

Sanitary Bureau.

The following is a record of the work performed in the Sanitary Bureau for the week ending October 11, 1884.

October 11, 1884. The total number of inspections made by the Sanitary Inspectors was 7,564. The number of complaints returned by the Sanitary Inspectors was 7,43. During the past week 198 complaints were received from citizens and referred to the Sanitary Inspectors for investigation and report. S8 permits were issued to the consignees of vessels to discharge cargoes, on vouchers from the Health Officer of the Port. 3 permits were issued to consignees to discharge rags (in bulk, under bonds). There were 2 permits issued to remove manure from stables in the city. 160 permits were issued to avengers to empty, clean and disinfect privy sinks. 23 premises were visited where contagious diseases were reported, and 23 disinfections and 5 fumigations were performed. 2 cases of contagious disease were removed to Riverside Hospital. The number of vaccinations performed was 842, of which 215 were primary and 627 revaccina-tions.

4,310 pounds of meat and 3,475 pounds of fish were seized and condemned. 691 specimens of milk were examined, 315 quarts of adulterated milk destroyed, 1 arrest made, and the amount of fines imposed was \$125.

The certificates of 632 births, 69 still-births, 244 marriages and 621 deaths, reported to have taken place in this city, were received by this Bureau during the week ending Saturday, October 11, 1884. This shows an increase of 11 births, 14 still-births and 12 deaths, and a decrease of 28 marriages, when compared with the number received during the preceding week; but when com-pared with the corresponding week of the year 1883, there was a decrease of 7 births and 56 mar-riages, and an increase of 17 births and 75 deaths. Compared with the mortality reported during preceding week, the deaths from croup decreased 2; whooping cough, 9; erysipelas, 2; malarial fevers, 1; puerperal diseases, 5; rheumatism and gout, 2; bronchitis, 2; heart diseases, 5; aneu-rism, 1; meningitis and encephalitis, 4; convulsions, 3; apoplexy, 2; all diseases of the brain and atelectasis, 1; premature and preternatural births, 3; suicide, 1; while the deaths from measles increased 1; scarlatina, 5; diptheria, 3; typhoid fever, 1; cerebro spinal fever, 1; diarrihoeal diseases, 5; inanition, 1; alcoholism, 1; ancore, 5; phthiss pulmonalis, 16; pneumonia, 9; ma-ramanus, tabes mesentenca and scroula, 13; hydrocephalus and tubercular meningits, 1; gastritis, entertius and peritonitis, 10, and drowning, 1. The number of deaths from surgical operations was the same in two successive weeks.

Deaths from the principal Zymotic Diseases, Phthisis Pulmonalis, Pneumonia, Bronchilis, and Children under five years of age, reported during the week and compared with the three preceding weeks.



Of the total number of deaths reported for the week, 123 were in institutions, 343 in tenementhouses, 137 in houses containing three families or less, 8 in hotels and boarding-houses, 7 in rivers, streets, boats, etc.; 15 were on the basement floor, 114 on the first, 145 on the second, 124 on the third, 59 on the fourth, 25 on the fifth, 6 on the sixth; 163 were stated to be residents of New York City and 3 non-residents; 58 were stated to be single, 156 married, 56 widowed, and the condition of 351 was not stated—these were children who had not attained a marriageable age.

The total number of burial permits issued during the week are as follows, viz.: City deaths, 621; still-births, 69; bodies in transitu, 10. Of the total burial permits issued for city and still-births, 68 were upon certificates received from the Coroners; 632 births, 244 marriages, 69 still-births; 621 deaths, 10 applications for transit permits were recorded, indexed, and tabulated; 126 searches of the registers of births, marriages, and deaths were made, and 7 transcripts of the birth record, 5 of marriage, and 65 of death were issued during the week.

The mean temperature for the week ending October 11, 1854, was 63.1 degrees Fahr., the mean reading of the barometer was 29.912, the mean humidity was 81, saturation being 100; the number of miles traveled by the wind was 1,000, and the total amount of rain-fall was 0.02 inches depth of water, as reported by D. Draper, Ph. D., Director of the New York Meteorological Observatory, Central Park.

The disposition of 605 deaths and still-births, or 87.68 per cent, of the total number reported, was in the following 14 cemeteries: Bayside (Jewish), 12; Calvary (Roman Catholic), 253; City pauper burial ground (undenominational), 101; Greenwood (undenominational), 29; Lutheran (undenominational), 95; Cypress Hills (undenominational), 16; Evergreen (undenominational), 37; Woodlawn (undenominational), 17; St. Michael's (Protestant Episcopal), 11; Union (Methodist Protestant), 1; Holy Cross (Roman Catholic), 6; Machpelah, L. I. (Jewish), 7; St. Raymond's (Roman Catholic), 10; Washington (undenominational), 10.

The distribution of deaths (actual mortality) for the week ending October 4, 1884, was in the following wards, viz.: First, 7; Second, 0; Third, 11; Fourth, 41; Fifth, 4; Sixth, 15; Seventh, 20; Eighth, 18; Ninth, 23; Tenth, 27; Eleventh, 33; Twelfth, 67; Thirteenth, 14; Fourteenth, 17; Fifteenth, 61; Sixteenth, 19; Seventeenth, 41; Eighteenth, 29; Nineteenth, 111; Twentieth, 53; Twenty-first, 33; Twenty-second, 54; Twenty-third, 11; Twenty-fourth, 9.

The actual mortality for the week ending October 4, 1884, was 633; this is 95 more than the number that occurred during the corresponding week of the year 1883, and 40.4 more than the average of the corresponding weeks of the past five years, and represents an annual deathrate of 24.07 per 1,000 persons living, the population estimated at 1,367,587.

The actual mortality for the week ending October 11, 1884, was 627, which is 64.0 above the average for the corresponding week for the past five years, and represents an annual death-rate of 23.83 per 1,000 persons living, the population estimated at 1,368,362.
