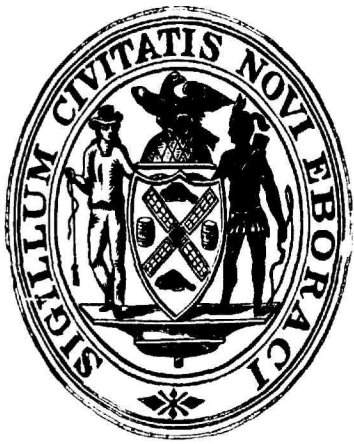

That by a contract between The City of New York and your petitioner dated December 16, 1909, as amended October 29, 1912, The City of New York granted to your petitioner the right and privilege to lay, construct, maintain and operate wires or other electrical conductors in conduits under the streets and avenues in the Borough of Manhattan and that portion of the Borough of The Bronx lying west of the Bronx River, for the purpose of maintaining and operating an electrical signaling system for the calling of messengers, an electrical burglar alarm system and a fire alarm system, and for no other purpose whatsoever.

Second. That pursuant to the provisions of the said contract, as so amended, the Company has been obliged and required to pay the City the sum of five thousand dollars (\$5,000) within thirty (30) days from the date of the signing of the original contract, and an annual sum which was to be not less than twelve hundred dollars (\$1,200) and which should be equal to two per cent. of its gross receipts if such percentage should exceed the sum of twelve hundred dollars (\$1,200).

Third. That from and after the expiration of five years from the date of the signing of such contract; that is, from and after December 16, 1914, the Company is and will be obligated, should it continue in business, to pay to the City an annual sum of not less than twenty-five hundred dollars (\$2,500), and which shall be equal to three per cent. of its gross receipts if such percentage shall exceed the sum of twenty-five hundred dollars (\$2,500).

Fourth: That your petitioner has complied with the terms of its contract with the City and has paid the minimum annual sums therein required, but such minimum annual sums have greatly exceeded the percentages with which they were to correspond and have actually amounted to approximately four per cent. of the gross receipts of the Company, that the earnings of the said Company during the period it has been operating under its contract with the City have not approximated those contemplated when the said contract was entered into, due to the depressed business conditions existing for upwards of five years past, and that the prospect of a return to active business conditions, which will justify your petitioner in continuing to be burdened by the requirements of the said contract, does not seem to be immediate.

Now, therefore, your petitioner respectfully asks that the said contract, as amended, be so modified that it be relieved of the burdens now imposed upon it in the manner and to the extent that your Board may deem just and proper, so that the payments required under the said contract will more nearly and equitably correspond with the return which the Company obtains by conducting the business in which it is engaged.

Removal of Temporary Sewer from Part of the Broadway-Fourth Avenue Rapid Transit Railroad.

The Public Service Commission for the First District (hereinafter called the "Commission"), acting for and on behalf of The City of New York (hereinafter called the "City"), invites proposals to remove a temporary sewer from Section No. 11-E-1 and 11-A-1 of Route No. 11, a part of the Broadway-Fourth Avenue Rapid Transit Railroad.

The points within the City between which the said sewer is to be removed from the Railroad are as follows:

Beginning at a point under Ashland Place, in the Borough of Brooklyn, about opposite the center line of Hanson Place, and extending thence southerly under Ashland Place, Flatbush Avenue and Fourth Avenue to a point under Fourth Avenue about opposite the southerly curb line of Butler Street.

Failure to remove said buildings, appurtenances, or any part thereof, within thirty days from the day of possession will work forfeiture of ownership of such buildings, appurtenances or portion as shall then be left standing, together with all moneys paid by said purchaser on account thereof at the time of the sale, and the bidder's assent to the above conditions being understood to be implied by the act of bidding, and The City of New York will, without notice to the purchaser, cause the same to be removed, and the cost and expense thereof charged against the security above mentioned.

