## STATEMENT OF WORK PERFORMED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF PARKS OF THE BOROUGH OF BROOKLYN AND QUEENS DURING THE THREE MONTHS FROM APRIL 1 TO JUNE 30, 1905.

The quarter beginning April 1 and ending June 30, 1905, was an unusually busy period in the Department. The greater part of the planting, sodding and seeding which the parks require, is done during that season, and the extensive repairs necessitated by the winter's storms are also attended to at that time of the year. I regret to say that the damage to trees, plants and shrubbery caused by the intensely cold weather and heavy snowfalls of last winter have turned out to be even greater than was anticipated earlier in the spring. A low estimate places the loss in pines, spruces and other evergreens in Prospect Park alone at over three hundred. It will be years before this damage is completely repaired.

## Prospect Park.

The work of replacing the wornout soil and recovering bare and unsightly spots on the lawns and in plantations was continued and is still being carried on. It is estimated that upwards of six thousand cubic yards of new soil was spread, seeded, watered and otherwise looked after. Sodds aggregating forty-five thousand square feet were laid in various portions of the park, and at the close of the quarter the lawns and plantations present a very satisfactory condition. The roads throughout the park had suffered severely during the winter and early spring storms, and extensive repairs had to be undertaken. This work is still in progress and will be carried on throughout the summer. The gutters adjoining the drives in numerous parts of the park were originally built of antiquated material, intended for temporary use. It has long been realized that the same should be rebuilt, and a more satisfactory material used in the construction. The work was started as soon as weather conditions permitted. The material used is paving brick, laid on a substantial concrete foundation. The effect is certainly pleasing, and I have no doubt as to its durability. The work of repairing the asphalt walks, a contract for which was let last year, was resumed in May and is progressing satisfactorily. It is expected that the same will be completed by the middle of July.

The remodeling of the grounds surrounding the Flower Garden Shelter was continued and is now practically finished. The roadway leading up to the building, was flanked on either side by brick gutters and the roadbed constructed of Hudson river road gravel. Two new storm sheds and a brick retaining wall in the rear of the building were completed; adequate drainage was provided by the construction of a number of catch basins and the laying of sufficient drain pipe to connect the same with the park drainage system.

The bridle paths, which were found to be in bad condition after the winter, were thoroughly overhauled, gravel, sand and loam were spread wherever necessary, and all stones which had worked to the surface were collected and removed. The section of the drive and bridle path along the southerly border of the park was regularly flooded after each storm, a number of days sometimes being required to free this section of the water. I decided to raise this portion of the system of drives for a distance of about one thousand feet, and the work of doing so is nearly completed. About six hundred truck loads of sand and loam were deposited on the bridle path, and the roadway is being built up of Hudson river road gravel. Six new catch basins were constructed and about three hundred feet of drain pipe laid. The completion of this work will eliminate one of the few remaining unsightly spots in Prospect Park.

The buildings scattered through the park required extensive repairs, which were made without delay.

The lake system of Prospect Park at the beginning of the spring season was found to be in filthy condition, caused by the large number of people congregating on the ice during the skating period. The snow had been piled against the banks, and when the ice broke up, carried large quantities of dirt with it. A large force of men was put to work making repairs, paving the banks, sodding the edges and giving the lake a thorough cleaning.

The grounds surrounding the Grecian shelter on the South Lake drive were graded and covered with a thick layer of top-soil. Unfortunately the season was too far advanced before this work could be finished, and the anticipated floral display at this place had to be postponed for another season.

The usual maintenance work such as cleaning drives, walks, gutters and basins was carried on in a systematic manner and the grass was cut at regular intervals.

Picnic parties in Prospect Park during the spring season have been more numerous than ever before, and the resultant work of cleaning the grounds, especially after the Saturday and Sunday crowds, has attained such proportions that a larger appropriation for the maintenance of this popular resort will be needed next year in order to maintain the park in its usual attractive condition.

