted in damage to the two boiler rooms, oil tank, building electrical and utility systems, and damaged compactor rooms.

24 Pennyfield Ave, Bronx - This development consists of a three-story condominium building where the owners are seeking reimbursement for completed Sandy-related repairs. Additional funding is needed for repairs to the exterior and interior portions of the building including the entry ramp, electrical systems, boiler, and damage from flooding in the basement.

**220 East 7th Street, Manhattan -** This property is comprised of a 15-unit supportive housing rental building. A repair and resiliency scope is proposed to address flood mitigation measures for the building's elevator, mechanical, and electrical systems, as well as other general flood mitigation items.

621 Water Street, Manhattan - This 124-unit supportive housing rental building sustained damage to floors, ceilings, electrical equipment, radiators, pumps, and the trash compactor. A repair and resiliency scope is proposed to cover flood mitigation measures for the building's mechanical and electrical systems, as well as other general flood mitigation items.

88 Greenwich Street, Manhattan - This is a 452-unit, 38-story condominium building where individual condo owners are seeking reimbursement for Sandy-related damages including but not limited to, window, floor and interior wall damage.

2279 and 2301 5th Ave & 2311 and 2333 5th Avenue - The applicants are requesting funding for reimbursement and repair costs for damages to portions of buildings' interiors and exteriors as well common areas. The applicants are also requesting funding for

130 Water Street, Manhattan - This development consists of a 124-unit condominium building where the applicants are seeking reimbursement for completed Sandy-related repair work in common spaces including elevator, flooring, painting and repair work to electrical and mechanical systems. Additional funding is proposed for repairs including painting, door replacements, tiling, and minor pipework.

The basements and ground floors of all buildings were flooded, damaging all units' boilers, hot water heaters, and storage space in the basement, and rendering 26 units uninhabitable. Reimbursement is sought for completed repairs to the ground floors and basements.

Additional funding is needed for repairs to leaking roofs and windows and restoring façades.

165 Beach 128 Street, Queens - This property is a seven-unit multifamily condominium. Two unit owners are requesting reimbursement for completed repairs, which include replacing the condensing unit (water/gas heaters), walls, flooring, etc.

### Public Explanation of a Proposed Activity in the 100-Year Floodplain:

The City has carried out the procedures required by Executive Order 11988 on Flood Plain Management including the consideration of a no-action alternative, to avoid adverse effects and incompatible development in the floodplain. The no-action alternative would not achieve the City's goals of restoring the health and safety of hurricane-damaged multi-family housing for its residents, nor would it promote planning and implementation of resilience measures to mitigate damage from future weather extremes. Residents would continue to be displaced from their homes located in the floodplain, live in damaged, unsafe, and unsanitary housing within the hurricane-damaged neighborhoods or seek shelter elsewhere. Poor structural integrity of hurricane-damaged buildings within the floodplain would put residents at a greater risk should a flood event occur, especially if buildings do not meet current elevation requirements. Storm debris fields on the properties of residential buildings would potentially remain unaddressed, also posing a threat to public health and water quality.

The City has considered alternatives and mitigation measures to be taken to minimize adverse impacts and to restore and preserve natural and beneficial values of the floodplain. It therefore proposes to support the projects because there is no practicable alternative to develop the projects totally outside the floodplain. To minimize potential harm to the floodplain, HPD will require that the projects implement the following mitigation measures:

- Property owners will be required to purchase and maintain flood insurance for the life of the property or the term of federal assistance; and
- All alterations and repair work must comply with the NYC Department of Buildings requirements for flood-resistant construction (Appendix G of the 2008 Building Code) and resiliency/mitigation measures described above will be implemented as practicable.

This notice is required by Section 2(a)(4) of Executive Order 11988 for Floodplain Management and is implemented by HUD Regulations found at 24 CFR 55.20 Subpart C Procedures for Making Determinations on Floodplain Management. All interested persons, groups and agencies are invited to submit written comments regarding the proposed use of federal funds to support activities located in a floodplain. Written comments should be sent to HPD at 100 Gold Street, New York, NY 10038, Attn: Patrick Blanchfield, AICP, Director of Environmental Planning, Office of Development, Room 9I-7. Comments may also be submitted electronically to nepa\_env@hpd. nyc.gov.
