Regarding allowing Wells Fargo to do business in the State of NY , this citizen from Poughkeepsie comments a resounding NO. I was a customer for 10 years with Wells Fargo and during that time was defrauded through their scam of assigning debit/credit cards to accounts that had not been requested by the customer and charging monthly fees. It was only after reading about it in a newspaper at our senior center that I learned Wells Fargo had been caught and fined millions for this theft. Nine years after I closed all accounts and was not a customer I received an active credit card in the mail from them. I contacted the CFPB and made a complaint. I went to the local bank where I had been a customer and demanded they close the account that very day. The banker told me the manager said they could not. I stated I was not leaving till they closed this account . I had not opened this account that had my name , address and other information on it . The banker finally agreed and I told him how Wells Fargo had stolen from me in the past. I told him thousands of Wells Fargo employees had been fired as a result of the investigation.

His response: He apologized and said" They should have fired a lot more".

Wells Fargo has defrauded its customers for decades. It is a bad actor. NYS does not need their business.