Floral displays were had in the Flower Garden, Vale of Cashmere, the Rose Garden and the Old-fashioned Flower Garden, all of these places being visited by thousands of admirers.

The menagerie was considerably enlarged, a new eagle cage of adequate proportions and attractive design has been added to the group of our houses. The grounds in the neighborhood of the bear cage were graded, cleaned, and a series of walks laid out. It is the intention to pave these with asphalt tiles and plant the surroundings.

The Department has been very fortunate in obtaining a collection of rare palms, orchids and flowering plants, formerly the property of the late William A. Brown of Flatbush. This collection was purchased by authority of the Board of Aldermen for the sum of seventy-five hundred dollars, and the entire collection was safely housed in the greenhouses at Prospect Park.

The present boat-house in Prospect Park has long been inadequate for present purposes. I have had plans and specifications prepared to erect a new building of sufficient size, near the site of the present one, and expect that work thereon will be started during the summer.

## Forest Park.

The new golf links, as anticipated, were formally opened on Decoration Day, and attracted a large crowd of golfers. Since then the golf grounds have been kept in a satisfactory and attractive condition, and are a source of great pleasure to a considerable number of our citizens. The trees and shrubbery fronting on the drives were pruned, and the roads and walks repaired wherever necessary. They now are in excellent condition. The work of finishing and enlarging the nursery was continued during the season, and a large number of plants and cuttings were propagated.

A design for a commodious and artistic shelter for golfers and picnickers has been prepared, approved by the Art Commission, and the work is now being advertised. The shelter is expected to be completed and ready for occupancy by the beginning of next season.

## Highland Park.

A new flower garden was created in the northerly portion of Highland Park which was formerly a swamp. It was reclaimed during the past winter and spring and adds greatly to the beauty of the park. About four thousand shrubs, trees and plants were set out, walks were constructed, a drainage and irrigation system installed and the entire garden surrounded with a gravel walk. A number of granite steps were built, connecting the garden with the adjoining driveway. The plaza surrounding the music stand was extended, graded and graveled. The drives and walks were repaired, rolled and supplied with a coating of top-dressing, so that they are now in

excellent condition. Top-soil was spread on the slopes surrounding the pond and the music stand, and over fifteen thousand square feet of sods, only part of which were purchased, were laid.

## Sunset Park.

The work of transforming the recent addition to Sunset Park was resumed as soon as the weather conditions were favorable and the work is progressing in a very satisfactory manner. Fifteen hundred cubic yards of top-soil were purchased and spread where required. A number of new walks were laid out and graded and the edges sodded, about eight thousand square feet of sods being laid. Repairs were made to the banks and slopes of the older portion of this park, and the lake was thoroughly cleaned.

## Seaside Park.

The timber jetty on the beach fronting the park was completed and accepted by the Department early in May. It has proven so far of great benefit to the beach, and the sand which was formerly washed away is now rapidly accumulating on both sides of the jetty, adding materially to the area of available beach.

The shelter-houses were overhauled and a new foundation of piling built under the large open shelter.

About fifteen hundred cubic yards of good top soil was purchased for this park, part of which was used in the laying out of flower beds and the planting of trees.

The display of spring flowers and shrubs was unusually attractive and was considered one of the finest in the Greater City. The walks in and surrounding the park were thoroughly repaired and a large amount of sodding done. A number of trees were planted and a quantity of shrubbery transplanted.

## Fort Greene Park.

Repairs to the walks, slopes and lawns were completed. Several thousand cubic yards of top soil were furnished on contract and spread where required. Sodding and seeding were carried on to a large extent throughout the park and is still in progress. A display of spring flowering plants and shrubs was given both in the park and on the plaza fronting it, which was greatly admired by the people.

A contract has been awarded for the repairs to the stone wall surrounding this park, and I expect that work thereon will be started forthwith.

Plans and specifications for the erection of a new shelter and comfort house in this park have been prepared, and the work is now being advertised. I expect to see the same completed by October 1, when the present unsightly and dilapidated building can be removed.

