

I. Permanent Housing Need for Fiscal Year 2012

Families

In Fiscal Year 2012, DHS expects approximately 50,000 duplicated applications for family shelter services. Approximately 32% of duplicated families applying will remain in temporary housing as eligible shelter entrants.

In FY2012, DHS will assist all families exit shelter as quickly as possible. Families will be assisted in accessing employment services and other financial and social supports to prepare for independent living. When available, appropriate families will be referred to NYNY III and Housing Preservation and Development (HPD) housing. Families may independently apply for New York City Housing Authority (NYCHA) housing, if available.

Single Adults

In Fiscal Year 2012, DHS expects to place at least 8,500 single adults into permanent housing. Approximately 80% of those individuals will be placed in private housing or will be re-housed with family. DHS plans to relocate 1,700 (20% approximately) single adults into permanent supportive housing in Fiscal Year 2012.

II. Transitional Housing for Fiscal Year 2012

Families

DHS is projected to have a maximum of 10,500 units for families in transitional housing in Fiscal Year 2012. DHS estimates that 10,000 units will be needed during the peak month of Fiscal Year 2012.

Single Adults

DHS is projected to have a total of 9,800 units available for single adults in the peak month of Fiscal Year 2012. DHS estimates that 9,400 beds will be needed during the same month.
