IN BOARD OF BUILDINGS, JUNE 19, 1901.

Present—Commissioners Wallace, Guilfoyle and Campbell.

The minutes of the meeting of June 12, 1901, were read and, on motion, approved.

Petitions were submitted for approval, as follows:

Plan 404, New Buildings, 1901, Manhattan and The Bronx—Petition to allow walls to be built 77 feet in height, without increasing thickness of same, viz.: top of first tier of beams to top of fourth tier, 16 inches thick, laid in lime and cement mortar, height of this portion being 32 feet, and from thence to top 12 inches thick, laid in lime mortar to a height of 45 feet, as stated in petition; southeast corner Hamilton place and One Hundred and Forty-fourth street. Petitioner, George J. Ebert. Approved.

Plan 1130, New Buildings, 1901, Manhattan and The Bronx—Petition to allow walls of second and third stories of extension, and south wall of third story of main building to be built 8 inches thick, as stated in petition; west side Hamilton terrace, 80 feet south One Hundred and Forty-fourth street. Petitioner, Louis C. Hahn. Laid over.

Plan 1307, New Buildings, 1900, Manhattan and The Bronx—Petition to allow filling for depth of beams between uprights of fire and air stud partitions, with incombustible material to be omitted, as stated in petition; southwest corner Eighty-sixth street and Amsterdam avenue. Petitioner, Hill & Stout. Approved.

Plan 684, New Buildings, 1898, Manhattan and The Bronx—Petition to allow the two buildings commenced in September, 1898, in accordance with plans and applications filed in the Department, to be completed as stated in petition; Nos. 327 and 329 East Ninety-seventh street. Petitioner, Haerendyger & Straub. Referred to President.

Plan 437, New Buildings, 1901, Manhattan and The Bronx—Petition to allow walls of two upper stories of building to be built 16 inches in thickness in place of 20 inches and 16 inches as stated in petition; Nos. 407 Brame street and No. 252 Centre street. Petitioner, August Trenchmann. Approved.

Plan 1355, New Buildings, 1901, Manhattan and The Bronx—Petition to allow the J. W. Rapp system of fireproof floor construction to be used, viz.: Sidewalk arches, type "A," segmental construction 4-inch brick arch, first floor, type "B," segmental construction 2½-inch brick arch and mezzanine floor and stair-halls, type "D," flat construction, as stated in petition; No. 316 Fifth avenue. Petitioner, John W. Rapp. Referred to President.

Plan 520, New Buildings, 1901, Manhattan and The Bronx—Petition for a reconsideration of decision of the Board of Buildings at a meeting held April 15, 1901, so as to allow frame ice storage buildings to be constructed, same to be fireproofed with sheet-iron covering an outside, as stated in petition; west side River avenue, 500 feet north of One Hundred and Fiftieth street. Petitioner, W. C. Dickerson. Approved.

Plan 1189, New Buildings, 1901, Manhattan and The Bronx—Petition to allow a one-story structure to be erected of angle and tee iron, to be used as a flower and fruit stand; same will be independent of main corner building and will be inclosed with corrugated sheet-iron and will be set on 8-inch thick stone base blocks, as stated in petition; southwest corner St. Mark's place and First avenue. Petitioner, Schneider & Horner. Referred to President.

Plan 575, New Buildings, 1900, Manhattan and The Bronx—Petition to allow fire-escape to be placed in rear of building extending from first to ninth story, instead of circular stairway, approved August 22, 1900; fire-escape balcony in east court of first story to be extended to door opening at head of stairs to basement in main hall; also to allow window opening in basement, west court, to be cut down for a doorway and to connect new passage with main hall in basement, all as shown on plans and as stated in petition; Nos. 132 and 134 West Forty-seventh street. Petitioner, Ralph S. Townsend. Laid over.

Plan 1182, New Buildings, 1901, Manhattan and The Bronx—Petition to allow one-story frame pocket to be constructed, as shown on plans and as stated in petition; east side of Seventh avenue, 50 feet west of One Hundred and Fifty-first street. Petitioner, William J. Fryer. Approved.

Plan 571, New Buildings, 1901, Manhattan and The Bronx—Petition for a reconsideration of decision of the Board of Buildings at a meeting held May 22, 1901, so as to allow pent-houses on roof to be constructed of steel channels and I beams, filled in with 4-inch terra cotta blocks, as stated in petition; northeast corner Fifty-eighth street and Sixth avenue. Petitioner, Robert T. Lyons. Approved.

Plan 2053, New Buildings, 1899, Manhattan and The Bronx—Petition to allow building in accordance with plans and application filed in the Department, to be completed as stated in petition; southwest corner Park row and Baxter street. Petitioner, William H. Boylan. Approved.

Plan 1073, Alterations to Buildings, 1901, Manhattan and The Bronx—Petition to allow walls to be built of less thickness than required by law; also to allow building to cover a larger percentage of lot, all as stated in petition; No. 987 Madison avenue. Petitioner, Cleverdon & Putzel. Referred to President.

