No Trash, Recycling or Curbside Composting Collection, nor Street Cleaning on Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day, Monday, January 20, 2020

The New York City Department of Sanitation announced that in observance of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day, there will be no trash, recycling, or curbside compost collection, nor street cleaning on Monday, January 20, 2020.

- Residents who normally receive **Monday trash or curbside composting collection** should place their material out at curbside after 4 p.m. on Monday, January 20 for pickup.
- Residents who normally receive **Monday recycling collection** should place their material out at curbside after 4 p.m. on Sunday, January 26 for pickup on Monday, January 27.

Additionally, all Sanitation Department administrative offices will be closed on Monday, January 20, in observance of the holiday.

About the New York City Department of Sanitation

The Department of Sanitation (DSNY) keeps New York City healthy, safe and clean by collecting, recycling and disposing of waste, cleaning streets and vacant lots, and clearing snow and ice. The Department operates 59 district garages and manages a fleet of more than 2,000 rear-loading collection trucks, 450 mechanical brooms and 705 salt spreaders. The Department clears litter, snow and ice from approximately 6,500 miles of City streets and removes debris from vacant lots as well as abandoned vehicles from City streets.
