COVID Updates - Mask Mandates and Key to NYC

In a <u>press release</u> on February 27 Mayor Adams announced "If we see no unforeseen spikes and our numbers continue to show a low level of risk, New York City will remove the indoor mask mandate for public school children, effective next **Monday, March 7**."

New York City's COVID numbers continue to go down. As long as indicators show a low level of risk, on Monday, March 7, the City of New York will also lift the **Key to NYC** vaccination requirements for customers of indoor dining, indoor entertainment, and indoor recreation businesses.