Plan 889, Alterations to Buildings, 1901, Manhattan and The Bronx—Petition to allow vent shaft to ventilate new proposed water-closet compartments, to be constructed of angle iron, filled in between with 4-inch brickwork, covered with 1-inch Portland cement on outside and with three coats plaster work on inside; bottom of shaft will have 4-inch brickwork laid between angle irons, with 2-inch Portland cement on top, as stated in petition; No. 278 Mott street. Petitioner, A. G. Reclin. Approved.

Plan 1135, Alterations to Buildings, 1901, Manhattan and The Bronx—Petition to allow present 12-inch side walls at front portion of building to be raised to a height of 52 feet 6 inches above curb, and rear portion of building to a height of 50 feet 6 inches, without lining basement walls, as stated in petition; No. 270 East Broadway. Petitioner, Max Muller. Referred to President.

Plan 1112, Alterations to Buildings, 1901, Manhattan and The Bronx—Petition to allow existing 12-inch northerly independent wall above basement to be used, wall being reinforced by present chimney breasts, present fire-places of chimneys will be filled in with brick, laid in cement, as stated in petition; No. 25 Lafayette place. Petitioner, Charles I. Berg. Approved.

Plan 1410, Alterations to Buildings, 1901, Manhattan and The Bronx—Petition to allow additional story, 10 feet high, to be built on 8-inch wall without increasing thickness of same, as stated in petition; No. 268 West Seventy-second street. Petitioner, W. E. D. Stukes. Approved.

Plan 1326, Alterations to Buildings, 1901, Manhattan and The Bronx—Petition to allow extension of blue-print room on roof of Forty-second street facade to be constructed of 1 channel-beams for trussing of sides and roof, and filled in between with hollow fireproof blocks, as stated in petition; Forty-second street, Park and Vanderbilt avenues, Grand Central Station. Petitioner, Morgan M. O'Brien. Approved.

Plan 1353, Alterations to Buildings, 1901, Manhattan and The Bronx—Petition to allow fourth or attic story to be raised to form a full height story, without lining present 12-inch party walls, as stated in petition; No. 42 East Ninth street. Petitioner, William H. Hume & Son. Approved.

Plan 1313, Alterations to Buildings, 1901, Manhattan and The Bronx—Petition to allow 12-inch walls in northerly and westerly sides to be built to a height of 56 feet, thereby increasing

the height of building in front portion, as stated in petition; No. 51 Washington square, South. Petitioner, John B. Sunk & Sons. Approved.

Plan 1208, Alterations to Buildings, 1901, Manhattan and The Bronx—Petition to allow building to be built as shown on plans, and for the purposes stated in application, as stated in petition; northwest corner One Hundred and Seventh street and Lexington avenue. Petitioner, William T. Keogh. Approved as amended.

Plan 1210, Alterations to Buildings, 1901, Manhattan and The Bronx—Petition to allow fire-escape to be erected and to be inclosed with galvanized iron and wood sash glazed, as stated in petition; No. 7 East Forty-eighth street. Petitioner, Raleigh C. Gildersleeve. Approved, on condition that the proposed stairway be built of iron surrounded with an inclosure of iron and wire-glass construction; no wood to be used.

Plan 1224, Alterations to Buildings, 1901, Manhattan and The Bronx—Petition to allow roof to be constructed of 3½-inch T irons, 18 inches apart, resting on iron girders and on the T irons to rest 3-inch by 18-inch by 12-inch hollow porous terra cotta roofing blocks; on the blocks, a bedding of concrete, and on the concrete 6-inch by 10-inch by 1-inch hard roofing tile will be laid in Portland cement; ceiling will be hung with small angle irons, as stated in petition; No. 17 West Forty-fourth street. Petitioner, Henry Rutgers Marshall. Approved, on condition that construction conform to statement made by applicant June 17, 1901.

Plan 1019, Alterations to Buildings, 1901, Manhattan and The Bronx—Petition to allow an additional story to be built by supporting the floor loads on steel, 12-inch, 32 pounds per foot, girders resting on 8-inch steel I beams, 18 pounds per square foot, as columns, to be supported from deflection sideways by ¾-inch iron expansion bolts secured to the brick walls, same to have suitable connection plates, caps and bases, as stated in petition; north side Fifty-fourth street, 175 feet east of Seventh avenue. Petitioner, J. C. Smith. Approved, on condition that columns and girders conform to the requirements of the law as to strength, dimensions and construction.

On motion of Commissioner Guilfoyle, the Secretary was directed to address a communication to Hon. John Whalen, Corporation Counsel, requesting him to advise the Board of Buildings as to its power, under section 650 of the Charter, to modify section 109 of the Building Code, or any part thereof.

Copy of a resolution adopted by the Board of Aldermen relative to the use of room in the Town Hall, Jamaica, Borough of Queens, by the Department of Buildings, was received and referred to Commissioner Campbell.

A communication was received from the Lead Lined Iron Pipe Company, requesting that a representative of this Department be present at the Convention of the American Water Works Association, to be held at the Murray Hill Hotel, to inspect their lead lined iron pipe. Which was ordered on file.

The President presented a report on the application of the Allgum Company. Which was ordered on file.

On motion, the Board then adjourned.
