BOARD OF ESTIMATE AND APPORTIONMENT.

Minutes of Special Meeting of Board of Estimate and Apportionment Held in Room 16, City Hall, Wednesday, January 17, 1917.

The Board met in pursuance of an adjournment.

Present—Frank L. Dowling, Acting Mayor; Albert E. Hadlock, Deputy and Acting Comptroller; Marcus M. Marks, President, Borough of Manhattan; Lewis H. Pounds, President, Borough of Brooklyn; Douglas Mathewson, President, Borough of The Bronx; Maurice E. Connolly, President, Borough of Queens, and Calvin D. Van Name, President, Borough of Richmond.

The Acting Mayor, Hon. Frank L. Dowling, presided.

Board of Estimate and Apportionment—Hearing on Personal Service Specifications Covering Skilled Trades and Compensation of Machinists, Stokers and Firemen (Cal. No. 1).

(On September 18, 1916, at the conclusion of the public hearing by the Board on the Personal Service Specifications prepared by the Bureau of Standards, a

motion was adopted requesting the Committee on Salaries and Grades to determine upon a date for a hearing on the specifications for Skilled Trades.)

(On September 22, 1916 (Cal. Nos. 8 and 9), reports relative to increasing the wages of Moulders and Stationary Engineers in City Departments were presented and laid over until the hearing on Standard Specifications covering Skilled Trades. The reports are printed in the Minutes of September 22, 1916.)

(On January 5, 1917 (Cal. No. 88), the Board adopted a resolution fixing January 17, 1917, as the date for the Public Hearing in this matter.)

Sullivan, representing Painters; Joseph Beere, representing per diem employees; Frank Denning; Montague Lessler, representing Ticket Agents, Department of Docks and Ferries; Hon. Imhoff, President, Board of Business Agents, Borough of The Bronx; Arthur Kelso, representing Board of Business Agents, Borough of Manhattan; Edward I. Hannah, representing Central Federated Union; Matthew McConville, representing Board of Business Agents, Borough of Brooklyn; William Murphy, representing Board of Business Agents, Borough of Richmond; Thomas C. Nutting and Leo Bely, representing Machinists; Hon. John J. O'Rourke, representing Mates and Deckhands, Department of Docks and Ferries; A. G. Stiles, Counsel for American Association of Masters, Mates and Pilots; T. L. Delahanty, representing Licensed Marine Engineers; John F. Riley, representing Deckhands in the Department of Correction; L. Weyand, representing Boilermakers and Helpers, and Blacksmiths and Helpers; D. E. Porter, representing Musicians; and E. M. Garvey, representing Deckhands on the Municipal Ferries.

The Secretary presented a communication from L. F. Oliver and others, in support of the petition of Marine Engineers operating the Municipal Ferries, for an increase in salary; which was ordered filed.

The Acting Mayor offered the following resolution:

Resolved, That the Bureau of Personal Service be and hereby is directed to prepare for the information of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment an estimate of the cost to the City that will result from a ten per cent. (10%) increase in the rates of compensation of employees of the City in the various branches of the skilled and unskilled trades.

Which was adopted by the following vote:

Affirmative—The Acting Mayor, the Deputy and Acting Comptroller and the Presidents of the Boroughs of Manhattan, Brooklyn, Queens and Richmond—12.

On motion, the Board adjourned to meet on Friday, January 19, 1917, at 10.30 o'clock a. m.

