Honorable Board of Aldermen, City of New York:

NEW YORK, January 13, 1894.

GENTLEMEN—As a committee appointed by the New York Fruit Exchange to appeal to you for reliet from an ordinance at present in effect as a law, relating to the placing of merchandise on sidewalks of this city, known as chapter 6 of the Revised Ordinances of 1885, we herewith submit the following for your Honorable Board's consideration and action. The ordinance in question

reads:

"Chapter 6 of the Revised Ordinances of 1880, entitled Department of Public Works, article
55, provides: No person shall hang, or place any goods, wares or merchandise or any other article,
suffer, maintain or permit the same to be hung, or placed at any greater distance than three feet in
front of his, her or their store or other building under the penalty of five dollars for each day's

This works great hardship to the entire mercantile community of this city, and if enforced would prohibit all business being carried on whatsoever, and is therefore impracticable. Besides this, such uses can be made of this law as to work great hardship and loss to the industrious class of small merchants who occupy as their place of business, corners inside of the stoop-line, and pay owners or lessors of buildings for these privileges which they should enjoy, as the same are without detriment or inconvenience to the public.

without detriment or inconvenience to the public.

Your petitioners, therefore, pray for reiief from the present hardship this law entails, and ask that chapter 6 of the Revised Ordinances of 1885, be hereby repealed, and that mits place the following be substituted and be made a law:

"No person shall hang or place any goods, wares or merchandise, or any other article, suffer, maintain or permit the same to be hung or placed in front of his, her or their store or other building, so that there shall not be at any one time a clear passageway of less than three feet for the use of pedestrians, under a penalty of \$5 for each day's offence. It shall be understood that this ordinance does not cover the unloading of goods, wares or merchandise from trucks into warehouses or buildings, or the loading of the same, from warehouses or buildings."

Your petitioners will be glad to appear before you in support of this petition, which we earnestly ask should receive your immediate attention, and remain,

The act further provides that the owner of any such lot may notify the Commissioner of Public Works, in writing, specifying the ward number and street number of the lot that he desires, for himself, his heirs and assigns, to be released from the obligation of such covenants, and elects and agrees that said lot shall be thereatter liable to be assessed as above provided, and thereupon the owner of such lot, his heirs and assigns shall thenceforth be relieved from any obligation to pave, repair, uphold or maintain said street, and the lot in respect of which such notice was given shall be liable to assessment accordingly.

The Commissioner of Public Works desires to give the following explanation of the operation of this act:

When notice, as above described, is given to the Commissioner of Public Works, the owner of the lot or lots therein described, and his heirs and assigns, are forever released from all obligation under the grant in espect to paving, repaving or repairing the street in ront of or adjacent to said lot or lots, except one assessment for such paving, repaving or repairs, as the Common Council may, by ordinance, direct to be made thereafter.
