In order to support a concentration of cultural uses and
public open spaces in the C6-2 District bounded by Flatbush
Avenue, Hanson Place, St. Felix Street and Lafayette
Avenue, for #buildings# intended to be occupied in whole or
in part by cultural uses, the City Planning Commission may
permit the maximum #community facility floor area ratio# to
be increased from 6.5 to 7.0, may permit modifications of the
special #street wall# location regulations of Section 101-41,
and the height and setback regulations of Section 23-632 as
applied to the #residential# portion of a #building#, and
modifications of applicable #sign# regulations in accordance
with this Section. For the purposes of this Section 101-81,
