
Message From The Fire Commissioner

he Emergency Medical Service is a vital component of the New York City Fire Department and, today, we honor the accomplishments of those FDNY EMS members who have gone beyond the call of duty. The men and women being honored today come from a variety of different backgrounds, but they are all united by a steadfast commitment to serving the people of New York City.

By joining the Emergency Medical Service, our Paramedics and EMTs become part of a tradition that dates back to the 1870s—a tradition of providing the best available pre-hospital care to the people who need it most. 

EMT Ronald J. Johnson

Ronald J. Johnson was appointed to EMS on February 20, 1990. Assigned to Station 8, Bellevue. He resides in New Jersey, with his wife, Nilda, who also is an EMT, assigned to Station 4.

s many veteran EMTs and Paramedics can vouch, sometimes the way a person calls into the Emergency 9-1-1 system what he *thinks* happened, versus the way an emergency assignment is *presented* to the responding EMTs, versus what those EMTs *actually find* at the location of the emergency assignment can be quite different. And so it was on the bitterly cold evening of January 16, 2004, at 1827 hours in Manhattan.

Among the many calls to follow to 9-1-1, one caller said that an unconscious woman had been bitten by a dog. Another said an unconscious female had been shot. And so it went, one confusing 9-1-1 phone call after another, for the

same patient, at the same location.

One thing, though, was certain. An unconscious woman at East 11th Street and First Avenue needed emergency medical care immediately.

EMT Ronald Johnson carefully and safely made his way through the icy streets of New York City on that winter evening. When he arrived on the scene, he encountered an unconscious female who was in cardiac arrest. EMT Johnson knew this was no ordinary call. He quickly questioned bystanders to see if anyone had witnessed the incident.

He learned that the patient had been walking her dog. She was tying the dog's leash to the parking meter when she was electrocuted, causing her to collapse. The EMT discovered that the patient still was in contact with a manhole cover, an area of conductivity.

EMT Johnson quickly assessed the situation. He used his long board to remove the patient, thus avoiding contact with the electrical source. He immediately began CPR and transported the patient to the nearest hospital.

In spite of his quick and valiant efforts, the victim expired at the hospital a short time later.

For his unselfish and meritorious action, the Christopher J. Prescott Medal for 2004 is proudly awarded to EMT Ronald J. Johnson.--*TDM*

Tracy Allen-Lee Medal

Paramedic Joseph R. Losquadro

Joseph R. Losquadro was appointed to EMS in February of 1989. Assigned to Station 57. Previously worked in EMS Station 46 and Emergency Medical Dispatch. He is the recipient of the Certificate of Merit--Excellent Duty and numerous pre-hospital saves. He is a member of the Centereach Fire Department, where he received the Medal of Honor. He resides in Centereach, Long Island, with his wife, Pam, their sons, Tom and Matt, and their daughter, Gianna.

York City, EMS personnel are confronted with various circumstances and environments that occasionally require independent action and initiative far exceeding their primary mission. Just such an incident occurred during the early afternoon of September 9, 2004.

The Brooklyn ambulance crew of unit 35Z2, staffed by Paramedics Joseph Losquadro and Abraham Englard, were dispatched at 1315 hours from their cross street location of Metropolitan and Union Avenues to a call for a trauma. The location of the call was at a construction site at 1355 St. Marks Avenue.

Arriving within six minutes, the crew was briefed by the FDNY Incident Commander regarding a trench rescue. Paramedic Losquadro immediately entered the trench where Firefighters and police officers had been actively digging and using a bag-valve-mask in a desperate attempt to get air to the male victim, who was buried nearly to the top of his head in the dirt.

Employing specialized training in collapse medicine that he received from the FDNY Special Operations Command, Paramedic Losquadro was able to successfully perform endotracheal intubation on the patient while he was still buried in the trench. The intubation provided high-concentration

oxygen to the trapped worker. The medic remained in the unsafe and unstable trench with his patient for nearly 40 minutes until the patient was removed by Firefighters who had been shoring up the caved-in area.

Subjecting himself to great personal risk, Paramedic Losquadro assisted in the trench cave-in rescue. He is commended for his quick thinking and courageous act. In spite of the coordinated and Herculean efforts by all, the victim ultimately died.

The Department proudly awards Paramedic Joseph R. Losquadro with the Tracy Allen-Lee Medal for 2004.-- *BM*

EMT Jerry Bond

Ellis Williams was appointed to EMS on August 30, 2001. Assigned to Station 44. He attended Kingsborough College. He resides in Brooklyn.

Jerry Bond was appointed to EMS on April 15, 1996. Assigned to Station 44. He attended Aeronautics College. He is the recipient of the Excellent Duty with Merit award. He resides in Brooklyn.

n a bright, sunny Monday afternoon, September 6, 2004, EMS unit 37A3 was just coming off the first assignment of its tour in the Brownsville section of Brooklyn. EMTs Ellis Williams and Jerry Bond were off on what they thought would be a routine day of work.