The work of removal must be carried on in every respect in a thorough and workmanlike manner, and must be completed within thirty days from the day of possession, and the successful bidder will provide and furnish all materials of labor and machinery necessary thereto, and will place proper and sufficient guards and fences and warning signs by day and night for the prevention of accidents, and will indemnify and save harmless The City of New York, its officers, agents and servants, and each of them, against any and all suits and actions, claims and demands of every name and description brought against it, them or any of them, and against and from all damage and costs to which it, they or any of them be put by reason of injury to the person or property of another, resulting from negligence or carelessness in the performance of the work, or in guarding the same, or from any improper or defective materials or machinery, implements or appliances used in the removal of said buildings.

Where party walls are found to exist between buildings purchased by different bidders, the materials of said party walls shall be understood to be equally divided between the separate purchasers.

Party walls and fences, when existing against adjacent property not sold, shall not be taken down. All furrings, plaster, chimneys, projecting brick, etc., on the faces of such party walls are to be taken down and removed. The walls shall be made permanently self-supporting, beam-ends, etc., bricked up, and the wall pointed and made to exclude wind and rain and present a clean exterior. The roofs and adjacent buildings shall be properly braced and painted and made watertight where they have been disturbed by the operations of the Contractor.

The Comptroller of the City of New York reserves the right on the day of sale to withdraw from sale any of the buildings, parts of buildings and machinery included therein, or to reject any and all bids; and it is further Resolved, That, while the said sale is held under the supervision of the Commissioners of the Sinking Fund, the Comptroller is authorized to cause the sale to be advertised and to direct the sale thereof as financial officer of the City.

NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS.

The person or persons making a bid or estimate for any services, work, materials or supplies for The City of New York, or for any of its departments, bureaus or offices, shall furnish the same in a sealed envelope, indorsed with the title of the supplies, materials, work or services for which the bid or estimate is made, with his or their name or names and the date of presentation to the President or Board or to the head of the Department at his or its office, on or before the date and hour named in the advertisement for the same, at which time and place the estimates received will be publicly opened by the President or Board or head of said Department and read, and the award of the contract made according to law as soon thereafter as practicable.

Each bid or estimate shall contain the name and place of residence of the person making the same, and names of all persons interested with him therein, and, if no other person be so interested, it shall distinctly state that fact; also, that it is made without any connection with any other person making an estimate for the same purpose, and is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud, and that no member of the Board of Aldermen, head of a department, chief of a bureau, deputy thereof, or clerk therein, or other officer of The City of New York, is, shall be or become interested, directly or indirectly, as contracting party, partner, stockholder, surety or otherwise in or in the performance of the contract, or in the supplies, work or business to which it relates, or in any portion of the profits thereof. The bid or estimate must be verified by the oath, in writing, of the party or parties making the estimate that the several matters stated herein are in all respects true.

No bid or estimate will be considered unless, as a condition precedent to the reception or consideration of any proposal, it be accompanied by a certified check upon one of the State or National banks of The City of New York, drawn to the order of the Comptroller, or money or corporate stock or certificates of indebtedness of any nature issued by The City of New York, which the Comptroller shall approve as of equal value with the security required in the advertisement to the amount of not less than three nor more than five per centum of the amount of the bond required, as provided in section 420 of the Greater New York Charter.

The amount shall be as specified in the proposals or instructions to bidders and shall not be in excess of 5 per cent.

The certified check or money should not be inclosed in the envelope containing the bid or estimate, but should be either inclosed in a separate envelope addressed to the head of the Department, President or Board, or submitted personally upon the presentation of the bid or estimate.

For particulars as to the quantity and quality of the supplies, or the nature and extent of the work, reference must be made to the specifications, schedules, plans, etc., on file in the said office of the President, Board or Department.

No bid shall be accepted from or contract awarded to any person who is in arrears to The City of New York upon debt or contract, or who is a defaulter, as surety or otherwise, upon any obligation to the City.

The contract must be bid for separately. The right is reserved in each case to reject all bids or estimates if it is deemed to be for the interest of the City so to do. Bidders will write out the amount of their bids or estimates in addition to inserting the same in figures. Bidders are requested to make their bids or estimates upon the blank forms prepared and furnished by the City, a copy of which, with the proper envelope in which to inclose the bid, together with a copy of the contract, including the specifications, in the form approved by the Corporation Counsel, can be obtained upon application therefor at the office of the Department for which the work is to be done. Plans and drawings of construction work may also be seen there.
