# WARNING

### You are receiving this warning because you are in violation of §16-329 (c) of the New York City Administrative Code.

This provision bans possession, sale or use of certain expanded polystyrene (EPS)—foam—items in New York City.

#### Effective January 1, 2019, banned items include:

- (1) Polystyrene foam single-service items, including cups, bowls, plates, takeout containers, and trays.
- (2) Polystyrene foam loose fill packaging, commonly known as "packing peanuts."

#### **Exceptions:**

- (1) Polystyrene foam containers used for prepackaged food that have been filled and sealed prior to receipt by the food service establishment, mobile food commissary, or store.
- (2) Polystyrene foam containers used to store raw meat, pork, fish, seafood, or poultry sold from a butcher case or similar retail appliance.

Note: Polystyrene foam blocks used as protective packaging in shipping are not covered under this law.

## Notices of Violation (NOV) will be issued for violations of this law beginning July 1, 2019.

This provision includes a warning period lasting from January 1, 2019 until July 1, 2019. Following the warning period, NOVs that carry a civil penalty will be issued and civil action may be taken.

#### How can violations be avoided?

- (1) Immediately discontinue the possession, use and sale of all single-use polystyrene foam items specified above.
- (2) Apply for a hardship waiver via NYC Small Business Services (SBS). Get more information at **nyc.gov/foamwaiver**.