On their way back to their area of response, the crew noticed a large plume of smoke about a block from their location. EMTs Williams and Bond alerted the Brooklyn dispatcher of a possible fire and responded to the scene. They were confronted with a heavy volume of smoke and visible flames engulfing the three-story multiple dwelling. Civilians alerted the EMTs that a man and child possibly

were trapped inside the building.

EMS members are not routinely trained to operate in these kinds of dangerous environments. They do not have the protective equipment or the advanced training that would allow them to work at scenes with serious life hazards that often are associated with fires, such as intense heat, flames, smoke and other dangerous conditions.

With no firefighting personnel onscene and without regard for his own safety, EMT Williams ran into the building. Following the sounds of the victim's pleas for help, he crawled to the second floor and began searching. Within a few minutes, the intense heat and heavy smoke forced the EMT back out to the street, where his partner informed him that the trapped victim had jumped from the burning building.

Outside the fire building, EMT Bond already had begun to treat patients at the scene, while EMT Williams assisted the other victims from an adjoining building as they fled the heavy smoke condition.

Without the selflessness, rapid action and teamwork displayed by EMTs Williams and Bond, the outcome might have been far worse. Only one civilian patient suffered a minor injury and did not even have to be transported to the hospital. For their exemplary actions, EMTs Ellis Williams and Jerry Bond are presented with the Chief James Scullion Medal for 2004.--*JO*

EMT Erin P. Doyle

Charles J. Forchelli was appointed to EMS on June 9, 2000. Assigned to Station 50. He resides on Long Island with his wife, Danielle, and children, James, Hayley and Courtney.

Erin P. Doyle was appointed to EMS on March 23, 1998. Assigned to the Bureau of Training. Attended LaGuardia Community College. Father, FF Thomas Doyle, is assigned to Ladder 152. She resides in Queens.

hile awaiting an assignment in their primary area of response in Jamaica, Queens, on the morning of July 23, 2004, the radios of EMTs Erin Doyle and Charles Forchelli abruptly crackled with voices of the NYPD. Officers were seeking immediate EMS medical resources for a confirmed working fire proximate to the EMTs' location.

The crew was assigned promptly to the job after alerting the dispatcher to the call for medical assistance. Once on the scene, EMTs Doyle and Forchelli found that they had arrived prior to fire suppression units and there were several families with small children fleeing the smoke and flames via the fire escapes.

One of the descending children had lost his footing during his hasty escape. He was dangling from the fire escape by his arms and in danger of falling several stories to the street below. After a quick assessment of the situation, the team of EMTs knew what had to be done.

Both EMTs Doyle and Forchelli climbed up the fire escape toward fire and the dangling child. EMT Forchelli grabbed him, pulled him to safety and passed him down to his partner, who lowered the youngster safely to the ground. EMTs Doyle and Forchelli stayed on the fire escape, even after the arrival of fire companies. Despite the

obvious danger, they continued to assist the remaining occupants as they escaped the fire.

The child and many of the other occupants were treated at the scene by EMTs Doyle and Forchelli, as well as other arriving emergency medical personnel. The two EMTs remained at the scene, providing medical attention to Firefighters also injured at the scene.

For their meritorious actions, carried out at extreme personal risk, EMT Erin P. Doyle and EMT Charles J. Forchelli are presented with the Lieutenant Kirby McElhearn Medal for 2004.--TDM

Jack Pintchik Medal

EMT Hanforft Bautista

Timothy E. Dluhos was appointed to EMS on December 8, 2000. Assigned to Station 22. He is enrolled at the College of Staten Island. Member of North Shore Rescue Squad. He resides on Staten Island and is engaged to be married. **Hanforft Bautista** was appointed to EMS on February 11, 2000. Assigned to Station 35. He resides in Brooklyn with his wife, Jessica, and their newborn daughter, Kailyn.

n the morning of March 26, 2004, EMTs Timothy Dluhos and Hanforft Bautista were assigned to 35E2, covering the Williamsburg section of Brooklyn.

At 0745 hours, they were assigned to a trauma call at Maspeth and Morgan Avenues, in Greenpoint. On arrival, the two EMTs encountered an overturned construction crane with its boom down in a pit. On closer investigation, they discovered that a construction worker was injured in the pit. The boom had struck him. The worker was sitting in mud, covered in blood and holding his arm. The EMTs immediately called the dispatcher for additional resources.

With his tech bag over his shoulder, EMT Dluhos climbed 20 feet down into

the pit on an unstable wooden ladder. EMT Bautista remained on top to assist his partner with necessary equipment to treat the patient. After assessing the patient, EMT Dluhos discovered the victim had been seriously injured with a fractured arm, multiple lacerations and a possible skull fracture.

EMT Dluhos needed a long board, cervical collar and splints, which EMT Bautista lowered down into the pit with a rope. EMT Dluhos obtained a set of baseline vital signs and bandaged the bleeding lacerations. Additionally, he instructed one construction worker to hold manual stabilization of the patient's c-spine, while another worker held manual stabilization to the patient's fractured arm.

