On motion the minutes of the meetings held Dec. 12, 15, 17, 19, 21, 26 and 27 were approved.

Frank M. Sexton, an Investigator, appeared before the Commission to answer charges of dereliction of duty and of conduct unbecoming an employee of the Commission and prejudicial to and subversive of good order and discipline, a copy of which had been duly served upon him. The explanation made by Mr. Sexton having been unsatisfactory, on motion, it was

Resolved, That Frank M. Sexton be and he is hereby dismissed from the position of Investigator in the office of the Commission, the dismissal to take effect at the close of business Dec. 29, 1917.



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