## Red Hook Park.

The work of recoating the surface of this park as far as it was intended to do the same this spring, has been completed. Twelve hundred cubic yards of good top soil have been delivered, spread and seeded. The edges near the walks have been sodded and trees and shrubbery attended to. It is planned to treat the remainder of the park in a similar manner next fall, so as to have the entire park in the best possible condition.

## Institute Park.

Institute Park, adjoining Prospect Park to the east, has suffered severely during the past winter. Many of the young trees and shrubs have been killed by the frost and will have to be replaced. The lake, the walks and the lawns were cleaned and the necessary pruning and cultivating done among the trees and shrubbery.

## Parade Ground.

The parade ground, used during the proper seasons for baseball, football, cricket and bowling, was placed in good condition as soon as the weather permitted. It is being patronized by baseball and other clubs to its full capacity.

Designs for a new athletic building and police station to take the place of the ramshackle structures now serving that purpose have been prepared and the work will shortly be advertised. It is the intention to have this building ready for use by the beginning of next season.

## Carroll Park.

Carroll Park is in fine condition. The requisite quantity of top soil was provided and used, trees and shrubbery have been cleaned and pruned, and the walks repaired where needed. Plans have been approved for the construction of a new comfort station of ornamental design, work on which will be started in July.

## City Park.

This small park, adjoining the navy yard at Flushing avenue, is probably the hardest to maintain of all the parks in the system. It is patronized by a large number of adults as well as children, and the wear and tear is extraordinary. A number of new trees were planted and the older ones pruned, cleaned and made as attractive as possible. The walks were repaired and made ready for a new coating of asphaltum. The lawns were leveled, rolled and cut as required.

## Tompkins Park.

Tompkins Park was given a thorough overhauling during the early spring and summer season, and now looks its best. Repairs to walks, sidewalks, fences and buildings were made where needed and a new lighting system installed.

## Saratoga and Irving Squares.

Saratoga and Irving Square Parks were both restored to good condition after the severe winter. All the necessary repairs to fences, walks, basins and sidewalks were made. Quite a few dead trees were taken up and replaced, and the shrubbery pruned. A floral display was given in both parks during the spring season.

A shelter and comfort house has been designed for Irving square, and work thereon will shortly be started.

## Bushwick, Winthrop and Cooper Parks.

Bushwick, Winthrop and Cooper Parks were carefully gone over, repairs made to gutters, walks, sidewalks, fences and buildings, worn places in the lawns were sodded and new trees planted in each. The shrubbery and older trees were pruned and cleaned, and at present look attractive.

Contracts for the erection of new shelter and comfort houses in Bushwick and Cooper Parks are now being advertised, and it is expected the work of construction of these buildings will begin at once.

## Bedford Park.

Bedford Park has been put in satisfactory condition during the quarter just past. The walks were regraded and coated with limestone. The lawns were repaired and rolled, worn spots were sodded and seeded, and the shrubbery and trees trimmed. This park in former years suffered greatly from the lack of water, and a new irrigation system was installed to remedy this condition. Work on the construction of an ornamental and substantial comfort house, accommodating both men and women, will shortly be begun, a contract for the erection of the same being now in the course of execution.

Canarsie, Dyker Beach, Fort Hamilton, Bensonhurst and McKinley Parks were given the usual attention. The roads, walks, buildings, fences and sidewalks were repaired, the trees, shrubs and lawns given a thorough overhauling, and all the park put in an attractive condition.

Fort Hamilton and McKinley Parks received special attention, some one hundred and fifty trees and a considerable number of shrubs being planted in these two parks.

## Playgrounds.

The playground in Williamsburg Park and New Lots Playground were supplied with new apparatus and the paraphernalia required. Buildings were repaired and painted, and the grounds cleaned and resurfaced.

The work of establishing two new playgrounds, one under the Williamsburg Bridge, the other in Canarsie Park, is under way. Arrangements are being made to have the same opened to the public some time in August.

