Calvin Drayton: NYCEM'S First Deputy Commissioner We Honor His Life and Service









The City mourns the loss of a remarkable leader: Calvin Drayton, former First Deputy Commissioner of NYC Emergency Management. A dedicated public servant, Calvin's illustrious career in emergency management began with the American Red Cross and FEMA, culminating in nearly two decades as NYCEM's First Deputy Commissioner. In 1996, he joined the NYC Mayor's Office of Emergency Management and was among the first emergency management personnel to respond to the tragic events of September 11, 2001 as he was already onsite. There, he supervised OEM's operational response during the fire and collapse of the World Trade Center. From 2002 until his retirement in 2019, Calvin faithfully served as NYCEM's inaugural First Deputy Commissioner, advocating for New Yorkers in times of crisis. Under his guidance, NYCEM evolved from a small team of 20 under the Mayor's Office to a robust independent department with over 200 employees. Every emergency manager who crossed through the doors learned invaluable lessons from Calvin's leadership, experience, and unwavering commitment. His legacy lives on in the aptly named Calvin Drayton Situation Room at NYCEM headquarters.

THINGS TO KNOW



How To Request NYC CERT

If approached to support an event in your community, the following steps must be taken:

- Event organizer submits an official request using the NYC CERT External Request Form.
- NYC CERT Leadership should not submit form on behalf of the event organizer.
- For events lead by a NYC CERT Division, volunteer leadership (Ready New York Liaison, if a preparedness event) should submit this <u>Event</u> <u>Request form</u>

NYC CERT program staff will review all requests.

If approved, program staff will add the volunteer opportunity to the NYC CERT Event Calendar

with a registration link. If more details are required for approval, program staff will use the contact information provided in the request form to connect with the organizer.