With the arrival and assistance of additional Paramedics and Firefighters, the patient was successfully extricated from the pit in a stokes basket.

Due to the swift and selfless actions of EMTs Dluhos and Bautista, the injured construction worker was safely transported to Bellevue Hospital Trauma Center. Without regard for their personal safety, working toward the best interests of the patient, these EMTs operated in an unsafe environment.

For their exemplary performance, EMT Timothy E. Dluhos and EMT Hanforft Bautista are commended, honored and presented with the Jack Pintchik Medal for 2004.--WB

Emergency Medical Dispatch Commendation



EMT Donna E. Glaude

Donna E. Glaude was appointed to EMS on June 3, 1985. Assigned to Emergency Medical Dispatch. She holds a degree from Kingsborough College. She resides in Brooklyn and has three sons, Ian, Brandon and Rashan.

In 1985, Donna Glaude graduated from the Emergency Medical Service (EMS) Academy at Queens General Hospital. After completing her Academy training, she was assigned to Communications at EMS Headquarters in Maspeth, Queens.

EMT Glaude has experienced many changes during her time as a Call Receiving Operator (CRO) and Assignment Receiving Dispatcher (ARD) since her arrival in Communications, Emergency Medical Dispatch (EMD). Currently, she is one of the few ARDs who has firsthand experience with processing 911 calls using manual entry (IRF cards). This was the period before the creation of

FDNY's current Telephone Triage Algorithms (KARDEX System) and computerized CAD system.

Additionally, she is one of only a handful of remaining operators who sent calls to the dispatchers by the "belt" (conveyor belt) before call entry became computerized.

EMT Glaude also was involved in the transfer and transition of dispatching and call-taking from the Communications Center at Maspeth to the temporary trailers, and then to the new EMD center at 1 MetroTech Center in Brooklyn.

In the performance of her duties during her nearly 20-year career, EMT Glaude has processed more than half a million calls for help. EMT Glaude is a person who always is available to help.

Both supervisors and peers agree that EMT Glaude possesses a great personality and demonstrates a positive attitude every day. She represents the best of EMS' past, present and future and takes pride in being a friend and inspiration to her coworkers.

EMT Glaude has and continues to make every effort to meet the missions and objectives of EMD and the New York City Fire Department. Her dedication and accomplishments make EMT Donna Glaude a worthy recipient of the Bureau of Communications Emergency Medical Dispatch Commendation for 2004.--*JP*

William Gettens was appointed to EMS on November 18, 1980. He holds a degree in Emergency Health Care from the University of Southern California, Keck School of Medicine. Recipient of the Distinguished Service Award from the Borough President of Brooklyn and more than 100 pre-hospital save awards. He resides in Walboro, New Jersey, with his wife, Cynthia, and their daughter, Nadalia.

Mark Peck was appointed to EMS on October 19, 1974. Attended the State University of New York at Stony Brook. Recipient of the EMS Medal of Honor, five Vice Presidential Unit Citations and more than 90 pre-hospital save awards. He resides on Staten Island, with his wife, Susan, and their son, Craig, and daughter, Caryn.

Island Station 43 has been a place to learn and hone one's emergency medical skills. For the wealth of knowledge, exemplary skills and continued commitment to EMS, one team, in particular, has drawn the respect and admiration of many a fledgling EMT. Paramedics William Gettens and Mark Peck make up this team. They are highly decorated, seasoned members who have operated their unit like a well-oiled machine.

Paramedic Gettens has a calm and confident demeanor that puts patients at ease in their time of crisis. His effective communication with both patients and coworkers is another talent. On the scene, Paramedic Gettens excels in translating medical jargon into the essential information patients require to make difficult choices. He has guided

and inspired young EMTs to become Paramedics and acted as a confidant and mentor to many.

Paramedic Peck became a medic during a time when many were enjoying reruns of *Emergency*. In 1977, he graduated from the second Jacobi Paramedic program offered by the City of New York Health and Hospitals Corporation. His continued efforts to improve the work environment for all EMS providers produced many enhancements. Some of his modifications have been adopted by the FDNY and incorporated into the design of the Department's ambulances.

The ambulance he uses is painstakingly stocked and tweaked before each tour. A handy, pocket-sized set of treatment protocol cards, designed by Paramedic Peck, are used by field Paramedics from Staten Island to the Bronx

Paramedics Gettens and Peck have a tremendous command of the knowledge and skills needed to be a New York City Paramedic. These attributes are reflected in their performance and the results they achieve. Statistically, they have had more successful pre-hospital resuscitations than any other EMS crew.

During their combined 54 years of service, they have consistently demonstrated a passion for high standards, a dedication to the service of their patients and a clear understanding of the responsibilities of role model and mentor. These outstanding characteristics qualify Paramedics William Gettens and Mark Peck for this year's Office of Medical Affairs Commendation for 2004.--JH

2004 Pre-Hospital Save Awards