## Parkways.

Ocean Parkway—The work of repairing and resurfacing portions of the roadways, bridle path and cycle paths was promptly started as soon as the weather conditions permitted. A force of men and teams were employed in cleaning gutters, trimming the grass borders, cleaning and pruning the trees, and otherwise making the parkway presentable. The Department decided to rebuild the westerly traffic road between Bay parkway and Coney Island. Operations were started at the latter place, and are now in progress. The repaving work consists of the laying of a course of trap rock and screenings about five (5) inches in thickness on the old worn-out roadbed after the latter had been picked up with the steam roller and leveled off. This stretch, about twelve hundred feet in length, is completed, and work is progressing satisfac-



torily on the remaining section. The cycle paths were partly resurfaced with limestone screenings and given a thorough rolling. The main roadway was cleaned, repaired and otherwise put in good condition.

Fort Hamilton Avenue—This entire parkway was cleaned, weeds removed and the roadbed repaired where necessary.

Bay parkway was given a similar treatment.

Shore Road—The widening of the roadway along its narrowest parts, a contract for which was awarded last year, is progressing rapidly, and it is expected that it will be completed by the middle of August. The slopes of that portion of the road fronting on Fort Hamilton Park, which was rebuilt during last season, under contract, were sodded and provided with a new railing, about ten thousand square feet of sod being laid. The entire roadway was thoroughly overhauled, about two hundred and fifty cubic yards of screenings being spread and rolled.

Bay Ridge parkway was maintained in a manner that appealed to the people, the grass being cut, trees pruned, gutters cleaned and the roadway repaired and resurfaced where required.

Eastern Parkway and Extension—The most notable feature accomplished on the Eastern parkway during the quarter was the completion of the plaza and the erection of the ornamental stone work and bronze lamps surrounding the Slocum statue. The statue itself was unveiled on Decoration Day (May 30) with appropriate ceremonies, the President of the United States, the Mayor and a number of prominent officials and distinguished citizens being present and taking part. The roadway was repaired in many places and kept in a fairly clean and attractive condition. The traffic along the Eastern parkway has largely increased during the past year or two. The number of men and teams required for its maintenance had to be doubled in consequence.

A contract has been awarded to provide the Eastern parkway extension with concrete sidewalks, and orders issued to begin the work.

Glenmore, Pitkin, Bushwick, Pennsylvania and Stone avenues, all located in the same section of the City, although not parkways in any sense, had been turned over to the care of this Department by an Act of the Legislature some years ago. I made an effort to have these streets restored to the control of the Bureau of Highways where they properly belong, and had introduced a bill to that effect at Albany at the last session. It, however, failed of passage. Building operations to an unparalleled extent were carried on along these streets. The repairs have been numerous, and the force of men and teams required for maintaining, cleaning and sprinkling had to be very largely increased. The streets were kept as clean as circumstances would permit.

#### Music.

The concert season was opened in Prospect Park on Sunday, June 11, with music by the Fourteenth Regiment Band, Louis Conterno, conductor. It is estimated that twenty thousand people attended. On the following Sunday, June 18, a grand concert was given by the United German Singers of Brooklyn, assisted by the Twenty-third Regiment Band, Thomas F. Shannon, conductor. This concert was enjoyed by a multitude of people, despite the threatening weather.

Concerts were given at Highland and Fort Greene Parks on Sunday, June 25, in addition to the one at Prospect Park, where music is provided every Saturday and Sunday.

I have arranged for a concert at Highland Park every Sunday during the summer. This was deemed necessary because of the large population in the Bushwick and East New York sections, both of which adjoin the Park.

Music will be given in the smaller parks as frequently as funds will allow.

#### Revenue from Parks and Parkways.

During the three months from April 1 to June 30, 1905, inclusive, the sum of twenty-three thousand nine hundred and eighty-seven dollars and ninety-two cents (\$23,987.92) was received from rents of houses and revenue from park privileges, bay windows, etc., which amount was turned over to the Hon. Patrick Keenan, City Chamberlain, for deposit to the credit of the "Revenue Fund."

