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NYC EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT BRINGS MOBILE OFFICE TO HARLEM ON AUGUST 25

NYC Emergency Management is opening mobile offices throughout all five boroughs in the month of August

August 24, 2015 – New York City Emergency Management officials will visit Harlem on Tuesday, August 25, to discuss emergency preparedness, coordination, and planning with residents. NYC Emergency Management staff members will open a mobile office at Adam Clayton Powell Jr. State Office Building at 125th Street and Adam Clayton Powell Jr. Boulevard from 11 AM to 3 PM, and will give residents the opportunity to learn more about the agency's role in educating and preparing New Yorkers for emergencies. With the 2015 hurricane season well underway, emergency managers will provide tips to help the community prepare for hurricane season.

"NYC Emergency Management works tirelessly every day to keep New Yorkers safe and informed," said NYC Emergency Management Commissioner Joseph Esposito. "Our mobile office hours are a new way for New Yorkers to meet and get to know the emergency managers coordinating emergency responses in New York City."

"When disaster strikes, New Yorkers should be prepared and well educated for the situation," said Council Speaker Melissa Mark-Viverito. "By bringing their mobile office to Harlem, the Office of Emergency Management is giving members of this community the chance to be ready for any crisis. I encourage everyone to make use of this opportunity and visit this mobile office in Harlem."

Residents will also learn how they can join New York City Community Emergency Response Teams (CERT), a program consisting of more than 2,000 volunteers dedicated to helping their communities during emergencies.

NYC Emergency Management's mobile office visited Monsignor Del Valle Square in Hunts Point, The Bronx, on August 4, the Red Hook Library in Brooklyn on August 6, Rockaway Beach, Queens, on August 12, Joyce Kilmer Park in The Bronx on August 14, and Staten Island Borough Hall on August 18.
