Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law (2)	Agency employee improperly disclosed identifying information to a member of the public.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law (2)	Agency employee improperly disclosed identifying information to members of the public.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law (4)	Agency employee improperly disclosed identifying information to a third party.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law (2)	Agency employee improperly disclosed identifying information to a third party using a personal electronic device.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law	Agency employee improperly sent an electronic message containing identifying information to a third party.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law	Agency employee inadvertently disclosed client identifying information to a state agency.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law	Agency employee inadvertently emailed a document containing identifying information to a third party.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law	Agency employee inadvertently emailed identifying information to a member of the public.

Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law	Agency employee inadvertently left client documents containing identifying information on public transportation.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law	Agency employee inadvertently mailed a document containing client identifying information to another client.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law	Agency employee posted a photo containing client identifying information on a personal social media account.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law (3)	Agency improperly disclosed identifying information to another city agency.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law	Agency inadvertently disclosed city employees' identifying information to members of the public.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law	Agency inadvertently disclosed identifying information to another city agency.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law	Agency inadvertently disclosed identifying information to a member of the public.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law	Agency inadvertently disclosed identifying information to contractors due to a technical error.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law	Contractor experienced a security incident resulting in disclosure of identifying information to a third party.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law	Contractor inadvertently disclosed identifying information due to a technical error.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law	Contractor inadvertently emailed a document containing client identifying information to another contractor.