To allow a portion of the inclosing frame of the elevators to be filled with wire glass in metal frames as is shown on the drawings.

The wire glass to be used for a portion of the filling of the iron frame of the elevator shafts forms an effectual fire barrier, and its use is desirable in order to give light to the stairs which otherwise will be very dark. (See plan attached and section filed with amendment.)

Mr. Gilbert appeared before the Board.

That by using 6-inch terra cotta arches same can be sprung from wall to wall, having at least 4 inches on each side to rest on, thus the arch will be just as firm and secure as if iron beams had been used. The construction of arch shall be entirely lawful 6-inch terra cotta arches with 1/4 tie rods every 9 feet apart with washers, etc.; arch to have 1/4-inch rise to a foot, all as per law.

Mr. Howell appeared before the Board.

**AN ORDINANCE** granting to the Commonwealth Telephone Company the right and franchise to construct, operate and maintain in, upon and along the streets, highways and public places of The City of New York and the several boroughs thereof, wires, cables and other appliances proper and necessary for the purpose of carrying on a general telephone and telegraph business.

Be it Ordained by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment of The City of New York as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Estimate and Apportionment of The City of New York hereby grants to the Commonwealth Telephone Company the right, franchise and privilege of constructing, operating and maintaining its wires, cables or other electrical conductors, together with the poles, fixtures and other appliances proper and necessary in the telephone business, in said City, through, over, under and along any and all of the streets, avenues, squares, parks and other public places within the limits of The City of New York, for the purpose of conducting a general telephone and telegraph business and for no other purpose; subject, nevertheless, to all the express terms and conditions hereinafter particularly set forth.

Sec. 2. The franchise hereby granted shall exist and continue for a term of twenty-five years from the date of this ordinance; subject, nevertheless, to a renewal and extension thereof for such further period as may be lawful and authorized by this Board upon a valuation thereof and of the lines and property then owned by the grantee or its successor, such value to be established either by arbitrators to be mutually selected and agreed upon by and between the said grantee or its successor and the municipal authorities of The City of New York, then authorized by law to regulate, grant and determine public franchises, or, in the event of failure or inability to fix and establish such a valuation by arbitration, then same to be fixed either by judicial proceeding or in such manner as may be otherwise provided and established by law. For the purpose of fixing and establishing the valuation of the property and franchises contemplated by this ordinance, together with any extension thereof, within the said City of New York, and also for the purpose of determining the amount of earnings of the grantee hereunder and of fixing the proportion thereof payable to the said City of New York, the books, papers and corporate records of the said grantee shall at all times be open to the full inspection and examination of the Comptroller of The City of New York and of his subordinates thereunto specifically authorized.

Upon the expiration of the franchise hereby granted or of any extension thereof which may be hereafter made, The City of New York shall have the right to acquire for itself all the plant and property of the grantee or its successor in the streets, avenues, highways and public places of The City of New York, upon just compensation, to be established as hereinbefore specified.

Sec. 3. The rates for telephone service within the said City of New York which may be lawfully charged and collected by the said grantee or its successor are hereby fixed as follows; subject only to modification by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment of The City of New York, but no change in the said rates shall be made within the period of five years from the date of this ordinance:

First—For telephone service contracted or paid for by the message and for toll service between the boroughs of said City:

For a call not exceeding five minutes in duration by connections wholly within any single borough of said City, not exceeding five cents.

For a call not exceeding five minutes in duration by connections between any two boroughs of said City, the boundaries of which are contiguous, not exceeding ten cents.

For a call not exceeding five minutes in duration by connections between any two boroughs of said City, the boundaries of which are not contiguous, not exceeding fifteen cents.

For the purpose of defining said boundaries between boroughs of said City all waterways intervening between boroughs shall be regarded as though the same did not exist.

Second—For telephone service contracted or paid for without limit as to number of messages per annum:

For business places within the Borough of Manhattan, not exceeding \$90 per annum.