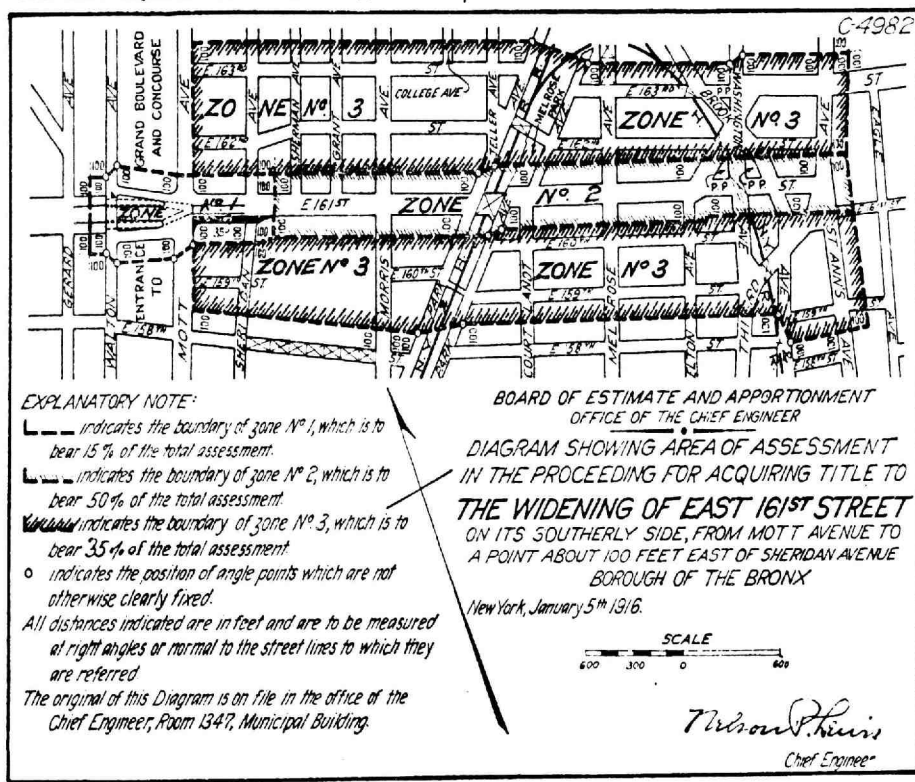

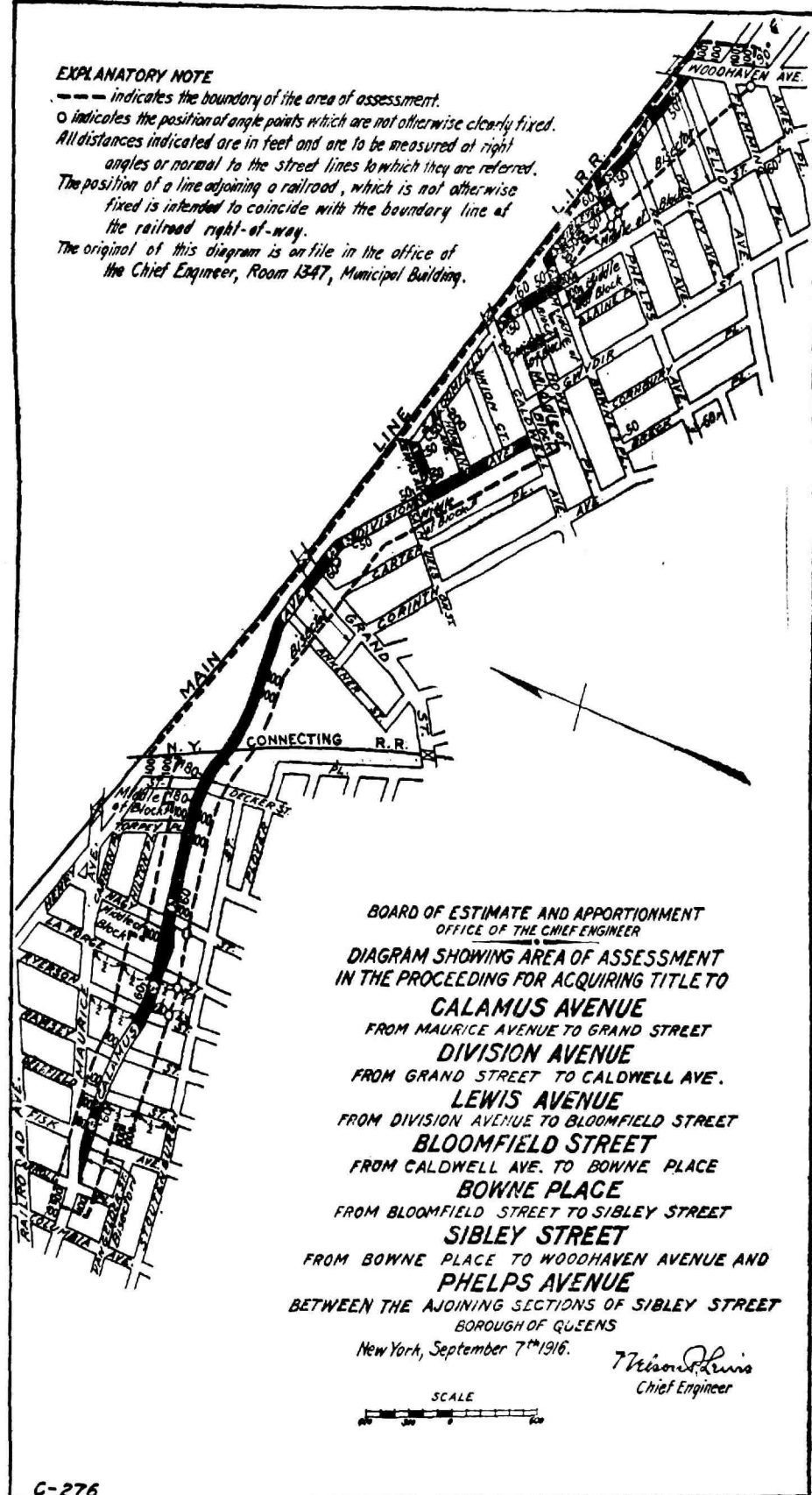

Where the amount of the purchase price does not equal or exceed the sum of \$50, the sum of \$50 will be the amount of the security to be deposited. This security may at any time after the expiration of the contract period be applied by the City to the cost of completing any of the work required under the contract, but unfinished at the expiration of the contract period.

Each bid or estimate shall contain the name and place of residence of the person making the same, and names of all persons interested with him therein, and, if no other person be so interested, it shall distinctly state that fact; also, that it is made without any connection with any other person making an estimate for the same purpose, and is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud, and that no member of the Board of Aldermen, head of a department, chief of a bureau, deputy thereof, or clerk therein, or other officer of The City of New York is, shall be or become interested, directly or indirectly, as contracting party, partner, stockholder, surety or otherwise in or in the performance of the contract, or in the supplies, work or business to which it relates, or in any portion of the profits thereof. The bid or estimate must be verified by the oath, in writing, of the party or parties making the estimate that the several matters stated therein are in all respects true.

No bid or estimate will be considered unless as a condition precedent to the reception or consideration of any proposal, it be accompanied by a certified check upon one of the State or National banks of The City of New York, drawn to the order of the Comptroller, or money or corporate stock or certificates of indebtedness of any nature issued by The City of New York, which the Comptroller shall approve as of equal value with the security required in the advertisement to the amount of not less than three nor more than five per centum of the amount of the bond required, as provided in section 420 of the Greater New York Charter.
