Mich shows that in the year 1897, the cost of public lighting in the City of Brooklyn (now assumed by the Department of Fublic Buildings, Lighting and Supplies) was \$775,556.76. This does not include lighting the public buildings of the Department of Education, Police, Fire, Health, Charitles and Correction. There should be added to this figure the sum of \$445.47 for the cost of lighting the Brooklyn Disciplinary Training School, for which no appropriation was made in the budget of that institution, and which should be provided for by the Department of Public Buildings, Lighting and Supplies. This makes an aggregate of \$776,012.67.

The appropriation made for public lighting in the Borough of Brooklyn for 1898, by resolution of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment adopted February 4, 1898, was \$732.653.14.

If it is desired, therefore, to add an amount to this appropriation which would enable the public lighting of the Borough of Brooklyn to be conducted on the same basis of expense as it was in 1897, the sum of \$43,359.56 should be added to this appropriation.

Referring again to the matter of departmental buildings, considered by the Deputy Commissioner as outside of his jurisdiction, I have communicated with the various departments, and find that the following made provision in their respective budgets for their own lighting and expect to pay for the same out of their appropriations:

Education, Police, Fire, Health (except Clinton street building, which is maintained and lighted by the Deputy Commissioner as a public building), Charities, Correction.

Note - Prior to January 1, 1898, Charities and Correction were craised as one account.

With reference to the Rosekiya Disciplinary and Training School, I am a sured by Major John D. Keiley, Chairman of Committee on Estimate, and by Superintendent Downing, that no provision was made in their budget for either lighting, fuel, water or repairs, and that the school expects to be maintained as a public halldleg by the Department of Buildings, Lighting and Surphies.

Supplies.

With regard to the matter of electric power familished for hoisting the elevators in the City Hall and Municipal Buildings: as I understand it, the Deputy Commissioner's ground for exclusion is that this service partakes more of the matter of feet rather than lighting, and his convention is that he should not be expected to pay for each service out of his lighting appropriation.

I find that much, if not all, of this service was charged during 1897 as "Fuel-Public Buildings."

Six.—We have the homer to report that, in excentance with your instructions, we inspected the six of the proposal small park bounded by Hester, Euses, Canal, Jufferson, Division and Suffolk

streets.

We found the condition at this site to be very had. The depressed portions are filthy with decaying animal and vegetable matter, and a number of the vaults under the adewalks are verticable privy vaults, there being, beside other officiency accumulations, large amounts of busine excrement. Already bad odors arise from these places, and they will become source afternive as the warm weather advances. Perhaps the water condition that exists in amorphic with this are in the partially destroyed stable structure, the cellar of which is still used for stabling purposes. In this cellar we found about ten or twelve loads of manure; in the passageway between the stalls there is about steinches in depth of muck and the floors and stalls are liftly with loose manure. There is also in this cellar as improvised privy soult, which contains feecal matter, and there is evidence that other in this cellar an improvised privy soult, which contains focal matter, and there is evidence that other portions of the stable are used for delocating purposes. Some of the refuse on the suntan portion of this size is evidently from the tenerount-houses in the neighborhood, but the most of it is from the purchast readers who sell articles of tood to the adjoining streets.

The addessalk around this site are uneven and dangerous, and portions of them are not fenced, and there are dangerous excavations adjoining the sidewalk into which pedestrians are liable to fail.

At the corner of Hester and Saffolk streets there are arched vanits extending out under the sidewalk, and the supporting wall has fallen away so that the such is likely at any time to fall in and carry a part of the sidewalk with it. This condition is a memore to persons passing at this