For business places within the boroughs of Brooklyn and The Bronx, not exceeding \$75 per annum.

For business places within the boroughs of Queens and Richmond, not exceeding \$60 per annum.

For residences within the Borough of Manhattan, not exceeding \$50 per annum.

For residences within the boroughs of Brooklyn and The Bronx, not exceeding \$40 per annum.

For residences within the boroughs of Queens and Richmond, not exceeding \$30 per annum.

Sec. 4. In consideration of the grant of this franchise, the grantee or its successor shall render service and make payments to the said City of New York as follows:

First—It shall furnish for the exclusive use of said City and of the officers thereof, upon municipal business, free telephone stations connected with its exchanges as follows: In the Borough of Manhattan 300; in the Borough of Brooklyn 200; in the Borough of The Bronx 100; in the Borough of Queens 100; in the Borough of Richmond 50; service at each and all of said stations to be without charge to The City of New York for communications and connections wholly within a single borough of said City; service by connections between stations in different boroughs to be at 50 per cent. of the rates hereinbefore fixed for toll connections between the said boroughs.

## NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS.

## GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS.

The person or persons making a bid or estimate for any services, work, materials or supplies for The City of New York, or for any of its departments, bureaus or offices, shall furnish the same in a sealed envelope, indorsed with the title of the supplies, materials, work or services for which the bid or estimate is made, with his or their name or names and the date of presentation to the President or Board or to the head of the Department at his or its office, on or before the date and hour named in the advertisement for the same, at which time and place the estimates received will be publicly opened by the President or Board or head of said Department and read, and the award of the contract made according to law as soon thereafter as practicable.

Each bid or estimate shall contain the name and place of residence of the person making the same, and names of all persons interested with him therein, and, if no other person be so interested, it shall distinctly state that fact; also, that it is made without any connection with any other person making an estimate for the same purpose, and is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud, and that no member of the Board of Aldermen, head of a department, chief of a bureau, deputy thereof, or clerk therein, or other officer of The City of New York is, shall be or become interested, directly or indirectly, as contracting party, partner, stockholder, surety or otherwise in or in the performance of the contract, or in the supplies, work or business to which it relates, or in any portion of the profits thereof. The bid or estimate must be verified by the oath, in writing, of the party or parties making the estimate that the several matters stated herein are in all respects true.

Each bid or estimate shall be accompanied by the consent, in writing, of two householders or freeholders in The City of New York, or of a guaranty or surety company duly authorized by law to act as surety, and shall contain the matters set forth in the blank forms mentioned below.

No bid or estimate will be considered unless, as a condition precedent to the reception or consideration of any proposal, it be accompanied by a certified check upon one of the State or National banks of The City of New York, drawn to the order of the Comptroller, or money to the amount of five per centum of the amount of the bond required, as provided in section 420 of the Greater New York Charter.

The certified check or money should not be inclosed in the envelope containing the bid or estimate, but should be either inclosed in a separate envelope addressed to the head of the Department, President or Board, or submitted personally upon the presentation of the bid or estimate.

For particulars as to the quantity and quality of the supplies, or the nature and extent of the work, reference must be made to the specifications, schedules, plans, etc., on file in the said office of the President, Board or Department.

No bid shall be accepted from or contract awarded to any person who is in arrears to The City of New York upon debt or contract, or who is a defaulter, as surety or otherwise, upon any obligation to the City.

The contract must be bid for separately. The right is reserved in each case to reject all bids or estimates if it is deemed to be for the interest of the City so to do.

Bidders will write out the amount of their bids or estimates in addition to inserting the same in figures.

Bidders are requested to make their bids or estimates upon the blank forms prepared and furnished by the City, a copy of which, with the proper envelope in which to inclose the bid, together with a copy of the contract, including the specifications, in the form approved by the Corporation Counsel, can be obtained upon application therefor at the office of the Department for which the work is to be done. Plans and drawings of construction work may also be seen there.
