Resolved, That, under the power conferred by law upon the Board of Health of the Department of Health, the following additional amendment to the Sanitary Code for the security of life
and health be and the same is hereby adopted and declared to form a partion of the Sanitary
Code.

Section 63. No milk which has been watered, adulterated, reduced or changed in any respect by the addition of water or other substance, or by the removal of cream, shall be brought into, held, kept, or offered for sale at any place in The City of New York; nor shall any one keep, have or offer for sale in the said city any such milk.

The term "adulterated," when so used in this section, means:

First—Milk containing more than eighty-eight per common of water or fluids.
Second—Milk containing less than twelve per common of milk solids.
Third—Milk containing less than three per common of fats.
Fourth—Milk drawn from animals within fifteen days before or five days after parturition, Fifth—Milk drawn from animals led on distillery waste, or any substance in a state of fermentation or patrefaction, or on any unhealthy food,

Sixth—Milk drawn from cows kept in a crowded or unleading condition.

Seventh—Milk from which any part of the cream has been removed.

Eighth—Milk which has been diluted with water or any other fluid, or to which has been added, or into which has been introduced, any foreign substance whatever.

Ninth—Milk, the temperature of which is higher than 50 degrees Fahrenheit.
